Memorandum of an agreement between  
Mr. Susan McC Pherson and Mr. E. A. McC Pherson  
May 10<sup>th</sup> 1830.

The said parties do agree to the following  
division and partition of the part of the real Estate  
they inherited from the late James McC Pherson.  
That the said Susan McC Pherson shall have & take  
to herself her share and assigns the plantation called  
Cotton Hall, including the tract called Deveaux &  
the Mill with the lands appertaining thereto  
and mill pond, now belonging to the Laurin  
tract and the pieces of land adjoining the said  
Mill pond and the road leading from the publick  
Road near Stony Creek church to the said Mill  
the left or western ditch of the said Road to be  
the division line, and the said E. A. McC Pherson ag-  
rees to take as her portion the remaining part  
of the tract of Laurin with the dwelling house  
&c. and also the plantation called Armenia in the  
district of Barnwell to be held by her their Heirs

the said plantation, Cotton Hall & Mill and  
that part of Laurens above specified a-  
greed to be taken by the said Susan M'Pherson.

Barnwell District presents may concern  
Know Ye that I Richard Johnson in the State  
aforesaid, send, Greeting: Whereas I the said Richard  
Johnson and Isaac Redfield in and by our certain  
bonds or obligations, bearing date the thirty first  
day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand  
eight hundred and thirty, and made payable as fol-  
lows: the first for one thousand dollars payable  
the first day of January 1832, the second for  
the same <sup>sum</sup>, payable the first day of January 1833,  
the third for the same sum payable the first day  
of January 1834, the fourth for the same sum  
payable the first day of January 1835. Stand firmly  
held and bound unto Alexander Bahaw of the  
District and State aforesaid, in the sum of  
Eight thousand dollars, conditioned for the payment  
of the sum of four thousand dollars, in the manner  
and form above written, as in and by the said  
Bonds and condition thereon, references being  
thereto had will more fully appear. Now
