Sixteen, of the known twentysix, graves have already been uncovered. It has been estimated that there are fifty or more graves in the cemetery. The deceased arrived here from North Carolina, Virginia and Georgia. The earliest date uncovered is 1836. Most of the tombstones are large, ela-

borate, carved on all sides, and date from 1836 to 1848, with one as late as 1855.
