

Will of William Chaplin
of John's Island, S. C. Nov. 5, 1820.
Wife, Mary Chaplin, whose
Father was Richard Freeman, &
all property left to wife until
children come of age. Then as
they come of age each gets his
share, except the plantation,
which shall be wife Mary's
home until her decease. Only
child's name mentioned is
William W. Chaplin. In the
event all his children die
without issue, then their
portions go to two nephews,
John & Joseph Trumbull.

Will of John Chaplin, Jr. of
South Carolina, Charleston County
& St Helena Parish Planter.
Feb. 27, 1776. Son John Chaplin
given tract of land on Port Royal
Island lying on James Creek.

my brother John Chaplin Executor.

Will of Sarah Chaplin of
Island of St. Helena in Gran-
ville County, S. C. Oct. 31, 1764.
Give my daughter Ellina
Chaplin, now the wife of
Benjamin Chaplin. Ann
Chaplin, daughter of Benj.
and Ellina ~~Chaplin~~. My daughter,
Elizabeth Chaplin. Give
and Youngers my side saddle
& one cow & calf. My son
Thomas Chaplin. Son William
Chaplin tract of land on St.
Helena's Isl. - 300 acres. bounding
on S. W. on lands of Caleb Tomer.
Daughter Sarah Chaplin.
Executors my loving brothers,
John Barnwell, John Chaplin,
& son Benjamin Chaplin.

said tract of land given to
Brother William Chaplin.

Will of Benjamin Chaplin,
South Carolina, Granville
County, St. Helena Parish.
Dec. 21, 1766. I, Benj. Chaplin of
Port Royal Island Planter,
bequeath to my son, Benjamin
250 acres land across this
tract next to Col. Heywards
land. Should he die with out
heirs, give said 250 acres to
my son William. Give my
son John all the rest of my
land. Wife, Elioner. Five
children - John, Sarah, Ann,
Benjamin & William. I appoint
