Dear Rev. Peoples:

Thank you very much for your kind, early reply to my letter. Enclosed is check for \$4.50^{for} your books "Tales of Antebellum Hatter Head Island families and Dr. Inghinetti's 1963 address. I shall donate these to the Society at our October meeting.

As soon as I return from India in early October, I plan to go back to Charleston and get the reference that refers to my great grand-father + his grand mother Peoples. It does not list all of their children but does give my grand father's and grand mother's names and some of their children - it was not complete as to our generation - it did mention that my great grand mother and grand father had 14 children. My dad always told me this was true but even he did not remember all of them as some died quite young. One died last year (103 year old) "Aunt Judy Peoples Mison".

I saw Marguerite in the hospital
the afternoon before I wrote you,
my company did not leave until today
but if she is still in the hospital
tomorrow, I shall try to see her.

By the way, I have a letter
written by my great grandfather
Jacob L. Falk to wife E.A. Weifinger
from "Walpers P.O. S.C. ^{Calhoun District} dated
May 21st 1858".

I was having some repairs made
to the roof of the house on the farm
and the men found this letter in the
attic while making repairs. It is
badly damaged but quite a lot of it
can be read. It is beautiful penman-
ship and quite well written.

Helen Youmans, Clerk of Court, has
promised to help me get it in some
kind of condition so that copies can
be made. If you would like a copy
I shall be glad to send you one after
we get it together.
