Lizzie and Richard were married on Dec. 16, 1897; she died on Dec 10, 1924. Lizzie's first husband was Perry Fields who died Oct 1895. Richard's first wife was Mary Haynes. Mary and Richard were married Aug 11, 1872. She died May 14, 1896. Their children were Lonny Brantley, born Sep 20, 1873, Dellia Brantley born Jan 1, 1876 and Harry born in Feb. 1892.

Chisholm	Peter	Peter Chism	1st wife Daphnt; 2nd wife Christin A Brown; 3rd wife Martha Taylor	Lady's Island, SC	1835	Unknown	Sep 8, 1922	F	x	x	Enlisted at Beaufort, SC on April 22, 1863 at the age of 29; 6'6" tall. A plowman by occupation at time of enlistment. Mustered out Jan. 31, 1866 at Charleston, SC. November of 1863 served on St. Helena Island building signal station. April 1864 on duty at brick yard/picket station. Teamster on Folly's Island, Oct. 1864. Received a gun shot wound on the second finger of the right hand at the Battle of Pocotaligo, SC. Prior to war, owned by John Pope of Beaufort, SC. Peter Chisolm was a member of the David Hunter Post #9 GAR. 1st wife Daphny died on Coosaw Is. SC in 1866; 2nd wife Christian A Brown married October 1875 at Sheldon, SC; 3rd wife was Martha Taylor, married Feb 17, 1915. Peter's Freedmen's Bank account #2857 was filed under the last name spelling of Chisolm. His brothers were Scipio and Isreal and his sister was Tamar.
Pvt.	Christopfer	Aaron	Christofer	Sarah	Hilton Head, SC	1840	Hilton Head, SC	Oct 11, 1875	K	x	x	Aaron enlisted on Nov 1, 1862 in Hilton Head, SC at the age of 22; 5'7" tall; occupation - waiter. Discharged Jan 31, 1866 at Charleston, SC. Matt Jones and James Simmons are witnesses to the condition of Aaron - suffering from the effects of gunshot to foot. He had daily duty in a boat. After Aaron's death, his widow Sarah Frazier Christopher filed for his pension On Jul 11, 1883. Aaron's first wife was Molsie (Maltsy) Mack who died on Hilton Head in Feb 1877. They had one child, Caroline, born Jun 25, 1875 on Hilton Head. Aaron remarried to Sarah Frazier born 1851; married Feb. 1878; died Apr 18, 1893 on Daufuskie Is, SC.
Pvt.	Green	Jackson		Henrietta Archie	Bluffton, SC	1838	Unknown	Dec 18, 1905	K	x	x	Enlisted at Camp Saxton on Nov 1, 1862 at the age of 24; 5'4" tall; occupation - hostler. Discharged on Jan 31, 1866 in Charleston, SC. Jackson was wounded in action on Nov 7, 1862. Jackson married Henrietta Archie on Jan 3, 1895. She was born on Feb 24, 1877. Her father was Edward Archer and her mother was Elizabeth Archer. She was one of 11 children. They only stayed together for about 7 months and Jackson stated he found out she had another man so he left her. Jackson was previously married to Margaret or Peggy, maiden name unknown. She died in Port Royal, SC before he married Henrietta. Her father was named Sandy and her mother was Silla. Jackson and his 1st wife had 2 children - Celia Middleton and Franklin Green. Jackson was a slave of Mr. Orewell in Bluffton, SC. Jackson's Freedmen's Bank record #3208.

Married Nancy Green in Georgetown, SC July, 1859. Died Jan 5, 1865 from gun shot wound to head while being treated in Second Division General Hospital, Beaufort, SC. Wife's Freedmen's Bank account # 2914 ; application dated Aug 7, 1968. She was born in Georgetown, SC. Her father was Gabriel Green and mother was Phoebe. She had one brother - Scipio and 4 sisters - Docia, Rhody, Beck Brown & Sally. William and Nancy had on child, Mary born Aug 1, 1860.

Jenkins	Sharper		1st wife Phillis; 2nd wife Susette Smalls	Linton, SC	Feb 7, 1841	Marlow, GA	Jan 18, 1925	K	x	x	Enlisted Feb 7, 1863 in Hilton Head, SC at the age of 22; 5'5 1/2" tall; occupation - teamster. Discharged Jan 22, 1866 in Charleston, SC. Sharper's first wife Phillis died on Jul 6, 1893. They had a daughter named Margaret (Jenkins) Gay born in 1880/81. He remarried to Susette Smalls in April 1894 in Bluffton, SC. Sharper died of a stroke and suffered from paralysis. Sharper's statement said he was born in Linton, SC a slave to Nathaniel P Cruel. His father was also named Sharper Jenkins and he was also a slave owned by Nathaniel Cruel.

Johnson	Caesar		1st wife Alice; 2nd wife Diana	Beaufort, SC	1836	Unknown	Sep 18, 1910	D	x	x	Enlisted on Oct 19, 1862 at Ft Helena, Hilton Head, SC at the age of 26; 5'7" tall; occupation plowman. Caesar was discharged on Jan 31, 1866 at Charleston, SC. Married to Diana Johnson (born in 1845) on Mar 3, 1866. They had a daughter named Josephine Johnson born about 1890 and a son named Caesar born about 1868. Caesar was a slave of Stephen Ellis. He filed for a pension on Mar 20, 1889 (618434)and his wife filed for a widow's pension on Oct 26 1910 (718338). Caesar also had a brother named Peter Johnson who was born about 1841 aand a brother named Abram. He had 2 sister - Hattie & Phoebe. Caesar was previously married to a slave named Alive who died sometime during the Civil War. They had a child named Bina who married an Adam Dias. Caesar's second wife Diana raised Bina from a baby. They also had a daughter named Fanny. Caesar's Freedmen's Bank account number was 2853.

Ned married Nancy Hayward on the 4th Tuesday in June 1866; who remarried Friday Singleton on the 4th Saturday in Feb 1886 after the death of Ned. Appears that Ned and Nancy had a son named Edward born Jan 3, 1878 and a daughter Rachel born Jan 3, 1872 and a son Smart born Nov 19, 1869 who was carried for by Nancy Singleton as their guardian.

Discharged on Jan 31, 1866 in Charleston, SC. His father's name was Daniel and his mother was Jennie. His 3 brothers were Edward, Josiah and Jack. His first name was also spelled Barkus and his wife was also called Georgia. Barcus was a member of Freedmen's Bank but his account number is not available.
Pvt.	Truel	Jonas	Joseph Trewel	Unknown	St Helena Is, SC	1834	Unknown	Unknown	G	x	None	Jonas originally enlisted in the 21st USCT on Oct 19, 1862 in Beaufort SC. He than transferred from the 21st USCT (which he deserted on June 11, 1864) to the 33rd USCT on October 10, 1864 at Beaufort, SC. At that time he was 30 years old; 5'6" tall occupation - laborer. Joined from desertion and received full pardon on August 16, 1864 and restored to duty without trial. Mustered out at Charleston, SC on Jan. 31, 1866. See 21st Reg't. USCT for further information.

Washington	George		1st wife Julia, 2nd wife Linda (Miller) Jenkins	Darien, GA	1826	Hilton Head, SC	Feb 1, 1916	K	x	x	Enlisted on Jan 11, 1865 in Hilton Head, SC at the age of 35; 5' 8" tall; occupation - farmer. Discharged on Jan 31, 1866 in Charleston, SC. George is buried in White Point Cemetery, Pinckney Is, SC. George's first wife was Julia, born in 1809. They lived on Drayton Plantation as slaves. Julia & George had 5 children; Ben, Henry, Joshua, Katy (b. 1844) Washington Fields & April. Julia's mother was named Nancy Swell Lived on Drayton Plantation. Their daughter Katy married Polodore Fields. George's second wife was Linda (Lindy) Jenkins o Nov 9 1895. Her first husband was Cuffie Jenkins who died on Hilton Head , SC in May 1892. Lindy Washington died on July 18, 1938 (death cert on file at Heritage Library) in Bluffton, SC. She was born in 1861 on Pinckney Is, SC; her father was James Miller, born in Beaufort, SC and her mother was Nanny Grant of Beaufort, SC. She was buried on Pinckney Is, July 19, 1938.
