) believing & does believe that Rasha Cannon has in his possession a man of Color called
Lege or Elijah whom he holds as a Slave that the Said Lege or Elijah is the Son of a certain woman of Color
called Elizabeth Pinn whom the late Major W. Standard brought from Virginia & who this deponent believes
was a free born woman & that the Said Elijah is also entitled to his freedom that this deponent has reasons to
suspect that the Said Rasha Cannon intends running the said Elijah out of this State or _____ &
holding in Slavery.

Rasha Cannon was attached to Answer to Burgess Adams in a plea wherefore with force and arms and So forth he the said Rasha One man of Color named Elijah the ward of the said Burgess out of his Custody and against his will in the District of Darlington in the State aforesaid did forcibly take and carry away against the peace and dignity of the said State and So forth. Whereupon the said Burgess guardian aforesaid by John D. Witherspoon his attorney complains; that the said Rasha Cannon [torn] here [torn] Twentieth day of February in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and Eight at Darlington Court House in the District of Darlington and State aforesaid and within the jurisdiction of this Court with force and arms &c. One man of Color named Elijah the ward of the said Burgess out of his custody & against his will in the District of Darlington and State aforesaid did forcibly take and carry away and against the peace and dignity of the same State. To the Damage of the said Burgess one thousand Dollars and therefore he brings suit and so forth.

And the Said Rasha Cannon by James Ervin his attorney comes and defends the wrong and injury when &c and saith that he is not guilty of the Supposed trespass above laid to his charge in manner and form as the said Burgess Adams hath above thereof complained against him & of this he put himSelf upon the county and so forth.

Therefore it is commanded that the Sheriff of Darlington district do summon forth-eight good and lawful men, to be drawn by ballot, according to the directions of the Acts of the General Assembly of the said State in such case mand and provided , to be and appear before the Justices of the said State, at the Court of Common Pleas, to be holden at Darlington Court House on the third Monday of October next, by whom and so forth; and who neither so forth; to recognize and so forth; because as well and so forth; and the same day is given to the parties aforesaid, at the place aforesaid. And afterwards, that is to say, on the day, and at the place aforesaid, before the Justices aforesaid, come as well the said Burgess Adams Guardian of Elijah by his Attorney aforesaid, as the said Rasha Cannon by his Attorney aforesaid, and the Jurors aforesaid, bemanded, some of them, to wit: Robert Nettles, Foreman, John Scarf, Archibald Dove, Jesse Jordon, John A. Trull, John Beasley, Reuben Beasley, Anthony Windham, Max Whiddon, Peter Dubose, Stephen Pipkin, Charles Beasley come and being drawn by ballot, according to the directions of said Acts of the General Assembly aforesaid, and sworn of the Jury aforesaid, to say the truth within contained, do on their oath say, that Elijah the Ward of the Said Burgess Adams is a free man. as the said Burgess in his declaration hath alleged against him and they assess the damages of the said Burgess to Fifteen dollars ever & above-eosts by reason of the forcible taking & carrying away the Said Ward of said Burgess over and above his costs and charges, by him about his suit in this behalf expended to fifteen dollars sterling money of the State aforesaid.

Therefore it is considered, that the said Burgess Adams Guardian of Elijah do recover against the said Rasha Cannon his damages so found by the Jurors aforesaid; and also thirty Eight dollars Seventy one cents for his Costs and Charges by the said Court, now here with his assent adjudged, which damages amount in the whole to Fifty three dollars 78/100 and be the said Rasha Cannon in mercy and so forth.
