



THE DUPONT FAMILY

THE DUPONTS SETTLED THIS AREA OF THE GREAT SWAMP IN THE 1770s. EPHRAIM, CORNELIUS, CHARLES, THOMAS AND JOSIAH WERE AMONG THE EARLY SETTLERS. EARLY LAND GRANTS FROM THE CROWN TO THE FAMILY BECAME SUCCESSFUL RICE PLANTERS AND WAS AHEAD IN CIVIL AND POLITICAL AFFAIRS. A SON OF CORNELIUS DUPONT, ABRAHAM, WAS ALSO A SETTLER IN THIS AREA. THE WIFE OF ABRAHAM, ANNE WIFE OF HENRY DUPONT, IS INTERRED HERE. ANNE AFTER HER DEATH IN 1828, ABRAHAM DUPONT (1788-1857) AND HIS CHILDREN MOVED TO THE MOUNTAIN AREA AND BECAME WORTHY CITIZENS. HERE THE LIMITED IS LOCATED ON LAND ON WHICH ABRAHAM DUPONT OWNED A 5500-ACRE TRACT. THIS MONUMENT WAS ERECTED IN 1912 BY THE DUPONT FAMILY AND IS THE REMAINDER OF THE ORIGINAL MONUMENT.

THE DUPONT FAMILY

THE DUPONTS SETTLED THIS AREA OF THE GREAT SWAMP IN THE 1770S. GIDEON, CORNELIUS, CHARLES, JOHN AND JOSIAH WERE AMONG THE FAMILY. RECEIVING LAND GRANTS FROM THE CROWN, THE FAMILY BECAME SUCCESSFUL RICE PLANTERS AND WAS ACTIVE IN CIVIC AND POLITICAL AFFAIRS. A SON OF CHARLES DUPONT, ABRAHAM, WAS ALSO A PLANTER IN THIS AREA. THE WIFE OF ABRAHAM, ANNE VERDIER PEPPIER DUPONT, IS BURIED HERE. 3000 FEET AFTER HER DEATH IN 1822, ABRAHAM DUPONT (1850-1857) AND HIS CHILDREN MOVED TO THE "ACQUITTINE" AREA AND BECAME WORTHY CITIZENS. THE FAMILY IS LOCATED ON LAND ON WHICH CHARLES DUPONT OWNED A 5500-ACRE RICE PLANTATION IN THE MID 1800S. THIS MONUMENT WAS ERECTED IN THE YEAR 2002 BY THE DIRECT DESCENDANTS OF ABRAHAM AND ANNE VERDIER DUPONT AND IS THE EXPENSIVE PROPERTY OF THE DUPONT SOCIETY.
