Be it remembered that on the Fifth day of February, A. D. 1908, the Executor named in the last Will and Testament of George P. Cole, late of the Borough of Sussex, in the County of Sussex, deceased, appeared before the Surrogate of the County of Sussex, and made application to have the said Will proved; and on such application said Surrogate adjudged the said Will to be a valid Will, and the proof thereof to be sufficient, which said last Will and Testament, and the proof thereof, are as follows, that is to say:

IN THE NAME OF GOD AMEN,

I, George P. Cole, of the borough of Sussex, in the county of Sussex and State of New Jersey, of of full age and being of sound mind and memory, and aware of the uncertainty of this frail and transitory life, do hereby make, ordain, publish, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner following: that is to say

First; I order and direct my executor hereinafter named to pay all my testamentary and just debts as soon as may be after my decease

Second; I give devise and bequeath all the real estate and personal property of which I may die seized, no matter of what kind or nature, to be converted into money as soon as may be after my decease from which to pay my said debts and testamentary expenses by my said executor, and

Third, in order that he may fully and completely do the same I do hereby authorize and empower my executor hereinafter named to sell and convey by a good and sufficient deed of conveyance any and all real estate of which I may die seized, and

Fourth, I hereby order and direct my said executor as soon as he has all my property of any kind or nature in money in his hands, and has fully satisfied and paid all the said testamentary debts and other debts if any,

Fifth, to divide the balance of all the monies in his hands into two equal parts, and I,

Sixth, hereby give devise and bequeath all the said balance of my estate to my sister, Mrs. Mary E. S. Coykendall, and to my brother, Asa R. Cole, both of Strawberry Point in the State of Iowa, "share and share alike" and I hereby order and direct my executor hereinafter named to pay to my said brother one of the equal parts or halves of the same in his hands, and to my said sister the other part or equal half of the said estate, to be their and each of their sole properties forever.

Seventh, I hereby nominate and appoint my friend, Dr. Edward C. Tuttle, of the borough

of Sussex in the county of Sussex and State of New Jersey, to be the executor of this my last will and testament

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal hereby revoking and declaring void all former wills by me made, this nineteenth day of December one thousand nine hundred and seven.
