I hope that 1982 has begun well for you and Miss Cora. I hope to get to Charleston in April to hear Tom's talk on Rev. Pierre Robert.

While my interest in my Lawton ancestors has not dwindled in the least, I have recently started working on another line which may, oddly enough, connect with the Lawtons. I hope that you can give me suggestions on this line.

My great great grandmother, Nancy Jones Wright of Warren County, Georgia was the eldest child of Wingfield Wright of that county who married Emeline Fickling, daughter of Barnard Wood Fickling of that county in 1834.

A deed of gift, dated 1804 proves that Barnard Wood Fickling was the son of Samuel Fickling of St. Pauls Parish, Charleston District, who, in 1803, purchased land in Warren County.

I do not know if my Samuel Fickling was the son of Jeremiah Fickling who signed his will in 1761, naming son Samuel. I also note that James Fickling of Edisto (will dated 1796) had a son Samuel, as did Joseph Fickling of Edisto (will dated 1797).

Any help or suggestions you can give me on my Fickling line would be greatly appreciated.
