He was married to Martha Sarah Reynolds; it has not been determined as yet who her parents were.? She died in 1805, following the birth of her last child, and the infant was reared by Mrs. Caroline Reynolds, according to family tradition. This family has in its possession an old piece JONATHA of paper which says, "Your Grandmother Baynard's mother died when she was two weeks old, Reynolds when she was taken by her aunt, Mrs. Caroline Reynolds. Her father's name was Benjamin Chaplin......Martha Sarah Chaplin, your grandmother, was the fifth daughter of Benjamin and HANNAH Martha Chaplin, born 5th of November 1805...."11 In his Memorials of the Reynolds Family, Bernard Adams Reynolds states: "Benjamin (son of Benjamin Chaplin and Ellinor Reynolds) married Martha Reynolds."13 By way of further explanation, "Uncle Bernard" stated earlier that Benjamin Chaplin, Sr. and Ellinor Reynolds also had a son William and a daughter Anne, who married David Adams, Jr. This David Adams, Jr. had a brother, Bernard Adams ("Uncle Bernard" was named for him) who married Elizabeth Chaplin. This same Elizabeth Chaplin Adams was "Uncle Bernard's" grandmother, and she is the one who imparted all this family information to him. We have to conclude that surely Elizabeth Chaplin Adams knew who her father's nephew married, and it is unfortunate, indeed, that they failed to record who Martha's Reynolds' parents were. As stated earlier in this book, Elinor Reynolds' parents were Sarah Saxby and James Reynolds. Sarah Saxby's second husband was William Chaplin, (ca. 1722) and they were parents of William Chaplin (1744) who married Elizabeth Fripp, who in turn were parents of Elizabeth Chaplin who married Bernard Adams. Benjamin Chaplin, Sr. and William Chaplin who married Sarah (Saxby) Reynolds were brothers. Some of this is repetitious but it seems necessary to reiterate our belief that Elizabeth Chaplin Adams was in a position to KNOW whereof she spoke. 13
