Sorry we can't make the meeting on 3rd November but here is a check for our dues. Please note our correct address as shown on the check.

As you know, Molly's grandparents James Douglas Robertson, 1838-1914, and Anna Richardson Guerard Robertson, 1838-1916, and her great grandparents Dr. Jacob De Veaux Guerard, 1792-1863, and Alice Pendarvis Screven Guerard, 1805-1862, are all buried in the old St. Luke's cemetary adjoining what is now the Methodist church on Route 170 outside of Bluffton.

It is a simple matter to trace the lineage back to the first settlers but we would like to know more about them.

Starting with the third Guerard in South Carolina, John Guerard, 1706-1764, owned four working plantations of over 10,500 acres in Granville County near Beaufort with 180 slaves and 14 slaves staffed his home in Charleston. Where were the plantations and where was the house in Charleston?

We know nothing of his son Joseph by his second wife, Marianne Godin, except that he married Elizabeth Martha De Veaux, great granddaughter of Colonel John Barnwell, and had at least one son, Jacob De Veaux Guerard, already mentioned. Where did Joseph live and what did he do? Where was his son Jacob born, educated, and where did he live?

Can Dr. Rogers answer any of these questins or tell us where to find the answers?
