ARTICLE III
 MEMBERSHIP

SECTION I. The membership of this Society shall be as follows:

- Firstly, All descendants in the direct male or female lines of the Huguenot families which emigrated to America prior to the promulgation of the Edict of Toleration, November 28, 1787.
- Secondly, Representatives of other French families, whose profession of the Protestant Faith is anterior to the promulgation of the Edict of Toleration, November 28, 1787.
- Thirdly, Pastors of French Huguenot congregations in South Carolina.
- Fourthly, Writers who have made the history, genealogy, principles, etc., of the Huguenots a special subject of study and research, to whatever nationality they may belong.

Section 3. The annual fees of Resident and Corresponding members shall be 12 dollars, and the payment of \$150.00 shall constitute one a life member. All dues shall be paid in advance.

Section 6. * * * Every application for membership shall be accompanied by an initiation fee of \$25.00.
