REACH OUT AND TOUCH THE WORLD

(Sounds like a New Year's Resolution)

The 6 great grandchildren of John Chandler of 1610 became the major branches of his descendants: Joell, Timothy, Robert, John, William and little brother, Joseph. None of them were rich in those days, except, in hope and expectations. They were farm boys in New Kent, VA. All had hard work to do to get their own farm and estate going and in feeding their families; but many of them were elected to fulfill civic duties in their communities, as well.

Around the time of the Civil War, older brother, Timothy, and Little Brother, Joseph, each had a generation of their descendants flower like a rose, giving off the sweet savor of Christian lives that reached out beyond their community to even "touch the world".

How do you explain that? Is **Abraham Lincoln**, or **Patrick Henry**, or **Isaac Shelby**, or **Billy Graham**, or **John Chandler** of 1610, explainable?. Rising to the challenge of their times may have been a factor.

LITTLE BROTHER JOSEPH (1699-1704, Robert, Robert, John)

He went with his brothers north out of New Kent, VA, to Caroline County, VA, first. Then left with older brothers Joell and William, to Goochland, second. But he settled near William in Lunenberg County, VA, near the unborder with NC, where he obtained a grant of 1840 acres. In his will he gave son, Joel and William, all but 330 acres of it (which went to his wife, Sarah), but William gave 200 acres of his to a brother. He had about 5 sons, William(md.Delisha), Joel(md.Agnes), James(md.Susannah), John(md.Elizabeth), Joseph, Jr.(md.Sarah?).

Several of his descendants did make a difference in different ways. Many Chandlers of note have chosen to be useful to their communities through a career in law. Among JOSEPH's children, some of son Joel's descendants reached out to make a difference¹:

1.a. GREEN CALLIER CHANDLER² (1829-1905; William, Shadrack, Joel, JOSEPH, R, R, John)

Joseph's great great grandson, Green Callier Chandler, reached out and made a difference to the citizens of the state of MS through law----not once, but three times!.

His father, William, fought with Gen/Pres. Andrew Jackson; he died at Green's home when he was 80. Greene aimed for a career in law. After passing the bar in MS, he became District Attorney and Judge, who established MS State Law in 1854. Then, he rewrote the MS state laws under the Confederacy in 1861 and fought in the war; he rewrote them again in 1869 when MS came back under the USA.

No small task; no small intellect, and it affected everyone who has lived in MS since then. He was a gentleman, orator, newsman, elected to the House of Representatives and imported cows from the Island of Jersey³.

He married, **Martha Glouvinia Croft**, circa 1851. They had 7 children, some of whom continued to influence citizenry through the law.

The English islands of Jersey and Guernsey off the coast of France bred distinctly different breeds of cows; The Jersey gives prodigious amounts of milk, but the Guernsey has high cream content.

WALTER CLIFFT CHANDLER¹.

(1887-1967; William H., Green Callier, William, Shadrack, Joel, JOSEPH, R., R., John)

1.b. William Henry Chandler, son of lawyer, Green Callier, had an artistic streak and no interest in the law. He was an accomplished violinist, but couldn't make a living at it in post-Civil War MS. He tried, but wasn't happy, as a salesman. Then he went to college and learned to be a Dentist; he worked at it for two years———No Way! Not for him. Then he found a satisfactory niche as a railroad mail clerk.

He married, **Mary Knoxie Clifft**, 1886, Madison County, TN. She had a green thumb, read Latin and English classics, made children's clothes. Children 9:(2 died as babes):

- 1.c. William Henry's oldest son, Walter Clifft Chandler, was excited about a law degree and his grandfather's life; he worked his way through Univ/TN as a reporter to get one. He passed the bar, became Assistant Attorney General, Shelby County, TN, elected to the House (Shelby County), and the Senate(Tipton County), and City Attorney of Memphis.

He took time out to enlist in the Field Artillery serving in Word War I, 1917-1919 on the front lines. He became a very popular Mayor of Memphis. He was, also, artistic, a poet, and collector of ancient music. The life of his grandfather, **Green Callier**, influenced **Walter**'s vocation and lifestyle. He published: *The Journal and Speeches of Green Callier Chandler*. He was a Bible teacher, and Sunday School Superintendent who led the parade welcoming the fifth Episcopal Bishop to a new Cathedral in Memphis.

He married, the beautiful, talented, traveled, **Dorothy Wyeth**; they had 2 children. He was pleased with his son's interest in law and made him his partner. **John Wyeth, II, and III,** are currently lawyers and judges in Memphis, TN. **Green's life in the law reached out to touch others in a positive way in MS and TN through 6 generations**: Children: 2

Joseph's brother, was fined and put in jail for 'listening' to a Baptist which Gov. Spotswood had made illegal, considering them heretical. When people kept listening anyway, the Governor angrily threw all 25 Baptist ministers in jail; they were still there a full year later. No amount of appeals had the least effect.

Finally, their families asked **Patrick Henry** to change the Governor's mind. **Patrick** sized up the situation, loaded the courtroom and the jury with **Henry** relatives, and pled their case before his uncle, **Judge Henry**, with an irresistible, rousing call for the freedom of these poor souls whose destitute families awaited----- winning their case.

One who touched the world with the gospel was **Rev. Pleasant Barnett Chandler** whose heart was touched by the thousands flooding into wild, unchurched Texas. One thing led to another until the **entire world felt his reach**.

2.a. REV. PLEASANT BARNETT CHANDLER¹ (1816-1904, Lewis, James, Joseph, Jr, JOSEPH, R, R, John)

His father, Lewis, grandson of Joseph, Jr., was born in Granville County, NC, grew up in Franklin County, GA, served in the War of 1812 under Garrett L. Sandbridge's Co., GA Militia. He married, Susannah Barnett, first and Mary, second. They had 8 children(only Pleasant and James' dates are certain).

2a Only 80 years after Patrick Henry's plea, Pleasant B. Chandler, son of Lewis Chandler heard the Baptist message, now legal, in GA, accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his Savior and joined the Baptist church at 22 years old. Feeling called to preach, as well, he sold his farm, took his wife and 3 children to Mercer Univ., in GA so he could get an education, taught 2 years, was licensed and ordained by the time he was 30 in 1846.

No reason to wait !! He was anxious to get started sharing the Gospel!!That same year he shipped out under a Baptist Missionary Board from Mobile, AL, by boat to Galveston, TX. Three other Baptist Ministers were with him; Rev. Henry L. Graves took charge of the schools of Baylor Univ. Pleasant was sent to the very wild and wooly



central TX south of Austin, in Fayette County, where he ministered for 28 years serving 3 or 4 churches at once in 3 different counties. Fearsome banditos, Indians, and the Mexican Gen. Santa Ana were not far away².

Pleasant served as a minister for over 50 years, was also a moderator of the CO Baptist Associations, Vice Pres. of State Convention, and trustee of Baylor U, 1852-1877. He may not have actually founded Baylor, but surely helped support it as he sent 12 of his 13 children

there, (even though 9 of them were girls—good man, that.) Since he raised the 8 orphans of his brother **William Addison Chandler**, also, he may have sent them as well. A Baptist history said that in his life and character, **Pleasant** lived up to his name, practiced what he preached, and reached out to touch greatly the lives of Texans.

He married, first, Mary O' Kelly, and second, Susan A. Howard. Children:

2.b. VAN CLIBURN²

(1934- ;Harvey Lavan Cliburn, Sr, William O'Bryan, Sarah Ann Chandler, Pleasant B., Lewis, James, Joseph, Jr. JOSEPH, R, R, John).

Pleasant's oldest daughter, Sarah Ann, was the great grandmother of Van Cliburn, who loved piano music, probably from before he was born, if we are to believe today's experts. His mother was an accomplished concert pianist who taught students, at home. She recognized his talent when he accurately played the piece of music which one of her students had just been practicing when he was only 3 years old!!! She became his first teacher.

He won a state competition at 12, at 13 was a soloist with the Houston Symphony Orchestra playing Tchaikovsky's B Flat Minor Concerto and debuted at 14 at Carnegie Hall, NY. At 24 he entered the **Tchaikovsky International Piano Competition in Moscow, Russia**, and won playing the same piece! The Russian audience gave him a great ovation for the skill and expertise with which he played their masterpiece. He has won every US prize for piano and has **reached out to delight the world** with his expertise and the beauty of his music.

3. Lewis Chandler, the father of Rev. Pleasant Barnett Chandler, had brothers, Wyatt, and Richardson, as well. His grandfather, Joseph, Jr. was the brother of John, Sr. whose son, Joseph(md Nancy Turman), also lived near Bear Creek. So Lewis, et al, had first cousins, John, Robert, Sterling, Green and William, near by.

3.a. WYATT CHANDLER³

(1791-1864; James, Joseph, Jr., JOSEPH, R, R, John)

Wyatt was born in Granville, NC, after the Rev. War, but grew up with his brothers, and Lewis in Bear Creek in the southern tip of Franklin County, GA. He was 73 at death in 1864.

Wyatt and Lewis enlisted in the War of 1812, under Gen/Pres. Andrew Jackson

who took his group to FL to fight the Seminole Indian War, 1817-1819. On their return **Wyatt** received 3 sizable land grants through land lotteries. He sold one, moved 1833-1836 to Gwinett, then Carroll County on Georgia's western frontier. His brother, **Richardson**, moved west with him but went on across the line to Calhoun County in eastern, AL. **Wyatt** was a deacon in a Primitive Baptist Church. **Wyatt** started a *family line that reached out to the world*.

3.b. WYATT JACKSON CHANDLER¹

(1829-1863; Wyatt, James, Joseph, Jr, JOSEPH, R,R, John)

On the 1850 census **Wyatt, Mary** and 2 sons, **Wyatt Jackson and Philo Hall**(21 & 18) were at home. Haralson county was raised out of Carroll when both **Wyatt Jackson and Philo Hall** enlisted in the same unit in the Civil War. **Philo** was captured; **Wyatt** was killed(33) along with 8 others in their unit in a bloody battle in MS in 1863.

He married, **Melissa C. Price**, circa 1852, and had 5 children. After his death and the ravages of the Civil War, **Melissa** and the children really had to scramble to stay alive. She raised them by herself, and lived with them after they married.

3.c. JOHN WILLIAM CHANDLER

(1853-1930, Wyatt J, Wyatt, James, Joseph, Jr. JOSEPH, R, R, John)

John William was only 10 when his father and grandfather died. Suddenly, play time was over; school was over, he was the head of the household, the man of the house, since his three siblings were younger still. Thus started, three generations of renting, not owning, farms.

Melissa lived in western GA and eastern AL; John William scrambled for any job he could do: chop wood, mining, milk cows, clear brush, farm labor. The years after the Civil War were desperate for many, but worse for this 10 year-old breadwinner. Melissa married, second, Joseph Jackson, but her children vetoed it and ran him off. She was 61 at her death in 1916 at grandson Virgil's home.

John William married, Annie Leona Nelson, and had 7 children.(full dates known).

3.d. VIRGIL CHANDLER¹

(1888-1962; John Wm, Wyatt J., Wyatt, James, Joseph, Jr., JOSEPH, R, R, John)

Virgil was John William and Annie's middle child, born, in Cherokee, AL. He knew a lot about being poor, and hard times, and they did not get any better. Although, as farm folks know, if your dirt is good, you can grow a large garden, have chickens, cows, hogs for meat.

School was over for Virgil after the 5th grade, but he had learned to read, write, and cipher. They lived in several places as he found a share-cropping job in the neighborhood. He worked at the mines, and the railroad, a cotton mill and any odd jobs that could produce a few dollars. By 1925, he bought a Model T Ford car, a real piece of work as the Scot's say.

When he was barely 20, he married, **Lea Pearl Garmon**. They had 4 boys, but **tragedy stalked them**. Their third **son died at 3; their oldest son, at 20.** The **depression** hit in 1929 and things got worse from there. (I remember that depression—it wasn't fun—it was a time when parents were fraught with worry and how to keep children alive).

Although Virgil was wise beyond his years and was usually full of clever sayings, he had to fight an inner depression, as well, the result of losing two of his precious children. He worked hard to overcome his depression by helping the other two sons to get a good start in life. He loved the woods, and reading and discussing local and world events and politics. Then World War II came along. It was good news and bad news: sons leaving for the war, the casualties, lack of supplies were bad news. The good news was sharecropping was still an option.

By 1946, Virgil bought his first, very own farm. But after he died, Pearl was implored to sell it and to come live with, son, Gordon and Kathleen. When she was 93 grandson, Glenn, sent her an airline ticket to fly to CT where he lived. He showed her the world, Mark Twain's house, the Atlantic Ocean.

They had 4 children—only 2 lived a normal life span; one had an unusual reach.

3.e. REV. GORDON RUSSELL CHANDLER (1913-1998; Virgil, John Wm., Wyatt J., Wyatt, James, Joseph, Jr. JOSEPH, R, R, John)

Despite being in the 5th generation of very difficult times in this family, **Gordon**'s efforts inspired his boys to dream big and to achieve much¹.

Gordon, too, found whatever jobs he could to help his folks when he was growing up. Like his father, and grandfather, he had to quit school to go to work, but he lasted until the 8th grade, when the tall skinny boy met the lovely, 9th grader, **Kathleen Green.**

He was a man in a hurry; he married, **Kathleen Maude Green**, 5 Oct. 1929 when both were 16. **Kathleen** was the daughter of **James T., Jr., and Mary F. S. Robertson**². Her mother had died when she was 3; her father, when she was 14. Just 3 weeks after their marriage, the stock market crashed and her inheritance from her father——\$500— was lost when the banks closed(except for the \$12 she had used for her wedding dress). And 3 weeks later still, **Gordon**'s brother, **Horace**, was killed by a falling tree. Both **Horace and Gordon** and wives had been staying with their father, **Virgi**l; a few months later, after they all had moved to Cherokee County, GA, their house burned to the ground in a fire set by a paid arsonist.

Not an auspicious beginning. Gordon and Kathleen were only 18 and already she had lost both parents and her inheritance; he had lost his brother and all their possessions----but they had each other and believed God was still with them. Things would soon get better.

When they were 20, they were blessed with a son, Harold— a herald of good tidings?. A second son, was named, Charles. But when Gordon and Kathleen were 23, Harold, now 3, contracted diphtheria. The doctor did everything he could, then said it was up to the Lord. Gordon had been agonizing over whether God was calling him to preach. (I shouldn't wonder that he thought of Job, or Jonah, or Amos in the Bible, about this time!!! Out of deep despair, he leaned against a tree and asked God to heal his son, whom he would dedicate to God, and if it was His will, he would turn his life into a preaching ministry.) Harold recovered.

At 25, 1938, **Gordon** announced his call to preach. They were blessed with 2 more sons. World War II reached their community. They bought a 100-acre farm in GA in 1942, the first time in 80 years his family had been able to buy land. **Gordon** had a tractor, a combine for

wheat, and other machines—the only mechanized operation in the area. They had cows, hogs, chickens to eat and to sell, grew cotton, taking it to the gin at Cedarton, Polk, GA. He operated a garage on the farm, owned a sawmill and construction company; they both worked at the Goodyear Cotton Mill, and was a pastor for four churches. Had he forgotten his promise??

In 1946, much like his ancestor, **Rev. Pleasant Barnett Chandler**, of 100 years before, **Gordon** closed the garage, resigned their mill jobs, sold the mill and farm, and enrolled in son, **Harold's** highschool so he could **become a Baptist minister**. He took all his subjects in one year, while driving a bus, working as a carpenter on a new school, serving 4 churches. He graduated in 1946, elected by his classmates to preach the baccalaureate sermon, and **Kathleen** gave birth to their 4th son, **Christmas Eve, 1946.**

They moved back to AL and lived in several places, served several churches; he took Howard College(Samford) extension courses and a non-degree program at the Baptist Seminary, Louisville, KY. He was a Director of Missions. In Oct. 1956 they moved back to Anniston, AL, to pastor Blue Mt. Baptist Church for the next 21 years to 1978.

He served 9 churches, baptized his five sons, assisted in the ordination of two to the Gospel Ministry, encouraged young pastors. In the 60's he served on a Committee for better race relations. Since 1955, he lived in constant back pain despite 5 spinal surgeries.

His sons appreciated living in the city in their teens with access to good schools and libraries. He told them: **Get your education !! Education is the KEY to the future !!** . All 5 boys responded to this role model and advice by entering the helping professions: two are ministers, a professor, a physician and a health care consultant--- touching the world.. **Gordon and Kathleen** were married, 69 years. 5 sons:

3.f. Dr. Gordon Harold Chandler.

They called him, **Harold**, **Gordon Russell and Kathleen's** first Christmas present born, **Christmas Eve**, **1932**, Cherokee County, AL, in the middle of the depression.

Haroid survived diphtheria, grew up in, and settled in, northeastern AL, where his ancestors had gone after the Civil War. He was bright and quick to learn, and quite enjoyed high school, graduating in 1948 at the end of World War II. Taking his father's advice, he sought a college education, taking advantage of the lower cost in the new Jr. College system, (Snead Jr. College, Boaz, AL), graduating in 1950, applied at Auburn University, graduating in 1952.

He met, and married in his Junior year, Hazel Blackwell, on Christmas Day, 1951----what better time to start married life.

With his father's character, life, and preaching ministry as an example, and the witness in his life of salvation, **Harold** felt **called to preach**—enrolled in Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, at Louisville, KY, 300 miles north, where he graduated with a Master of Divinity in 1956. **December was his month**: he was **ordained,19 Dec. 1955**, by the Lynn Acres Baptist Church of Louisville, KY. He served as pastor of Pine Bower Baptist, Cedartown, GA, from 1955-1957, and of Paden Baptist, East Gadsden, AL, for 24 years, from 1957 to 1981.

He was Moderator of the Etowah, AL, Baptist Association, President of a Pastors Conference, Director and Teacher for Samford Univ. Extension Service in Gadsden and Anniston,

AL. He was the General Chairman for northern AL of the Billy Graham Crusade in 1972.

Harold's interest in Missions, led to being Director of Missions for the Calhoun, AL, Baptist Association for 8 years, 1981-1989 and Executive Director of Missions for the Madison, AL, Baptist Association for 11 years, 1989 to 2000, on the State Mission Board, and Director of Missions of the Year in 1997. Judson College(AL) awarded him a **Doctor of Divinity degree**.

He literally **reached out and touched the world** when he traveled to, visited, encouraged, and reported back, the work and challenges of Baptist ministry, **preaching in 250 churches in 11 states, in 28 countries on 4 continents, meeting and fellowshipping with over 300 missionaries.** They retired to Huntsville, AL, and celebrated 50th wedding anniversary. 3.g. DR. CHARLES HOWARD CHANDLER

Harold's brother, Charles, was born, 26 July 1935, at Cedartown, Polk County, in western GA, but they moved to eastern AL when he was 11 where he finished growing up. He had chores to do, too, a job if he could find one. Times were tough, but one had to be grateful they were not living in Europe where Hitler was beginning to devastate millions of people.

He was a quick study also, graduating from Jacksonville High School, AL, in 1953. It only took him 3 1/2 years to earn a BA/Mathematics at Samford Univ(was Howard College), graduating in 1957. That was his golden opportunity to marry **Betty Lou Horton**, March 1957.

His father's life and admonition, impressed **Charles** as well. He moved north to the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, KY earning 3 degrees: MA/Divinity, 1961, MA/Religious Education, 1964, and Ph.D/Ministry, 1974.

His heart was in Pastoral Ministry. Dr. Charles served 7 churches in 41 years ² and was active in his community and denomination. He served on HUD Committees, Chamber of Commerce, Rotary, worked with developmentally delayed persons in IL..

He served two terms as president of IL Baptist State Association 1984-86, was on the KY Baptist Child Care Board, 1968-71, the Friends of New Churches Board of Directors, Knoxville, TN, 1995-99, and Fork Union, VA, Military Academy Board of Trustees, 1993-2001. He was an adjunct professor and field supervisor for a Doctor of Ministry degree program at Louisville, KY, Baptist Seminary, on the board of the Ministry Renewal Center, North Haledon, NJ.

He wrote for radio and television programs and the religion section of several local newspapers, for Baptist periodicals and scholarly journals. He is the author of *The Deacon Family Ministry Plan that Really Works*, 1981, *Preaching from Prairie Pulpits*, 1985, *Minister's Support Group:Alternative to Burnout*, 1987, and *Leadership Manual: Healthy Transitions Wellness Retreat for Ministers and Spouses*, 1999. Dr. B. GLENN CHANDLER

Glenn, the middle son, was born, 18 May 1940, Cedartown, Polk County, GA. What fun for Gordon and Kathleen to keep 5 precocious boys out of mischief!!!.

Glenn enjoyed music. After graduation from high school, he earned a BA/Music Education in Voice at Samford Univ., Birmingham, AL, 1962; he taught public school music ,1962-3.

But Glenn's interest in music was not shallow or a means to a paycheck. He soon obtained a MA/Church Music at Southern Seminary, Louisville, KY, with a major in Piano. He was Director of Choral Activities/First Baptist Church of Alexander City, AL, 1965-1969. Next, was a PhD/Music Theory, with minors in Music History and Choral Conducting, Indiana University, IN. His dissertation critiqued a French music treatise¹.

In 1972 he was Assistant Professor of Music at Central CT State Univ., New Britain, CT, where he enjoyed teaching for 22 years, 1972-1994. DR. JERRY WAYNE CHANDLER

Jerry was born, 24 Dec. 1946, in Rome, western GA(the only one of the five brothers who was born in a hospital). **Gordon and Kathleen** took their family to eastern AL, Anniston, where he grew up with his brothers.

GERALD WALLACE CHANDLER

Gerald was born, 28 April 1948, Cherokee, AL, the year his oldest brother graduated from high school. He had 3 older brothers to boss him around, play tricks on him, and give him unwanted advice. World War II was over——the Korean War was 2 years away.

Like his brothers high school wasn't that great a challenge; he was quick with numbers and ideas. About 1970, Gerald graduated from Samford U/Birmingham, AL, earning a BS/Finance and Insurance, with two minors, Music and Economics.

But grad school was boring; he decided business was his forte'. With the buoyancy of youth, he jumped right in aiming to make a difference. He had not grown up in tough times as his father and brothers had, but he had seen first hand, how illness could devastate the poor, and not so poor. His brother, **Dr.Jerry**, was tackling that problem on the medical level; his father, and brother, **Charles**, on a spiritual level, brother, **Harold**, on a world level; his brother, **Glenn**, was lifting hearts through music. **Gerald** aimed to be practical ---deal with the health provider system---i.e. touch, not just one person at a time, but the whole 300, 000,000 in the US who need a decent health plan!

Big job, little brother!!!

He didn't waste time; he started at the top; about 1995, he founded his own company, Chandler and Associates, Inc., as Health Services Consultants for profit and nonprofit groups. He was Chairman and CEO until 1997. He is now Chairman of the Board and CEO of PROWEH Health Systems, Inc.—— which finances health care service (market driven) through Medical Savings Accounts.

He is a member of several Research Organizations——think tanks——co-authoring analytical public information: NCPA (Nat'l Center of Poly Analysis); CATO Institute, etc.

OLDER BROTHER TIMOTHY CHANDLER

(1686-1758; Robert, Robert, John)

Timothy also reached out to touch our world. He married, Justine Woolfolk and had 3 sons: Rev. Richard Woolfolk, Joseph and Robert Chandler in Caroline County, VA, where he had first settled when they came north from New Kent, VA.

Son, Rev. Richard W. had 6 children including a Timothy, (1761-1831) who married, Lucy Temple. Their sons Sam and LeRoy had active sons:

REUBEN GRIGSBY CHANDLER (1852-1903)

(Dr. Sam, Joseph, TIM)

Dr. Samuel Temple Chandler inherited enough money to finance his medical education. He married, his first cousin, **Lucy Chandler** and they had 5 youngsters.

His son, Norbonne E. married, Lucy Grigsby and had 12 children. It's safe to say son, Reuben Grigsby Chandler, was educated at VMI, was a quick study. He went to Chicago, IL, in 1875 where he founded, Hulford, Warren & Chandler, Stock Brokers and Common Merchants. By 1903 he was President of the Chicago Board of Trade.

CHARLES QUARLES CHANDLER (LeRoy, Joseph, TIM)

LeRoy Chandler. (1795-1870) lived in Bowling Green, Caroline, VA; he moved to Glen Burnie, MD, married, moved to Louisa, VA; married, second, Sarah Ann Quarles. He was sure his fortune was in the Far West(MO), and off they went with their 12 children. Sarah kept a diary of the trip and was NOT impressed at all; they had 6 more children.

Son, **Dr. Charles Quaries Chandler**, was so unhappy, it hurt; he wanted to go to school in VA and be a Dr. like his grandfathers; back he went, but returned to MO to marry and practice.

His son, Charles Quaries Chandler, II, got the crazy idea that banks should be like real people. He bought up wobbly banks, put them on a solid basis, and made them user friendly and community relevant. This bank served up breakfast in the foyer to 4-H families on County Fair Days because the bank president saw them going off for the day without any----not as some gimmick. Now that is reaching out !! Chandler banks of KS celebrated their 150th anniversary recently. Descendant, Paul Terry Chandler, is a CFA member.

ROBERT CHANDLER (TIMOTHY)

It was **Timothy's** son, **Robert**, who was jailed for listening to Baptist, **Rev. Burrus** in Caroline County, VA. Descendants of these Chandlers are still there 130 years later. **Robert** bought land in Orange County, VA, but sold it. His son, **William**, (1744-1821), married, **Nancy Ann Coleman**; they had 4 children, one named after her father: **Thomas Coleman Chandler**.

Thomas built a small estate, named *Fairfield*, near Guinea railroad station, Caroline, VA. a Civil War battle was fought there in which **Gen. Stonewall Jackson** was wounded, and taken to their house where he died.

Thomas' daughter, **Mildred, married George Washington**, a nephew of the **President**. They raised their family in Bowling Green, Caroline, VA. Son, **John Washington**, became a lawyer and joined a cadre of lawyers who practiced there for 25 years.

JULIAN ALVIN CARROLL CHANDLER (1872-1934)

(Dr. Joseph A., Tom C., William, Robert, TIM)

Mildred's brother, Dr. Joseph Alsopp Chandler, had only 2 children. Son, Julian Alvin Carroll Chandler had a very, long reach. His father noticed his quick mind and wanted

him to go into medicine, but Julian preferred a Ph.D in Education. He graduated from William and Mary College at Williamsburg, VA, with a Masters at 19 years old, having spent some of that time assisting a Professor. He enrolled at John's Hopkins U. on a work-study for his doctorate. The "work" part was being Dean of Morgan College and editing manuscripts for Silver-Burdette Publishers. This young man with a Ph.D became acting President of Richmond, VA, Women's College, Prof. Of History and Literature, and Dean of English.

By 1904 his loving wife, his brother and father had died. He went to New York City to be full-time editor of Silver-Burdette. He went back to Williamsburg to be the Director of History and Education at the Jamestown Exhibition of 1907 (the 300th year----400th comes in 2007) at a salary of \$4500. They built 3 replicas of the tiny boats Cpt. John Smith used to come there from England in 1607, and allowed tourists to board them to get a real feel for that trip. However, he was not happy with the touristy effect----there were a great number of difficulties.

When he was offered the **Superintendency of Richmond, VA, City schools**, it was a task worthy of a miracle maker. The enrollment had doubled, but the 40-year old buildings were decrepit and understaffed. First, he personally inspected and assessed the situation. Two years after he took the job he presented a detailed plan and a staggering \$600,000 budget for upgrades, new schools, equipment for both black and white. He started a Jr. High system, added vocational schools and business training, classes for the retarded, open-air classes for the anemic, curriculum changes, smaller classes, better teacher certification and salaries, which actually took millions of dollars. And got support to do it.

The trustees of William and Mary College asked him to be President from 1919-1934. It was very small after the 30,000-student Richmond schools, but he had dreamed of being President there since he first attended. The trustees passed a \$1,000,000 endowment, plus working fund, unanimously. In 14 years he rebuilt, rejuvenated, and expanded the campus and it's outreach. Walking through the tall white columns of William and Mary College, down the streets of decrepit Williamsburg where so much of Virginia and the nation's decisive early history were worked out, Julian became a prime mover in the Project funded by the Rockerfeller Foundation to restore our nations' historical birthplace. With Julian on the committee, was his son, Alvin Duke Chandler. Dr. Swem came, founded/edited the historical, William and Mary Quarterly. Today we can do the same, see costumed people doing tasks as they did them then, visit the council chamber where Patrick Henry made his impassioned, Give me Liberty or give me Death, speech, stay in the inn restored even down to the wallpaper.

The land for the college was set aside from the very first; to our **John** of 1610 it was just a dream, but his descendants have attended there and been it's president.

REAR ADMIRAL/ PRES. ALVIN DUKE CHANDLER (1902-1986

(Julian AC, Dr. Joseph A., Thomas, William, Robert, TIMOTHY)

Alvin was born, in 1902, in Richmond when his father was Sup't.of the Schools. He was accepted at Annapolis, joined the Marines, ascended to Vice Admiral of the Fleet, commanding a destroyer squadron in World War II in the Pacific. The destroyer, *Chandler*, is named for him. He graduated from Imperial Defense College, London, Eng., 1950. He became a lawyer, was Pres. of Ed. Board, Jamestown Fdtn., followed his father a Pres. of William and Mary College, 1951-1960, expanding the curriculum with pre-law, pre-engineering, etc. He wrote *The Official Guide to Williamsburg*, 1985, which you don't want to be without when you go.

Plans are being made to have a CFA Reunion at Williamsburg, VA, and the area where our first **John Chandler** lived 2004-2005?? New member, **John Hopkins**, grew up there.

HOORAY !!!! THE GENEALOGICAL KNOT HAS BEEN UNTIED

Two <u>Descendants</u> responded to the OCT. Newsletter Chart on page 16 with corrections to the information which enables us to until that knot. !!!

(Please forgive me: I just had cataract surgery on one eye, and I can't see well enough to redo the chart here: Take the following and redo your old chart, please: <u>underlines</u> mean corrections).

The Hite Story: (There is still more to this story that we don't know).

In 1756 Jost Hite and Christian Neuschwanger bought, and successfully settled, 100,000 acres from Lord Granville for a settlement ("Wachovia") of evangelical Protestants called, Moravians. When the spouses of Jost Hite and Maria Magdelena Herr Neuschwanger died in the same year, they married each other and had 11 children. Maria was the 6th great grandmother of Vera Chandler Black on her mother's side.

The area became Stokes County in 1789, the south half of Surry County, NC. Land records, however, are still in Halifax county, VA, because it stretched 200 miles to the Blue Ridge Mts. then with an unsettled VA/NC border. The Salem in Winston-Salem, NC, was Moravian. When Indians killed <u>Jacob Hite</u>, Shadrack Chandler (son of Joel, son of JOSEPH Branch), who lived in that area, helped chase and capture them.

The Richard Chandler Story: These are all from JOSEPH Branch of John of 1610.

Joseph Chandler's son, <u>John, md, Elizabeth</u>; their son, <u>Richard</u>, md. Elizabeth Carter, who had <u>Richard Carter, Sr.//Sarah Eades, and Richard Carter Jr.</u>

Joseph Chandler's son, William, married, Delitia Cox Dobbins; their son Richard, md Sarah, whose son William md. Polly Harris, and had a son, Thompson.

William and Delitia's son, William, Jr. had a son <u>Richard</u> who md. Charity Parks.

This makes <u>5 Richard Chandlers</u> in this area at this time to get mixed up with <u>Richard Henry Chandler</u>, Sr., and Jr. and the <u>3 Richard Arringtons</u>]

The Samuel Edward Chandler Story: Descendant, Dorothy Moore, gave his parents.

5. Samuel Edward Chandler. (*(<u>Joel//Hannah Davis, David//Mildred Vaughan, David//Mary Stovall, JOELL, Robert, Robert, John)</u>. Born, circa 1822, Granville, SC. His great grandparents, <u>David and Mary</u>, are first cousins of <u>David and Mary</u> on the chart—not the same.

He married, 23 Nov. 1840, <u>Martha Hite</u>, daughter of *Vincent Hite & Mary Wellborn¹, in Mecklenberg, VA. They were the parents of:

- i. Prudence Chandler. Born, 29 Feb. 1841, Mecklenberg, VA.
- i. Nancy Ann Chandler. Born, 24 July 1844, Mecklenberg, VA.
- ii. Judith Chandler. Born, 1847, Mecklenberg, VA.
- iii. Rebecca Greenfield Chandler. Born, 18 July 1850, Mecklenberg, VA., who married, 18 Dec. 1870, Richard Henry Chandler. of Halifax, VA, a 4th cousin, (descendants of WILLIAM & JOELL Branches of John 1610).
- iv. John Edward Chandler. Born, 22 April 1858, Mecklenberg, VA.
- v. Cornelia Chandler. Born, 7 Dec. 1859, Mecklenberg, VA.
- vi. Joel Chandler, Born, 1861, Mecklenberg, VA.

So, Richard H. Chandler(22) and Rebecca G. Chandler(20) were 4th cousins, once removed.

¹Descendant, **Dorothy Moore**, said when **Hite** researchers checked DNA, they did NOT come out as related. Possibly, **Vera Black's** information could change that. More research needed.

SIGNIFICANT RESEARCH PROJECTS OF 2002

- 1. **Joe Barron Chandler, Jr.** published 5 articles on his line(John, Robert, John, John) in the genealogical journal, *Tidewater Virginia Families*. He established these generations of our John of 1610 with well-researched, fully supported text, which can be a reference for others.
- 2. **Joseph Chandler and Anna Jessop** Thanks to **Vera Black** and others, this appears to be solved. It has always been assumed that this **Joseph** was a Quaker, perhaps part of the Quaker Chandlers from PA or the Quaker Jacob of Quaker Meadows north of Kings' Mt, NC, but Quaker records show that he was definitely **NOT** a Quaker until he married, **Anna**.

Then, the proximity, circumstances and evidence shows that he must be the son of David, Jr, grandson of David, great grandson of William and Delisha of the Joseph line, since the 2 Davids and Joseph were adjacent before they left NC and show up in Hendricks, IN, together with Anna and their children.

- 3. As you can see from page 15, this has been the year of the *Richards*——5 of them in **William and Delisha's** family alone !!! We didn't know the name *Richard* was so popular, especially, without any apparent reason. At any rate, it appears we have found where they all fit———— so far no clues to the contrary. The evidence is specific and circumstantial, but not absolute proof. Which means, confidence is in order, not dejection.
- 4. We have been able to help **several new members** find their relatives this year. Welcome! And share your finds and photos with us.

DID YOU KNOW By Jim Reeves



About 8 or 10 years ago, out of the blue, I received a phone call from New York, from **Howard and Annamae**, who were on their way from Seattle, WA, to Europe. They were at the home of Howard's niece, **Eileen Spataro**, on Long Island, and wanted to know if I would mail one of my Chandler Books there, so they could pick it up on their way back home.

Howard turned out to be both a relative and a friend with similar interests.. We enjoyed several CFA reunions together. When the 9/11 twin tower disaster happened in New York cancelling all flights in the US, Howard had airline tickets to the 14 & 15 Spt. 2001 CFA Reunion in Longview, TX. He had the Lamb Award in Scouting and spent many good times with the Boy Scouts of his church. (Note: The picture was taken at work at IBM, in 1976, when son, **Dr. Chris Chandler** climbed Mt. Everest, the 7th American to do so.)
