My Great gf, Rev. James Elliot Davis, and most of his family were Methodists. The Heape family from what I hear and I honestly have not researched this enough to tell you I know this were from Holland and went into England. It is known than some were landed gentry. However, one of them apparently went into Wales and got into financial difficulties and was brought to this country as a debtor. One settled in Charleston and another settled around the Hampton County area. We only know that Joseph was in Charleston and that (this from memory of one of the very old people) one of his family named John came into the Hampton-Beaufort area. The Eaptists finally got at least my Julia Heape because I have the records where she was baptized. The Youmans family into which she married were first Episcopal and then Baptists. The Davis family was originally Baptist (my line is a collateral line to Jefferson Davis' line) but they went into the Episcopal Church in St. Helena because I saw the baptism records of Capt. James Davis (with Sarah Davis and Benjamin Heape as "sureties" which I take to be in Lutheran terminology "sponsors" or "godparents.") According to unproved data, the Heapes might have become Presbyterians again before they died. Capt. James Davis is buried, they say (I have not seen the grave) in a Presbyterian cemetery. You do know, people marry and switch religions quite often. Could the Huguenot connection have influenced the switch. By the way, I have not proved the connection of my first Samuel m. Anne, w/son John Samuel who m. Rebecca Bruington, etc., as a collateral line to Jefferson Davis but it is written in records and people still claim this. It is odd how much Jefferson Davis looks like my Davis men! There is so much misinformation on this family, however, I am not satisfied at all with it. I do know my Grandmother, Ellen McTeer Davis, thought she was of a better family than my GF, James Francis Youmans, but this could be the McTeer (her GM was Rebecca McTeer) because they tend to be "important." The current crop is not that way, thank goodness. I am very fond of the family. I am sorry I can't be more helpful just yet. Dr. James Reddick is taking over the genealogy on the Davis and Heape line since Mr. Barnhill has been so slow. Maybe before we both die, we can have something.
