

Charter granted March 24th 1663 to Proprietors : EARLIER SOME SETTLERS HAD COME FROM VIRGINIA, and in August 16th 1663, some Barbadoes men came with Sir John Yeamans of Barbadoes, and tracts of land were granted them, this was about 1670 and also amaxh about the same time some settlers came from England.

Lord Shaftsbury, was one of eight proprietors of South Carolina.

Expedition from England came in 1670 Via Barbadoes to Port Royal, S.C., but did not stay there but went to what is now "Charleston", S.C., Port Royal was too near the Spaniards.

In 1682 Indians reded land to English on St Helena, S.C.

Gov. West, was Governor of South Carolina

Wm Saxby, Senatory to proprietors was mentioned as having charge of Indian trading

(I have found in the Boston, Mass., Library, Book "London Marriage Licenses" No. 271-B.)

1. John Chaplin, (Chaplyn) of St Mary Whitechapel, (widower) 50, and Anne Skinner, (widow, 30,) were married at St Lencard, Bromly, on January 25th 1647.

(I believe that the above John Chaplin, was the Son of Issac and Mary Chaplin, that came to America, with his Mother in 1622, married 1635, mover to Talbot County, later returned to England, (1st wife died,) he remarried, Anne Skinner, 2nd wife and returned to America with his wife and was deeded land on James Isl, S.C. (140 acres) Jan 25 1678.

Next we find John Chaplin, testifying before a council that he had been among the Indians with whom the Spaniards were tampering with, and had personally seen arms delivered to the Yamassees.

We later find (a) John Chaplin, (whom I believe to be) the Son of the above John Chaplin and Anne Chaplin of James Isl, S.C. (on St Helena, Isl, S.C., settled there and married to Phebe Waite (daughter of Jacob Waite)
