**BAKER RECORDS**

Mrs. Bellinger's deposition and the family records printed below given an interesting connection some of it being new information. Mrs. Mary L. Bellinger was Mary Lucia Bull, born about 1723, and died 1796; she was the daughter of Lucia Bellinger (a daughter of the first Landgrave Edmund Bellinger) and Burnaby Bull, who died in 1754. Mary Lucia Bull married her first cousin, Edmund Bellinger (ca. 1718-1787) the third Landgrave.

Richard Baker (ca. 1718-1752), of Archdale Hall, St. George's Paris, Dorchester, was one of the three sons of William Baker (died ca. 1718) and Susannah Rowsham, and grand-son of Richard Baker, Esq., the emigrant, who died in 1698 leaving a will. Richard Baker (ca. 1718-1752) married first, January 23, 1723, Mary Bohun, who died in 1736. She was the elder of the two daughters of Nicholas Bohun (1680-1718) and Margaret Bellinger, sister to Lucia Bellinger who married Burnaby Bull.

Elizabeth, the second daughter of Nicholas and Margaret (Bellinger) Bohun, married December, 1730, Peter Girardeau.

Edmund Bohun, the father of Nicholas, was born 12th March 1644/5 in Ringsfield, Suffolk; married 26 July, 1669, Mary Brampton, (d. 1719); he was appointed Chief Justice of South Carolina 22 May, 1698; died there of yellow fever 5 Oct., 1699.

Edmund Bohun, the Chief Justice, was a person of some consequence in his period. He was for a time in the commission of the peace; he wrote various tracts, compilations and translations. *His Diary and Autobiography*, which ends about the time he came to South Carolina, was privately printed at Beccles, by Read Crisp, in 1853. It is illustrated, well annotated and has a chart which gives an interesting pedigree, including Edward I. among the ancestors.

His eldest son, Edmund Bohun (1672-1734), had preceded his father to South Carolina, and was settled there as a merchant. This Edmund Bohun corresponded from South Carolina with Petiver, the botanist, and Hans Sloan, upon matters concerning

Richard Baker married 3d. Sarah [Fowler ?] by whom he seems to have had no children.

Peter Girardeau, who lived in St. Bartholomew's Parish, married first in 1730, Elizabeth Bohun, and second, in 1747, Elizabeth Heape. He had died by Dec. 1759, according to an indenture signed by his eldest son John B. Girardeau.<sup>1</sup>

I, John McCall, Notary Public, by lawful authority sworn admitted and residing in the City of Charleston and one of the Justices of the Quorum for the State aforesaid Do hereby Certify and attest that on the day of the date hereof personally came and appeared before me, Mrs. Mary Bellinger, the Widow of Mr. Edmund Bellinger, of St. Andrew's Parish, Stoney Point, who, being duly sworn, made oath and said she is aged seventy-two years. That she was perfectly acquainted with Mr. Richard Baker of St George's Parish, Dorchester, who married Miss Mary Bohun, (she was the Eldest Daughter of her, the said Mary Bellinger's Mother's eldest sister Margaret Bellinger, who married Mr. Nicholas Bohun, they had two daughters, Mary Bohun, and Elizabeth Bohun) her mother Mrs. Lucia Bull used to take her early in youth to visit her niece the above named Mary Bohun, who married Mr. Richard Baker, by whom Mrs. Mary Baker had six children, four Daughters and two Sons, their eldest Son, William, died of the Small-pox, under age, unmarried and without issue; their youngest son, Richard, was but a few weeks old when his Mother died in the year 1736—their above Son, Richard, married Miss Elizabeth Elliott, Daughter of Mr. Barnard Elliott of Charleston, they had issue Sons and Daughters, their eldest son, the present Mr. Richard Bohun Baker, married Miss Harriet Hyrne, Daughter of Mr. Henry Hyrne, and they had issue, and he now inherits his Grandfather's and Father's family Mansion House on Ashley River St. George's Parish Dorchester, where he now resides with his family, She well recollects to have read a letter from Mr. Bohun in England to Mr. Bellenger concern-

ing his two nieces, the above Mary Bohun and Elizabeth Bohun to whom he sent a present of some elegant silks.

Elizabeth Bohun married Mr. Peter Gerardeau, [Girardeau] of South Carolina. The said Mrs. Mary Bellenger has known Mr. Richard Bohun Baker from his infancy until he died in the month of January, 16, in the year 1783—he left four daughters and one Son, who is the present Mr. Richard Bohun Baker, by his first marriage, and by his second marriage one son, William Bohun Baker. She lived within seven miles of them for near forty-eight years and sixty years since she first visited the elder Mr. Richard Baker, who married her mother's niece, Miss mary Bohun, the eldest daughter of Mr Nicholas Bohun, and who was the mother of the late Mr. Richard Bohun Baker, and the Grandmother of the present Mr. Richard Bohun Baker of St. George's Parish, Dorchester, She well remembers five generations of the elder Mr. Richard Baker's family.

(Continued from January)

Monday 30th July. Having enjoyed a Quiet and comfortable Sleep the past Night, both passengers & Crew, and the Flood setting in about half past four in the morning the Pilot gave orders for weighting Anchor, and with a small S. W. Breeze, got over the Vesso D'Frize, sunk against Red Bank Fort, at Kingsport. where we were hailed and order'd to Anchor, until a license shou'd come down from the Health Officer at Philadelphia, for our going up there.—to obtain which Capt. Ed.<sup>d</sup> Blake<sup>1</sup> undertook to go up in the Forts Barge rowed by four of our Servants to the City at 7 O'Clock.— all Flaggs w<sup>th</sup> Prisoners on board. being subject to this necessary regulation, to prevent the spreading of infectious disorders. Mr. Isaac Holmes accompanied Capt. Blake, and Capt. Robert Cochran<sup>2</sup> also of our company, took passage in a Small Shallop Just before, and was desir'd to expedite a Pass down to the fort in case he should see us Stop there.
