1 Sir Robert Chaplin, descended  
from Sir Francis Chaplin, 11<sup>th</sup>  
alderman of London, living in  
time of Chas II, represented the  
borough of Great Grimsby in  
parliament, and was  
created a Baronet in 1715.

Engaging in the South Sea  
scheme in 1720 - Sir Robert  
became a director of the  
Company and was involved  
in the losses of that  
calamitous enterprise.
