OF THE CLARK FAMILY. MRS. ESTHER (FOY) JENKINS AND HER BROTHER
HENRY BOWMAN FOY, ALWAYS CLAIMED THAT THEIR CLARK FAMILY
CAME FROM VIRGINIA. WHEN I STARTED ON THEIR FAMILY I GOT
MRS. STANLEY TO CHECK THE CLARK FAMILY AND, FOUND NO CONNECTION
WITH SOUTH CAROLINA. YOU GAVE ME LATER ON QUITE A LOT OF
CLARK DATA BUT I COULD NOT FIND ANY CONNECTION AT THAT TIME

AFTER MRS. JENKINS DEATH I FOUND SOME LETTERS FROM
MR. CHARLES A. BOWMAN, OF NEWBERRY, S.C. SIGNED: "COUSIN CHARLES".
THEY WERE PROBABLY TRYING TO GET SOME FAMILY DATA, HE
MENTIONED THAT HIS GRAND-MOTHER BOWMAN USED TO TELL HIM ABOUT
"UNCLE CLARK" (MRS. JENKINS' ANCESTOR) HIS GRAND-MOTHER WAS AN
ADAMS. IN THE DATA YOU GAVE ME, SCHM. VOL. 23, P. 44 = IS:

JAMES CLARK MARRIED ELIZABETH GRIMBLE, DAU. OF JOSHUA
GRIMBLE, OF EDISTO ISLAND BEFORE APRIL 2, 1767. etc

YOU ALSO GAVE A COPY OF HIS WIFE; AND LIST OF HIS CHILDREN.
I HAVE A COPY OF THE GRIMBLE HISTORY WHICH I HAVE BEEN READING
RECENTLY, AND HAVE COME TO THE CONCLUSION THAT JAMES AND ELIZABETH
(GRIMBLE) CLARK WERE MRS. JENKINS' ANCESTORS. THE NAME "ELIZABETH",
SEEMS TO HAVE GONE THROUGH THE CLARK FAMILY: THE FIRST MENTION OF
THE NAME WAS WHEN THOMAS GRIMBLE, SON OF PAUL GRIMBLE AND HIS

Wife Mary) Married before 1707, Elizabeth Adams, d2d, of

William Adams. (See MXXIV No. 1, Jan 1922)

"Thomas Grimmett was the ancestor of all the Grimmetts
of the name in S.C."

CORK - GRIMBEE - ADAMS

Part I

Paul Grimbbee, an English merchant, came to the province of South Carolina in Feb. 1682. He and his wife Mary Grimbbee, lived on Edisto Island, Colleton County. They had three daughters and two sons. (1)

Thomas Grimbbee, the youngest child of Paul and Mary Grimbbee, became the ancestor of all the Grimbbees of the name in South Carolina. He married first before 1707, Elizabeth, dau. of William Adams. They had four children:

I. Paul Grimbbee (b c 1700 d c 1749/50)

II. Thomas Grimbbee (d after 1783)

III. Joshua Grimbbee (d 1757)

IV. Isaac Grimbbee (d 1752)

Joshua Grimbbee (d 1757) was a planter on Edisto Island, 2nd member of the Baptist Church, he married at least twice. There is no record of his first wife. He and his first wife had five children.

I. Sarah Grimbbee (1738-1757) m^r. William Maxwelle, they had one child Sarah.

II. Paul Grimbbee (died before Feb. 9, 1757) m^r. ANN JUNKINS

III. Joshua Grimbbee (b 1744) m^r. 1765, HANNAH RIPPON, widow

IV. Mary Grimbbee (b 1742 or earlier, m^r. BENJAMIN JUNKINS

V. Elizabeth Grimbbee married James Cork. "See Cork?"

James Clark () he married before April 2, 1767

Elizabeth Grimblee, when she receipts for her share of her Father's Estate as the wife of James Clark. James and Elizabeth (Grimblee) Clark had issue:

NOTE = I think the above pertains to Elizabeth (Grimbley) C Park, who apparently moved to Beaufort and became a member of St. Helena church. The dates seem to fit in.

Note James Clark's wife evidently died in Child Birth as they
 had another daughter, "Eppin Clark" who later lived with
 Sister Elizabeth (Clark) Fay, Mrs Jenkins' mother, and often
 heard Mrs Jenkins speak of her "Aunt Eppin".

The U.S. 1850 CENSUS shows Esther Fay age 52 born England

and her son William Fay age 18, William later married Elizabeth

Clark. They were Mrs Jenkins' parents

Elizabeth Park (1834 d. 6 March 1888, b. St. Helena's churchyard)

The daughter of James S. Park (b c 1812 d.) Married

William Bernard Foy (b 1832, n.s.c. d. May 1866) The son of William B. Foy and his wife Esther (Robertson) Foy. They had five children:

I William Foy (b 1855 d Aug. 21, 1867)

II Charles Edward Foy (b d 7 Mar.

Oct. 5, 1886, Jane Bostick (b d) the

dau. of Benjamin Bostick.

III. Esther Mary Foy (b June 30, 1861 d June 6, 1936)

Mrs. John 21, 1880, Robert Emmett Jenkins,

(b Jan. 9, 1852 d Oct. 19, 1902, Beaufort, SC both buried

in St. Helena's churchyard.) Note Mr. Jenkins was

the son of Capt. Adam Hubley Jenkins and
his wife, Margaret (Glover) Jenkins.
