NATHANIEL BRADWELL, SR.

married

SUSANNAH CATER, daughter of Thomas Cater (also spelled Gator) whose will is recorded in Charleston Probate Judge's Office, Vol.2, p.102, & was made 1 Feb. 1730, Proved 26 April 1731, Recorded 5 June 1731. Will names son: William Cater, daughters: SUSANNAH BRADWELL & MARY Lashly, Gr. son Paul Cater; Gr. dau: Elizabeth Bullen, Ann & Mary Hamblin; Mary Shephard. On 12 May 1699, Thomas Cater had warrant for 300A bounding Northward on land of said Cater (p.158 Warrants 1692-1711, Salley). Also 4 Sept. 1707 for 500A (p.208, Salley). William Cater had a warrant for 500A. 4 Sept. 1707 & for 500A on 7 Apr. 1711 at same time as Nathaniel Bradwell (Salley, p.236). Later land papers refer to a deed of gift 12 Apr. 1712 of land to Susannah Bradwell from Thomas Cater & states it was part of grant 27 July 1711 (Nathaniel Bradwell, Vol.3, p.124, 25 May Susannah Cater Bradwell was living 24 May 1736 (see p.33, Bapt. Ch. in S.C. - Townsend) & 18 Oct. 1738 when she & Nathaniel Bradwell wit. will of William Brunley.

Warrant for Land in S.C. 1692-1711, Salley, p.236 (500A, Berkeley Co.)
18 Oct. 1738, he & Susannah wit will of William Brunley. A Nathaniel Bradwell had a large tract (on later plats) near Baptist Meeting House near St. James G.C. line. Nathaniel, Sr. made will 8 Sept. 1748, Proved 3 Nov. 1752, no date of recording in Vol.7, p.23, describes self as planter; names wife Susannah; sons: Nathaniel, Isaac, Thomas; Daus: Elizabeth Bulline & Martha Boswood; Grandson, Joseph Bradwell (under age); granddau: Mary Bulline; Exors: sons Isaac & Nathaniel; Wit: Isaac Chandler, Frans. Sheppard, Jno. Johnson (Will bk. 1752-1756)

CHILDREN:

JACOB (is placed first because he died before his father made his will & therefore is not mentioned in the will of Nathaniel, Sr., but his son Joseph is listed in the will of Nathaniel, Sr. & he names his brothers Isaac & Nathaniel in his will) He married Elizabeth, dau of Mary & Wm. Elms. Had land grant Colleton (St. Paul's) 1 May 1733. Vol. Y, p.7, 1 July 1742 he purchased 500A in Colleton. Will made 13 Jan. 1744, Proved 15 Feb. 1744/5, Vol.5, p.365; Lists wife Tabitha; mother-in-law, Mary Elms; brothers: Isaac & Nathaniel; children: Joseph (under 21) & Mary (under 18). Inv. of Est. 22 Mich. 1744/5 recorded 25 Apr. 1745. Left £60 to pastor Isaac Chanler. Exors: Ezekiel Branford; brothers Isaac & Nathaniel. Wit: Thomas Bulline, Hugh Ferguson, Jno. Bulline, Jr. (which Bulline was the husband of his sister Elizabeth?), S.C. Baptists Townsend lists Jacob as constituent member of Ashley River Church, 24 May, 1736.

NATHANIEL (2nd) He & his brother Isaac were intimate with the Dorchester Congregation. He had a grant of 500A. in Liberty Co., Ga. 6 Aug. 1752 (2nd grant) see p.24, History & Records of Midway Church, Stacy. Will of Wm. Cater, 20 Oct. 1744 was wit. by Jr. & Sr. Nathaniel, Jr. was an Exor. of will of Francis Sheppard who married Mary Cater, sister of Susannah Bradwell. Thos Bulline & Thos. Cater were wit. to that will (probably recorded 1750). Nathaniel, Jr. made will 1778, Proved 14 Apr. 1784, Vol.20A, p.365, Chas. Wills; Lists wife Elizabeth; sons: John & Nathaniel; Daus: Elizabeth (Soor, Loor, Joor) & Harriett Bradwell; Wife Exor. He was listed as Kinsman in will Thomas Cater, St. George's Parish, Planter, 4 May 1753. Because of age, I believe Nathaniel (2nd.) was the Nathaniel Bradwell in the file of Deputy Surveyors in the S.C. Archives with a reference to Joseph Greenland and the date 1767. SCIM XX p.166 lists Nathaniel as making plat of Mount Boone Plantation 1766; SCIM XXIX in article on Goose Creek p.87 H.A.M. Smith states that in 1764 Nathaniel Bradwell made plat of property of Est. of Thomas Elms; p.92 on 8 June 1762 made map for Exors of Est. of a Bulline (Wolf's Castle). He had land grant St. George's Dorchester, 155A. Vol.2, p.492, 15 Jan. 1768, 100A, Vol.12, p.375; on 14 Aug. 1767, Vol.9, p.291, 500A on N. Santee in Craven County. Misc. Records, Chas. (1758-63) p.964- On 30 Mich. 1763 he was appointed Dep. Surveyor for State of S.C.

John Godfrey Sr. in will 12 March 1690 mentions plantation bought from James Sheppard
James Sheppard witnessed will of Henry Somersway 17 Oct. 1691

3. ISAAC was left 1 Negro Wench & her 2 sons and 1/4 part of his father's cattle. 500A. Grant in Liberty County, Ga., 1752 (p. 24 Stacy). Grant 500A. Craven Co., Vol. 9, p. 2, 22 Nov. 1765 (Memorials) bounded N. & W. by lands I. Bradwell. Will made 22 May 1766, codicil 10 June 1766, proved 1 Dec. 1766, Vol. 10B, p. 362 lists residence as St. James Santee; Relation: Susannah Ballentine to continue to live on plantation & to have control of education of his dau. Sarah; Children: Jacob & Isaac (2nd) & Sarah; Exors: brother Nathaniel, Nephew Nathaniel Bulline, & friend Gabriel Marion. Gabriel Marion and Nathaniel Bulline qualified. Deed to Aquilla Miles (called son-in-law) 15 May 1766. (Susanna Ballentine was dau. of John Bulline, Sr. will vol. 9 (1760-67) p. 251. 28 Aug. 1754 Isaac Bradwell was allowed 1/2 vote in Transactions of the Midway Society P. 2, Stacey's History Midway Church.

Information is requested as to wife of this Isaac & the exact relationship to Aquilla Miles. Aquilla Miles received a grant of 200A near the lands of Isaac Bradwell (1st.) 5 Oct. 1766 and sold it 15 Oct. 1766 to Thomas Sumpter by whom it was sold later to Saml. Dubois (Dubose?) of St. John's Parish who also bought on 27 Mch. 1771 500A of the Est. of Isaac Bradwell (1st) from Executors Gabriel Marion & Nathaniel Bulline (Charleston Apothecary) and release was signed by Jacob, Isaac, and Sarah Bradwell)
- Sarah Bradwell, Spr. dau. of Isaac Bradwell (South Carolina) marriage settlement 4-4-1777

SCHM Vol. 19, p. 137 Marriage & Death Notices S.C. weekly Gazette, Sat. Jan. 22, 1785, notice of marriage, but no date given, of Mr. Alexander Petrie to Mrs. Sarah Frederick. (Note; Sarah must have died by Nov. 1795 as Alex Petrie, Esq. was then married to Miss Mary Evans of St. Georges, Dorchester. SCHM Vol. 6, p. 16 lists Lt. Alex Petrie & p. 59 lists Capt. Petrie, 2nd. Regt. S.C. Line.

Could these be the brothers listed above? If so Isaac (2nd) was back in St. George's Parish, South Carolina by the 1790 Census.

RMC Office, Charleston: Book Z-3, Gabriel Marion, Executor, deed of 500 A, 22 May 1766 to Samuel Dubois; deed states 500A. of Santee Swamp land being part of 2 tracts of land on N. side of Santee River, Craven County making 1000 acres of river swamp land, part of 500A was originally granted said Isaac Bradwell deed bearing date about 23 Oct. 1765 & other part granted to Honble Robt. Pringle, Esq. bearing date 19 Oct. 1759. Indenture 28 March 1771.

See Will Joseph Brunson (Will Bk. 1736-1740, p. 443) St. George's Parish, Berkeley County, Wife Ann, dwelling house & land for life, then to children. Sons: John, Joseph, Ebenezer, & Thomas, land bounded north by Mr. Wm. Brandford & Mathew Beard, w. on Beard, s. on son John, E. on roadway. Daus: Jane, Hannah, Rebecca. Exors: Wife; sons John & Joseph. Wit: Small Stevens, Ann Cantey, John Stevens. Dated 8 July 1734, P. 12 Nov. 1739, R. 19 Nov. 1739. See Deed Bk. 2, 1 Mch. 1743- Release John Brunson, planter, & Abigail his wife; Isaac Bradwell & Rebecca his wife, all of St. George's Parish, Berkeley County; Ebenezer Brunson planter; John Penny & Hannah his wife all of Colleton Co., S.C. of 1st part to Barnaby Bradford, planter of St. George's Parish, 200 acres in said parish... to which parties of first part were entitled by the will of Joseph Brunson of St. George's Parish... (Memorial registered in Auditor's Office July 25, 1751, Bk. #3)

SCHM, Vol. 6, p. 75: Joseph Brunson, 1722, owner of lot & part of Church (Congregational) at Dorchester, S. C.

6. Thomas Bradwell - Named in his father's will (dated 8 Sept. 1748). Thomas made will 13 Jan. 1744 (same date as his brother Jacob), proved 30 Nov. 1767, St. Bartholomew's Parish, Colleton County, lists wife Hannah, but children are not named; Exors: wife Hannah & James Sharp (See will James Sharp Vol. 13, p. 689 who lists a daughter Hannah. Also will of James Sharp, Jr., 26 Feb. 1785, Vol. 23, p. 603) Thomas received 4 male slaves and 1/4 part of cattle in will of Nathaniel, Sr. Thomas, along with his brothers Nathaniel & Isaac were connected at some time with the Dorchester Congregation group. Thomas signed The Articles of Incorporation in 1754 (P. 41) (whether this was Thomas, Sr. or his son Thomas, I have no way of knowing as the list begins in 1754 and continues to 1865 without a date of signing).
- > April 9, 1767, Thomas Bradwell died (Records Kept By Col. Isaac Hayne list death of Bradwell of The Round O, SCIM, Vol. 10, p. 156). Will of James Sharp, Charleston Merchant, 26 Feb. 1785, Vol. 23, p. 603, leaves slaves to Thomas Bradwell, John Bradwell & William Gevinn Bradwell & terms each "Kinsman"; He also releases all debts due by Est. of Thomas Bradwell, deceased, to the estate of his father. Lowe, Jones, & West relatives referred to by James Sharp, Jr. all seem to have gone to Georgia. Hannah Bradwell went with her family to Midway, Ga. in Oct. 1770. 20 Oct. 1744, Thomas was wit to will of Wm. Cater; 2 May 1759 wit to will of Joseph Scott, Colleton County; 2 Jan. 1755 named as Exor in will of John Pinny, St. Bartholomew's Parish; 13 Jan. 1753 named Exor in will of William Little, St. Bart. Parish.
- * Hannah Bradwell Petition to Governor of Ga. & Council 4 Dec. 1770 for land; Had four children and 38 negroes; Prayed 500 acres St. Andrews Parish on a branch of the Little Mortar, joining the Sand Hill & three miles from land ordered Thomas Stevens, granted (Colonial Rec. of Georgia XI 189). Hannah Bradwell prayed 2 July 1771 Governor and council for 300 more acres in St. Andrews Parish to adjoin land already granted her, for her negroes; to be laid out in an oblong; Granted (Colonial Records of Georgia XI p. 409) Hannah Bradwell, Midway, Georgia, 1771. Memorial 12-24-1771 by Jacob Lewis, 500 Acres in St. Andrews Parish, all sides vacant. Granted 10-1-1771 HANNAH Bradwell (Memorials 1754-1772 p. 709) Memorial 3-5-1772 for Hannah Bradwell by Gideon Dowse, 300 acres St. Andrews Parish, Bounded E. grantee, other sides vacant. Granted 2-4-1772. Ibid p. 721.
- > WILL of HANNAH BRADWELL, St. John's Parish, Province of Georgia; dated 22 July 1775, Wit: Mary Jones, John Kell, & John Jones; Recorded 1/6/1775 Bk. AA, p. 188. To be buried at Plantation of Mr. Joseph Law if body of dau. Mary is moved there, otherwise to be buried at Medway Meeting House. Lists: Sons: Thomas Bradwell (under 21), John Bradwell, & Gavin Bradwell; Dau: Susanna Dowse; Deceased Dau: Mary; Grandchildren: Thomas Elliott, Joseph Benjamin & Charles Law; Exors: Gideon Dowse, Jacob Bradwell & son Thomas Bradwell when he reaches the age of 21. Jacob Bradwell qualified as Executor. NOTE: Was this Jacob the son of Isaac (1st). It could not have been the brother of Thomas, Sr., for he had died in S.C. in 1744/5.

Isaac Bradwell calls Susannah Ballentine "relation" in his will. She was a dau. of a John Bulline who died in 1762 (Judge Smith Vol. 29, p. 91) who says he married Ann Baker and had sons John & William and daughters Susannah Ballentine and Ann & Elizabeth Bulline (Prob. court, Chas. Bk. 1760-67, p. 156. Judge Smith describes this John as a son of John & a nephew of Thomas and as having a cousin Thomas

Nathaniel Bulline was wit. to will of Isaac Holmes 1754. Nathaniel Bulline appears to have been a loyalist during the American Revolution with claims in Ontario Archives. SCHM. Vol. 14, p. 38.

(Thomas Bulling had a Warr^t. for five hundred acres of Land lying att Summer towne on the West Side of Stewarts Line Dated the Seaventh Day of December 1696/ P. 137

From death notice in 1795 giving age as 41 years, he was born about 1754. This date would make it probable that it was his father Nathaniel (2nd) who was appointed Dep. Dr. Hollingshead at St. George's, Dorchester Major Mathias Hutchinson to Mrs. Elizabeth Joor(Friday, June 8, 1798 & XXXIII, p.36 the Register of Independent Congregational(Circular) Church of Charleston, June 5, 1798 ~~is~~ Major Matthias Hutchinson & Mrs. Elizabeth Joor. As no married name is given in will of her father(Nathanior(2nd.) made in 1778, it appears that she was not married but alive at that time.

I. JACOB BRADWELL b.

He is listed in will of his father dated May & June of 1766 & he signed release to property in 1771 along with his brother Isaac & sister Sarah. This Jacob may have been the one who qualified as executor of the will of Hannah Bradwell (widow of Thomas of Round O) 1775 in Liberty County, Ga. It could not have been his Uncle Jacob whose will was proved 15 Feb. 1741/5. He had a grant of 77A. 17 Oct. 1771, St. Marks Parish, Craven County, North side of Santee, bounded N.E. by Isaac Bradwell, Memorials Vol. 11, p.69. Could this have been the Jacob who was listed along with an Isaac in Dinwiddie County, Va. in 1782.

II. ISAAC (2nd.) BRADWELL b.

He is named in the will of his father dated May & June of 1766 & he signed release to property in 1771 along with Jacob and Sarah.

ISAAC(2nd.) was married at least three times. The name of 1st wife is not yet known. He had one son Thomas by this marriage.

On 1 Jan. 1778 he was married to Susannah Bonneau, dau of Anthony Bonneau and Mary Dubois (R.M.C. Office, Charleston, Vol. B5, p.438 & Parish Register of St. Thomas & St. Denis Parish of S.C., Clute, p.27) Susannah Bonneau was named in the will of her Grandmother Susanna DuBois, 19 July 1757 & as under 21 in 1758 in will of Francis Dallas. By this second marriage he had one known child, a son Isaac (3rd)

Isaac (2nd) married a 3rd time- to Rosa (or Rosanna) Lapp of a Gorman family in the vicinity of Indian Fields. He had lived in both St. George's Dorchester and St. James Goose Creek. The only known child of Isaac (2nd) and Rosa Lapp was Samuel Bradwell, whose bible is in possession of descendants near Indian Fields. The 1830 Census lists Rosanna Bradwell St. George's Parish: 1 male (20-30) 1 female (10-15), 1 female (20-30), 1 female (50-60). Thomas J. Easterling who later lived at Duck Pond Plantation in Berkeley County was a cousin of the children of Isaac (3rd) Thomas J. Easterling's mother is said to have been a Bradwell.

Isaac (2nd.) was listed in 1790 Census in St. George's Parish. In Book E9, p.249 he was a Justice of the Quorum for Colleton District.

Listed in 1766 in will of father (Isaac, 1st) as under 17 years of age. 28 Mch. 1771, she with her brothers Isaac & Jacob signed release for sale of 500A of 1000A of their father's lands in Santee River Swamp.

4-4-1777. Sarah Bradwell, Spr. dau. of Isaac Bradwell of St. George's Parish & Samuel Frederick Planter made a marriage settlement.

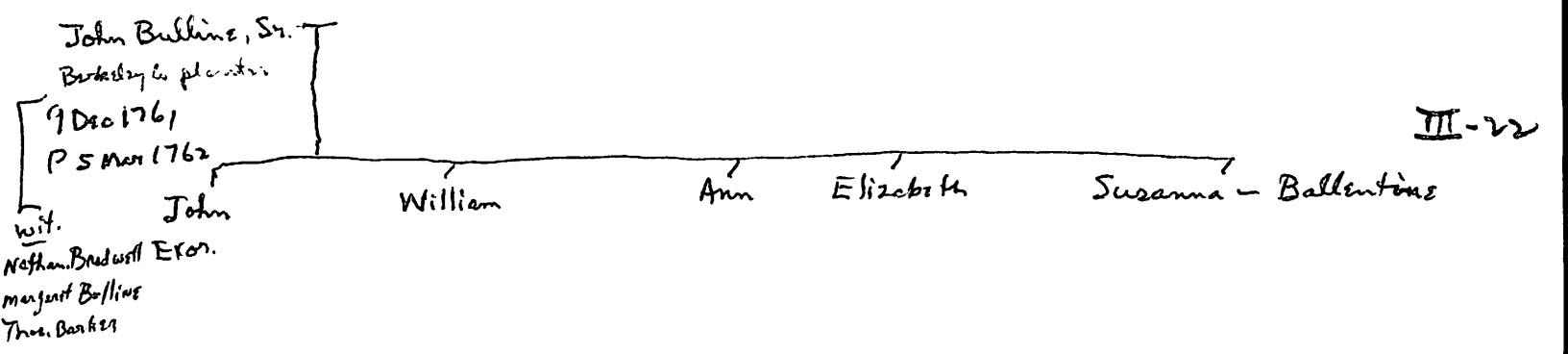
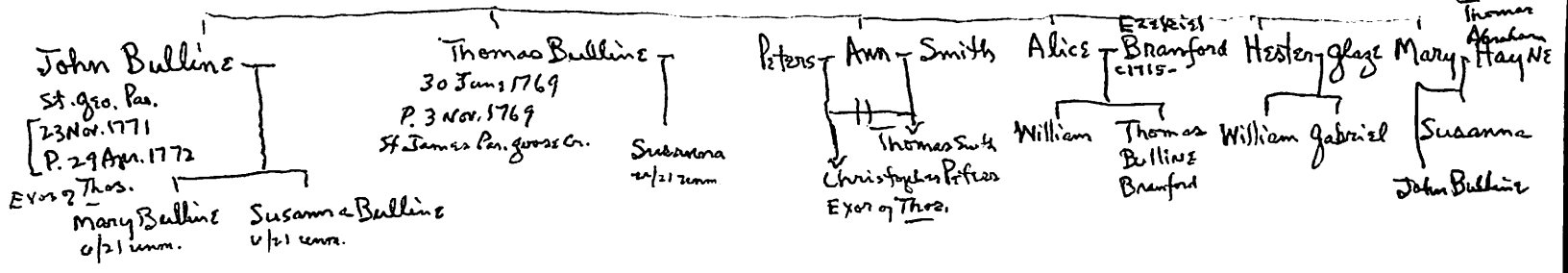

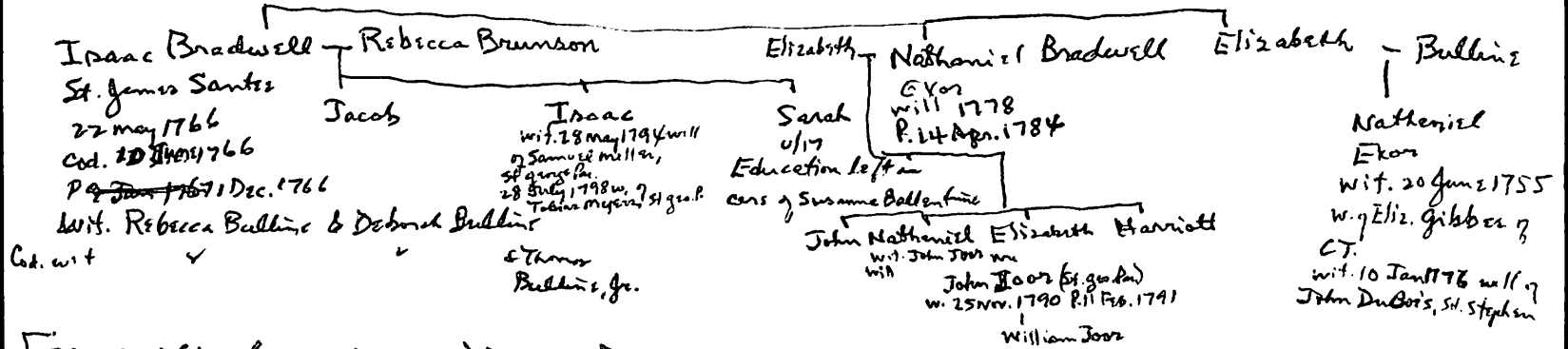
