4 June 1755.

49 & p 51 Sophia, widow of George CLARK married 5 Dec. 1756, Henry Toomer

Note, SCHM Vol. 23 No. 4, Oct. 1922 p. 190 has "Toomer, Henry, of The Hookout."

This may give a clue later. (3).

Note William E. Clark, is the "Edward" Clark shown in the 1850  
Census and brother of Eliza Clark who married William Foy.

If you note - There is a James Clark listed in the 1790; 1800 and  
1850 census, however that does not prove anything. Mrs. Jenkins

has often mentioned that she was a descendant of the Clarks of Va.

The Encyclopedia Americana Vol 7, pp 41 & 44 gives George Rogers (b 19 Nov.  
1752 d. 13 Feb. 1818,

William Clark, b 1 August 1770 d. Sep. 1, 1838.

Did "The Big Knives" by Bruce Lancaster, give any personal data  
on George Rogers Clark? I found 2 articles on William Clark in  
our library here giving children - dates etc, they were too young  
to have been Mrs Jenkins grandparent, or great-grandparent

JOHN CLARK married ELIZABETH BOWMAN, wid. 10 Sept. 1743.

Note Although the names above fit in to a certain extent I do not think they are related to Mrs Jenkins family. I believe that her CLARK ~~Bowman~~ connection was through the distaff side of the family either Crayford or Adams, however I could be mistaken. JOHN CLARK may have lived in Bft district and ELIZ. BOWMAN in St. Andrews. It is a pity that so many records omit the woman's maiden name.

I have heard Mrs Jenkins mention that she was related to the BOWMANS - HENERYS (HENERAY) - DESZUSSURES and ARMSTRONGS. FRANK DESZUSSURE of GREENVILLE (now deceased) was about Heyward's age and visited us in Bft. was also a member of the real estate here in Grenada. They asked Heyward to be their lawyer of the firm. That was in the early 1920's. He and Mrs JENKINS used to discuss the family but unfortunately I paid no attention.
