He was a planter and also had maritime interests. His plantation was on whitemarch Island near Turners Rocks where Turners Greek flows into the Wilmington River. Whitemarsh Island 15 not far from Savannah and at the time was accessible only by water from the mainland. During the seige of Sawannah (1862-1864) a. skirmish between Federal Thoops which landed from the blockadurg Squadron and Georgia Militia was fought on and near the Fleetwood
