Dear Robert:

I have some information in regard to the Lt.-Col. William Farr who married Elizabeth Stribley (as his second wife) in the Union District. This definitely confirms our suspicion that these people are definitely not my ancestors.

The ladies in my family who prepared their pedigrees for admission to the D.A.R. around the turn of the century were correct up to the Thomas Farr who married Elizabeth Waring. But there they erred in assuming he was a son of Lt.-Col. Wm. Farr of the Union District. I used the same pedigree when I joined the S.A.R. in 1938 and so I made the same error. If you will take a few minutes to scan the attached information on the Wm. Farr and Elizabeth Stribley - branch I think you will agree with my conclusion that we need no further research so far as the Union District Farris are concerned because they are not related to me. With them out of the picture it should be a relatively easy task to work back

from the Thomas Farr who married Elizabeth Waring. I think I have enough information here to do the job so it will not be necessary for you to bother with the matter. None the less, the help and information is very much appreciated.

I hope we did not disturb you last week about Mc Connell's "Ancestral Peregrinations". Pat Nicholson was very favorably impressed with the idea of the U.H. Foundation publishing a few hundred copies for distribution to genealogical societies and universities as we did with 'Chronicles of Fleetwood' House.
