 ARTICLE III
 MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of this Society shall be as follows:
 Firstly, All descendants in the direct male or female lines of the Huguenot families which emigrated to America prior to the promulgation of the Edict of Toleration, November 28, 1787.
 Secondly, Representatives of other French families, whose profession of the Protestant Faith is anterior to the promulgation of the Edict of Toleration, November 28, 1787.
 Thirdly, Pastors of French Huguenot congregations in South Carolina.
 Fourthly, Writers who have made the history, genealogy, principles, etc., of the Huguenots a special subject of study and research, to whatever nationality they may belong.

Section 3. The annual fees of Resident and Corresponding members shall be five dollars, and the payment of fifty dollars shall constitute one a life member. All dues shall be paid in advance.
