* Saer de Quincy (Sax or Seer) 1st Earl of Winchester (+1219), son of Robert Fitz Richard, by ~~Orabilis~~^{* Countess of Mer}, da. of Ness, Lord of Lenchars. His uncle, Saer de Quincy, Lord of Buckby in Northamptonshire, was a staunch advocate of Henry II. In 1180 he was castellan of Nonancourt on the Aire and in Aug. 1198 he was with King Richard at Roche d'Orval. He was present when William the Lion did homage to John at Lincoln in Nov. 1200. In 1203 he was as joint-castellan with Robert FitzWalter of Vandueil Castle, forced to surrender it to Philip of France; he was redeemed for 5,000 £ ransom. Between 1268-73 he married ~~Margaret~~^{* Cocher & youngest} Beaumont & Petruilla, da. of Hugh Gransirie (+22 July 1094) of Robert III, Earl of Leicester (+1190). In 1204 his wife's brother, Robert IV, Earl Leicester, died s.p. & she became joint-heiress with her elder sister, Aricia, wife of Simon de Montfort. In 1207 Saer was created Earl of Winchester (County of Southampton); from 1205 he held the office of Steward of Eng. by virtue of having custody of the earldom of Leicester but this passed to Simon de Montfort in 1207. He accompanied King John to Ireland in 1210, acting as a justiciar from 1211-1214; he was also ambassador to German emperor, Otto IV. In May 1213 he witnessed John's surrender of his crown to the pope. On 4 March 1215 he took the cross with the king & others. He was one of the 25 barons chosen to compel the observance of Magna Carta. He defended Cambridge & Huntington when John threatened to raise forces against them. In Oct. John declared Winchester's estates forfeited & granted them to others & on 16 Dec. he was excommunicated by the pope. On 9 Jan 1216 he returned to Eng. & on the accession of Henry III addressed to Louis of France, persuading him to spare St. Albans Abbey. He was captured on 20 May at Lincoln but secured his liberty in Sept. In 1219 he sailed to the siege of Damietta. He died on 3 Nov. 1219 & was buried at Acre, his heart & vital organs being burned & the ashed buried at Garendon Abbey, Leicestershire of which he was patron. Margaret died 1235. He left 4 sons: Robert, Roger, Reginald & another Robert. Their da. ^{* Hawise}, marr. Hugh de Vere, Earl of Oxford (+1223). His son ^{* Robert} (+1217) m. ^{* Hawise}, 4th

* Bartholomew de Badlesmere, Baron (1275-1322) son + heir of Gunselm de Badlesmere (+1301); he fought in the English army in both Scotland + France under Edward I. In 1307 he became Gov. of Bristol Castle + steward of the household of Ed. II. He was a member of the middle party, detesting both the King's minions, like the Despensers, + his violent enemies like Earl Thomas of Lancaster. In Oct. 1321 his wife, Margaret de Clare, refused to admit Queen Isabella to her husband's castle at Leeds in Kent. Edward captured the castle, imprisoned Lady Badlesmere + civil war began. After the defeat of Lancaster at ^{16 March 1322} Boroughbridge, Badlesmere was captured and hanged at Canterbury on 14 April 1322. His son + heir, Giles, died s.p. in 1338. His daug. Elizabeth, m. William de Bohun, Earl of Hereford, Essex + Northampton who died 16 Sept. 1360.

Bartholomew's sister married Sir Robert Burghersh, Lord Burghersh of Sussex; their son was Henry Burghersh, Bishop of Lincoln (1292-1340)

* Isabella de Angoulême (+1246) Queen of John of England, daug. + heiress of Aymer, Count of Angoulême, by Alicia (daug. of Peter of Courtenay, a younger son of Louis VI of France). She was betrothed in childhood to Hugh of Lusignan, called "le Brun", eldest son of Hugh IX, Count de La Marche. John married her on 26 Aug. 1200 at Angoulême (married by the Archbishop of Bordeaux). Their firstborn son was Henry III (born 1 Oct. 1207). In May 1220 she married Hugh. She died in 1246 + her son Henry had her buried in the Church at Fontevraud. By Hugh she had 5 sons: 1. Guy, Lord of Cognac, 2. William of Valence, 3. Geoffrey of Lusignan, Lord of Châteauneuf, + Aymer of Valence, Bishop of Winchester + 2 daug., Margaret, m. Raymond VII, Count of Toulouse, + Alicia, m. John, Earl of Warrenne.
