Fripp. I found out while we were in S.C. that his name was John M^{Bee} Fripp. This was on a letter written to him by his Mother Jan. 20, 1833. John was in Charleston going to school and the letter was written from Belvidere. I don't know if this was the name of a town, a community or maybe their home. Anyway the letter was signed - dear boy once more may heavens best blessing rest upon thy head is the ceaseless prayer of thy ever affectionate Mother E M Mager. She speaks of Mr. Mager and from what she says he is a minister.
