

HOWARD:

Caroline Howard, b. Boston 8 Oct. 1794, d. Ches. Sc. 1888, dau. of Samuel Howard, a shipwright who d. Ches. 1797. Her mother moved into the country after the father's death in 1797. In 1819 Caroline married Rev. Dr. Samuel Gilman who shortly became Pastor of Ches.'s Unitarian Ch. and died 1858. In 1832 Caroline founded The Rosebud, 1st weekly newspaper for children in U.S.

Mary Elizabeth Howard, b. ^{11 Apr.} 1780, d. 18 Feb. 1839, dau. of John Howard (B. Eng. c. 1738) came from Va. c. 1770 to Orangeburg Dist. where he became owner of large tracts of land; ^{+ Barnwell Dist. c. 1800} in 1797 she married Jacob Falk in Barnwell Dist.; he b. 24 Dec. 1772 at Pomaria Sc, d. Colleton Co. 10 Nov. 1845, bur. at Wesley Chapel, Methodist Ch. he helped organize and build; he moved from Pomaria to Barnwell Dist. where in 1799 he was appointed a Road Commissioner "to lay out road from Ches. to Augusta, via "Broxton's Ferry passing Old Cowpen Ford on Little Saltcreech's direct to Orangeburg".
