Dear Cousin Robert and "Miss Cora,"

It was so good to see a letter from you two in our mail box. It made me really happy to think that I could do something for you here in Columbia.

Jack left for Switzerland Monday afternoon, and as soon as he left I headed for Caroliniana Library and gave a search for the DeWitts. Below is what I found;

1. After searching the Andrea index the name DeWitt was not to be found! I was horrified! The young man helping me could not figure what was wrong either. Finally his "boss" came and he flipped over to the "additions to the index" and there it was "DeWitt" listed as the Cote book says. However - it is not much and may not be a help after all. Am enclosing it with this letter.
2. You cannot copy by machine anything from the Andrea Collection. So I just copied it by hand and now have typed it up for you. A member of the Genealogical Society - Columbia Chapter - told me that for \$5 Mrs. Andrea would allow you to take the original and make pictures of it - but this was short and was not necessary.
3. I searched the card file in the Manuscript Division - and found a DeWitt Genealogy. This could be copied on the machine - but the machine at the Library is nearly zero - hence the bad, bad copies. In fact the man said "no charge" for such sorry copies. He said I can come back and copy down by hand the pages that are not clear - and if you think they will be helpful I will be happy to do this for you. I am going to try and decipher some of it before sending it so you will have an idea of what it says. The original he was copying from was very very light -

Jack's Mother will be 90 years old on Oct 28 and her three sons will be with her in Switzerland. Jack was very apprehensive about going but felt it was the right thing for him to do. He has enough heart medicine for a drugstore but he takes a lot of it each day. He does have one blocked artery and they are trying to control his condition with medication rather than surgery - and we are happy about that. He returns October 31st.

All the best to you both and let me hear what I can do next.
