** John Howard (c. 1738 - c. 1800) born Eng.; parents died en route Va. and John was indentured to a Va. ^{farmer,} known for his bad temper, who hit him with an ear of shucked dried corn with such force that its imprint was left on John's temple for life. He ran away to join the Va. militia and was present at Braddock's Defeat on the Monongahela River in Penn. 9 July 1755. He married Catherine, daughter of John Inman and moved to Colleton Co. S.C. before 3 July 1772 when he had a grant of 100 A. below Edisto River; he received 400 A. in same vicinity 4 Apr. 1775. In Orangeburgh Dist. he got 100 A. 14 Oct. 1784 and 276 A. 17 Jan. 1786. All lands were in lower part of present Bamberg Co. which was part of original Colleton Co., later part of Orangeburgh Dist. and still later Barnwell Dist. **876 Acres**
