We are informed from Savannah, Georgia, that about Christmas last, a gang of banditti came to a house on Daufuskie Island, Where Capt. Martinangele of the Royal Militia was lying sick and while two of them held his wife, another named Israel Andrews, shot him dead. They, afterwards, plundered Mrs. Martinangele and children of almost everything they had. These wretches came from Hilton Head. They are called "The Bloody Legion".

I guess it depended on which side you were on Tory or Whig how the story was written. It seems families were divided on the question of British rule. As follows;

Thomas Pendarois murdered Abraham Martinangele in his bed on Daufuskie Island, S. C. during the Tory War. His baby, Margaret, was in his arms when he was murdered. (Thomas -the name is sometimes spelled Pandordis and Rundarwis Pendarvois in other places) Thomas was a Tory and Abram was a Whig. Thomas was Abram's brother-in-law.

Richard and Thomas Pendarvois were brothers. Thomas a Tory & Richard a Whig. Richard was killed in the Battle of Bloody Point on Daufuskie.

Isaac and Philip Martinangele, &r. were brothers. Philip was killed by lightning on Daufuskie.
