ANN DANIEL

In the name of God Amen, I Ann Daniel of Barnwell District

in the State of South Carolina being of Sound and disposing

mind memory and understanding do make and publish this my

last will and testament, as follows, that is to say, I give

devise and bequeath my plantation whereon I now live, my

negro boy slave called Phil, my negro dirl called Patience

one third part of all my household and Kitchen furniture in-

cluding bedding of every discription, my mare usually called

Jenny, my horse called Belford, one third part of my Stock

of cattle, hogs and Sheep, my loom all my spinning wheels

and cards, the Whole of my stock of Poultry, my Waggon and

geers, all my blacksmiths and carpenter's tools, one third

part of my plantation tools, my riding-chair and all my saddle-

les and bridles, one half of all the provisions of every

discription, and all the money that I may leave at the time

of my decease, unto my grandson Joseph Jennings his heirs

executors and assigns in trust and upon this express condition

and in confidence that he the said Joseph Jennings will per-

mit and suffer my daughter Ursula Jennings to have use and

enjoy all the said property real and personal for and during

the term of her life without being subject or in any way

liable to the control or interference of her present or any

future husband, or to his or their debts or contracts. Upon

the decease of my daughter the said Ursula Jennings, I then

give devise and bequeath all the said property real and per-

sonal unto the children of my said daughter who may be liv-

ing at the time of her death Share and share alike. The

issue of any deceased child or children taking between them

if more than one, the share which his her or their father or

mother if alive would be entitled to; for ever.

All my estate real and personal of every nature or descrip-

tion not herein otherwise disposed of as follows I do dispose

of as follows; my will and desire is that the same may be di-

vided into four equal parts and one of those parts, I give

devise and bequeath unto the children of my deceased daughter

Elizabeth Zeigler the late wife of Conrad Zeigler, for ever

share and share alike; one other part I give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Ann Zeigler wife of Jacob Zeigler for and during her life, and upon her death unto her children then living share and share alike for ever; one other part I give devise and bequeath unto my son William Pendarvis for and during his life, and upon his death, unto his children then living for ever share and share alike; and the other part, I give devise and bequeath unto the children of my son James Pendarvis deceased forever share and share alike and my will and desire is that if any child or children should die leaving issue, that such issue do take between them, if more than one the part or share which their parent if alive would take, and if but one, that he or she do take his or her parents part of share; My will and desire is, and it is my express intention that this my last will and testament shall not affect or in any way dispose of any right or interest which I may have in the estate real or personal of my former husband Joseph Pendarvis deceased. Witness my hand and seal this eleventh day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty seven signed, sealed and published by the said Ann Daniel } her mark
