CLARK, LIGHTFOOT, & RIFFLE: HIRAM CLARK AND ALL THAT FOLLOW From family history by Nancy Bias Grotzinger, 1201 Hamlet Dr., Blue Springs, MO 64014 (1994)

Nancy dedicates her family history to "daughters Kristine and [Jill] Grotzinger and all grandchildren to come. May you always seek your future and honor your past."

Hiram Clark, Nancy's earliest known Clark ancestor, was born in Pennsylvania in 1820. He married Emma (maiden name unknown), who as born in Ohio in 1831. Emma's father was a native of Ireland; her mother, of Pennsylvania.

Hiram came to Fulton County, Ohio, in 1835 with his brother Cyrus. In 1843, he sold to Thomas Watkins the land on which he had settled in 1835. By March 20, 1852, he owned land in Flatrock Township.

Although unable to read or write, Hiram was a carpenter and later a gunsmith. Family tradition states that he helped design and build the Gatling Gun. Also, it is said that he was related to William Clark of the Lewis & Clark Expedition.

Hiram served as a private in Company F, 68th Ohio Infantry, during the Civil War. He is buried in Florida Village Cemetery, Florida, Ohio (no dates on marker).



IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN. Robert Clark Senr of Southwark Parish in Surry County his Last Will and Testament being very Sick and weak but in perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the Same and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, and after that to Judgment and therefore I committ and distribuit my worldly Estate for which it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me withall in this Live therefore I commit my body to the ground and recommend my Soul unto God that gave it

Item I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Samuel Clark two hundred Acres of Land the plantation and both the plantation whereon wee now live with all Houses, Orchards, Woods, Ways, Underwoods, Waters and Water Courses and all Appurtenances thereunto belonging for Ever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Sledge one Cow and Calf and two pewter dishes.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Muselwhite one Cow & Calf and two pewter dishes.

I Give and bequeath unto my well beloved Son Samuel Clark all my goods and Chattells moveable and immoveable with the plantation with every part and parcel thereof thereon to belonging In Consideration that the said Samuel Clark is to keep and maintain his said Mother that is Robert Clarks Lawfull wife and to keep her well in Cloaths and all things Necessary as long as She shall live and then the said Son Samuel Clark to possess and enjoy all the Singular every part and parcel thereof to me now belonging and to pay all and receive all the Debts Dues and Demands. I Likewise appoint Constitute make and Ordain my Son Samuel Clark Senr (?) Lawfull Executor of this my Last Will and Testament and likewise to bury me with a Christian like burial and and (sic) to pay all funerall Charges As Witness my hand this 17 day of February 1723

GENERAL ELIJAH CLARK

An excerpt from <u>Clark Clues</u>, p. 31, on file in North Carolina State Library

"General Elijah Clark, born in VA, 1733, married Hannah Harrington in Virginia and settled first in North Carolina, just over the Virginia line. He lived there until the Indians burned his cabin and possessions. He gathered up his family--son John C. Clark, daughter Polly, and wife, Hannah--and on horseback came to Georgia and settled on the south side of Broad River and Long in 1772 Creek in Wilkes County. He and his family are buried in the Elijah Clark Memorial Park, created in Georgia in his honor. Georgia gave him a large plantation, and North Carolina gave a \$30,000 gratuity for his military service. After the Revolution, he was Major General of the Georgia Militia. The fact that General Elijah Clark and his family settled on one side of Broad River and Christopher Clark and his family on the other side of the river is 'proof to many that they were related families' - both families were from Virginia, etc. . . WILLIAM G. CLARK OF CHAMPAIGN CO, ILLINOIS From a typescript copy in Urbana Public Library; Contributed by Lisa Clark Young of Champaign, IL

William G. Clark was born the 12th of August, 1819, in Clark Co., Ohio, the son of William and Mary Catherine (Ziglar) Clark. "Uncle Billy," as William G. came to be known, died in St. Joseph, Illinois, on the 9th of May, 1907. He came to Champaign County in 1840 as a young man, then returned to Ohio to marry his bride, Juliet Amanda Robinson. They were married the 7th of August, 1841, in Clark County, Ohio. Juliet, born the 4th of November, 1822, in Virginia, died July 20, 1894, in Champaign County. She was the daughter of Leonard and Mary (Foley) Robinson. William G. and Juliet worked hard to acquire a great deal of land and were able to give each of their children a good start in life.

Eleven children were born to William G. and Juliet:

- 1) Frances, b. 4 Nov 1842 (the only child b. in OH); d. 13 May 1875; m. John M. Swearingen on 27 Mar 1862. Three of Frances's five children were living at her death.
- 2) Walter, b. near Homer, IL, 8 Sep 1844; d. Feb 1920 in Kansas City, KS; m. Mary Elizabeth Price 13 Sep 1866. Walter was a Methodist Episcopal minister in 1879.
- 3) Fulton, b. and d. April 1847.
- 4) Helen, b. 10 Jan 1849; d. 10 Apr 1872 near Homer; m. William T. Long 16 Dec 1868. William served in Co. F, IL Infantry in Civil War.

- 5) Phidelia, d. May 1850, having lived only a few months.
- 6) Cornelia, b. 3 Aug 1850; d. 31 Dec 1936 in Champaign, IL; m. 1st Joseph S. Saunders 3 Aug 1871. Joseph d. 1 Dec 1911, and Cornelia m. 2nd Alonzo M. Terwilliger.
- 7) Harvey, b. 30 Aug 1853; d. 25 Dec 1938 in Orange, CA; m. Margaret Eliza "Lide" Price 1 Jan 1877.
- 8) Thornton, b. 12 Apr 1856; d. 2 Oct 1947; m. Mary Corray 7 Jan 1877. Thornton was also a Methodist Episcopal minister, licensed 6 Jun 1885. Later he became a Republican state legislator in Oklahoma. He retired in Anna, IL, and became mayor there at age 75.
- 9) Louisa ("Lide"), b. 22 Sep 1858; d. 26 Mar 1956 in Lebo, KS; m. Chris C. Coble 4 Mar 1877.
- 10) Isabel, b. 13 Nov 1860; d. 16 Mar 1951 in Homer, IL;
 m. John A. Gibson 6 Jul 1877.
- 11) George, b. 27 Nov 1863 near Homer; d. 27 Jan 1940 in Rantoul, IL; m. Louise Whetstone 13 Dec 1882. George and Louise rem. to St. Joseph, where George was a baker. Later he worked in a hardware store in Champaign.

OUAKER RECORDS

Research in early Quaker records has proven quite helpful to many Clark researchers. The following is excerpted from Encyclopedia of American Quaker Genealogy, by William Wade Hinshaw, and includes early Clarks from Pasquotank Monthly Meeting (later Symons Creek Monthly Meeting). Have you discovered this valuable resource?

- 10/12-16/1709--Mary Clark liberated to marry Joseph Glaistor, from MM in VA.
- 10/18/1780--Micajah Clark (Clerk), of the Narrows, requested to come under care of meeting.
- 4/17/1782--Micajah Clark and ch., Sarah, Mark, Mary and Zodoc, received by request.
- 6/19/1782--Ephraim Clark received by request of father, Micajah Clark.
- 10/16/1782 Micajah Clark requested certificate to the West Indies (cert not granted because vessel on which he intended to sail carried guns for defense).
- 12/18/1782--Martha Clark requested to come under care of meeting. 9/17/1782--Martha Clark received by request (under care of meeting for some time).
- 8/17/1785--Martha Clark reported in care of mtg.
- 3/17/1787--Martha Clark being in care of mtg, friends to assist in having two of her ch bound out.
- 4/21/1787--Mark Clark, minor, son of Micajah Clark, dec, granted certificate to Center MM (rem by his master).
- 6/16/1787--Silvanus Clark, of Narrows, requested to come under care of meeting.
- 11/15/1788--Silvanus Clark received by request.
- 1/16/1789--Sarah Clark disowned.
- 9/17/1791--Martha Clark and her sister, Tamer Overman, disowned.
- 2/21/1801--Ephraim Clark (Clerk) disowned quarreling and offering to fight.
- 3/21/1801-Ephraim Clark (Clerk) reported gone to sea and could not be advised of the action of MM.
