- Baker, Esq. and his wife, Mary Bohun, died at Cater Plantation, St. George's Parish 8 January 1752, married in 1749 Thomas Cater, planter of St. George's Parish, born 1731, son of William Cater, planter of St. George's Parish, and his wife, Mary; his will of 4 May 1752, proved 17 Sept. 1753, left his plantation night Ashley River in St. George's Parish whereon "I have lived since my father's death (1749) to my beloved son Thomas Cater". Their only son:
- 20. Thomas Cater, planter of Cater Hall Plantation, St. Peter's Parish, Captain in Revolutionary War, member of 1782 Jacksonborough Assembly, member of S. C. House of Representatives 1786 from Lincoln County, born 17 Dec. 1751 near Ashley River, St. George's Parish, married 18 Feb. 1773 Rachel Miles, born 22 Dec. 1755, died 30 Jan. 1802, daughter of Captain Silas Miles, planter of Poplar Springs Plantation, St. Paul's Parish, and his wife, Elizabeth, daughter of Captain James McPherson, "The Indian Fighter", Captain of the S. C. Rangers who excorted and protected General James Oglethorpe in 1733 in founding the Colony of Georgia, planter of Prince William Parish. In 1759 Thomas Cater as son of Susannah Baker Cater received one-tenth of 443-acre Chatsworth Plantation which was granted 31 Jan. 1701 to William Rowsham whose daughter Susannah Rowsham married William Baker and was grandmother of Susannah Baker Cater. Their daughter:
- 21. Mary Elizabeth Cater, born 4 Aug. 1774 at Cater Hall Plantation, St. Peter's Parish, died 25 Feb. 1823, buried in the Robert Cemetery near Robertville, married (1) 1799 Thomas Rhodes, born 22 April 1775 Bridgenorth, Shropshire, England, son of George Rhodes who married 11 Nov. 1772 Elizabeth (Betsy) Bache in the Church of St. Mary Magdalen, Bridgenorth, died at his Calliwassi Island Plantation, St. Luke's Parish 25 April 1809; she married (2) 1810 Rev. Winborn Asa Lawton. The elder son of Thomas Rhodes and Mary Elizabeth Cater was:
- 22. Hon. George Rhodes, born 11 Jan. 1802 at Calliwassi Island, St. Luke's Parish, died 2 Oct. 1881 at The Hermitage Plantation, Lawtonville, St. Peter's Parish, educated at Dr. Moses Waddell's famous Willington Academy, Signer of the Ordinance of Secession 1860, married (1) 15 Nov. 1821 Thursa Evelina, daughter of Secession 1860, married (1) 15 Nov. 1821 Thursa Evelina, daughter of Robertville Baptist Church for more than 50 years, and his first wife, Charlotte Anne Lawton, also his first cousin, daughter of Revolutionary War Lt. Joseph Lawton, J? P., planter of Mulberry Grove Plantation, St. Peter's Parish, and his wife, Sarah Robert; after the death of Thursa Evelina in the summer of 1828, George Rhodes married (2) at Christmastide her younger sister, Eliza Jane Robert, born 30 Jan. 1810. On 5 Jan. 1829 the Rev. James Jehu Robert made a deed of two male and five female slaves to his cousin, Col. Alexander J. Lawton, "in trust for the use and support of my daughter, Eliza Jane Robert Rhodes, wife of George Rhodes, and any children she might have".
