Memorandum of an agreement between
 Mrs. Susan M^cPherson and Mr. E. A. M^cPherson
 May 10th 1830.

The said parties do agree to the following
 division and partition of the part of the real Estate
 they inherited from the late James M^cPherson,
 That the said Susan M^cPherson shall have & take
 to herself her heirs and assigns the plantation called
 Cotton Hall, including the tract called Devenant's
 and the mill with the lands appertaining thereto
 as a mill pond, now belonging to the Laurens
 tract and the pieces of land adjoining the said
 mill pond and the road leading from the public
 Road near Stony Creek Church to the said Mill
 the left or western ditch of the said Road to be
 the division line, and the said E. A. M^cPherson a-
 gree to take as her portion the remaining part
 of the tract of Laurens with the dwelling house
 &c. and also the plantation called Armenia in the
 District of Barnwell to be held by her then heirs

and assigns, in lieu and as equivalent to
 the said plantation, Cotton Hall Mill and
 that part of Laurenum above specified a-
 gree^d to be taken by the said Susan M^cPherson

 Know Ye that I Richard Johnson in the State
 aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas I the said Richard
 Johnson and Isaac Redfield, in and by our certain
 bonds or obligations, bearing date the thirty first
 day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and thirty, and made payable as fol-
 lows; the first for one thousand dollars payable
 the first day of January 1832, the second for
 the same sum payable the first day of January 1833,
 the third for the same sum payable the first day
 of January 1834, the fourth for the same sum
 payable the first day of January 1835 stand firmly
 held and bound unto Alexander Cahaw of the
 district and State aforesaid, in the pecuniary sum of
 Eight thousand dollars, conditioned for the payment
 of the sum of four thousand dollars, in the manner
 and form above written, as in and by the said
 Bonds and condition thereof, reference being
 thereunto had will more fully appear. Now
