I hope we can start promptly at 12 o'clock. We have been starting later + later each year. I don't know how long they expect us to serve ~~but~~ officers but I believe we ^{will} elect each year - if anyone will take it. That's becoming a problem - Daisy + those served two years.

We have two Memorials. I'll get the plants from the Falk family to present to them.

Some one has to be appointed from each family

to bring the History up to date - Births, Deaths, Weddings and etc. Unless you decide to give that time to Mr. Booth. We don't want the program to be too long. The children get hungry and restless. I noticed some of the mothers began feeding the children before the program was over - but it was between 12:30 + 12:45 when we started last year.

That will be a hard week-end for me. A Wedding in my mother's family Saturday. Home coming and a celebration honoring the Conrad Ehrhardt's who started the Town of Ehrhardt - help organize our Church and Build it. I am on the Social Service Committee for the Church - to help plan and fix all meals. Ernest is on the Host Committee. We only have about 65 Baptized members in our Church and all have to help. So I'll be cooking Sat. for that as well as our reunion. Ernest plans to help Sunday morning before 12 and hopes to be able to attend the Afternoon Program. The Conrad Ehrhardt Program is after Lunch. I just hope my knees will last through that week end. They give lots of trouble and at times I can hardly go.

Jo Bessie's family are doing fine for the time being. The children have been sick off and on all winter.
