HE FOUGHT IN THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR AND RECEIVED A GRANT OF LAND IN BURKE COUNTY, GEORGIA, IN 1784. HE LATER MOVED TO DUBLIN, GEORGIA IN 1804.

A DAUGHTER, ELIZABETH, MARRIED HENRY CANDLER FUQUA, SR. IN 1824. HENRY FUQUA, SR. SETTLED IN LAURENS, GEORGIA, WHEN DUBLIN, GEORGIA, WAS CALLED SAND BAR.

A DAUGHTER, MARY JANE FUQUA, (1826 - 1889) MARRIED GEORGE CURRELL, SR. WAS A PIONEER CITIZEN FROM HILTON HEAD, SOUTH CAROLINA. HE WAS A MERCHANT PLANTER, SLAVE HOLDER, SHERIFF, ONE OF THE CHARTER MEMBERS OF MASONIC LODGE. HE WAS A LEADER IN ALL THINGS THAT HELPED IN THE GROWTH OF DUBLIN, GEORGIA, SOCIALLY, FINANCIALLY, RELIGIOUS, AS WELL AS A PROMOTER OF EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES.
