IT IS NOT PROVEN WEITHER ALL THESE LISTINGS OF JACOB HUTHMACKER REFER TO THE SAME PERSON. I DON'T KNOW WHEN JACOB CAME TO NORTHAMPTON COUNTY, PA, WHICH IS NOW KNOWN AS MONROE COUNTY. THE PENNSYLVANIA CENSUS INDEX GIVES SOME INDICATION THAT THE LACK OF EDUCATION AND/OR THE INABILITY TO READ OR

UNDERSTAND THE LANGUAGE HAS LED TO THE MANY DIFFERENT SPELLINGS OF OUR NAME. EXAMPLE: HUTMACHER, HUTEMAKER, HUTHMACKER, HATMAKER, HUTHMAKER. EVEN TODAY HUTCHMAKER & HUFFMAKER SEEM TO BE POPULAR.

I HAVE TO BELIEVE THAT THE WAY THE NAME SOUNDED WAS THE REASON FOR THE MANY DIFFERENT SPELLINGS. I ALSO BELIEVE THAT ALL PERSONS FROM PENNSYLVANIA COUNTIES OF NORTHAMPTON, EFFORT MONROE, LACKAWANNA AND LUZERNE WERE OF THE SAME FAMILY. I HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO OFFICIALLY CONNECT JACOB HUTHMACHER AS THE BEGINNING OF OUR HISTORY IN AMERICA. HOWEVER, I BELIEVE THAT JACOB IS THE MAN WE HAVE BEEN LOOKING FOR

SQUIRE D. M. HUTHMAKER OF REVOLUTIONARY STOCK DIES AT RANSOM. D. M. HUTHMAKER AT THE AGE OF 76 YEARS PAST AWAY AT HIS HOME IN RANSOM OF ARTERIAL SCLEROSIS YESTERDAY MORNING AT THREE O'CLOCK. HE WAS OF REVOLUTIONARY STOCK. HIS GRANDFATHER CAME TO THIS COUNTRY FROM GERMANY AT THE AGE OF SIXTEEN, JOINING THE REVOLUTIONARY ARMY AND BECAME GEORGE WASHINGTON'S BODYGUARD. HIS FATHER TOOK UP RESIDENCE IN RANSOM, PA. IN 1835, WHICH NOW CONSTITUTES THE HEART OF WEST PITTSSTON OR WHAT WAS KNOWN AS THE JUDGE CUNNINGHAM FARM IN RANSOM. IN 1852, AT NINETEEN YEARS OF AGE, D. M. HUTHMAKER ASSISTED IN SURVEYING THE LOWER END OF THE STATE CANAL. IN 1857 HE WAS ELECTED CONSTABLE OF LUZERNE COUNTY. HIS FIRST WORK OF COMMISSION WAS TO SERVE FORTY TWO WRITS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY. HE PERFORMED THIS ON FOOT AND ON ONE OCCASION WALKED FORTY MILES IN ONE DAY. HE WAS ELECTED JUSTICE OF RANSOM TOWNSHIP IN THE SPRING OF 1862. HE WAS 29 YEARS OF AGE AND HELD THIS OFFICE UNTIL HIS DEATH MAKING TEN

CONSECUTIVE TERMS OF FIVE YEARS EACH. HE FILLED THE OFFICE OF TOWN CLERK FOR MORE THAN THIRTY YEARS, SCHOOL DIRECTOR FOR SEVEN YEARS, ALSO FILLING THE CHAIR OF JUDGE OF ELECTION AND TOWN AUDITOR. HE WAS FIRST LIEUTENANT OF THE UNION INVINCIBLES OF PA. HE SETTLED ON THE GILES SLOCUM FARM WHICH TODAY IS THE SITE OF THE OLD GARDNER CEMETERY. IN 1846 HE DEEDED THIS LAND TO THE DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION. HE WAS A MAN OF STERLING CHARACTER WHO PROVED IN BUSINESS THAT "HIS WORD WAS AS GOOD AS HIS NOTE". HE WAS A SINCERE CHRISTIAN AND A GREAT BIBLE STUDENT AND WAS A MEMBER OF THE PRESBYTERIAN-LUTHERAN CHURCH STILL SITUATED ON THE FARM.

DEAR CHARLES,

LET ME TELL YOU ABOUT YOUR DAD AND HOW MUCH HE HAS MEANT TO ME OVER THE YEARS. AS THE ELDEST OF OUR GENERATION, I WAS FORTUNATE IN KNOWING ALL OF MY UNCLES, AS YOU KNOW, MY DAD WAS THE ELDEST BROTHER, FOLLOWED BY UNCLE DAVID, UNCLE FORREST, UNCLE WILLARD, AND UNCLE HARRY, WHOM YOU MAY NOT HAVE KNOWN AS HE DIED IN 1958. IT IS UNCLE HARRY WHOM I THOUGHT YOU RESEMBLED WHEN I SAW YOU FOR THE FIRST TIME AFTER YOU HAD GROWN. I KNEW YOU, OF COURSE, AS A LITTLE BOY BUT YOU GREW TO BE TALL LIKE YOUR UNCLE HARRY AND OUR GREAT UNCLE ROY, BILL HUTHMAKER'S DAD.

AS A LITTLE BOY, I SPENT A LOT OF TIME WITH YOUR DAD WHEN HE USED TO LIVE WITH MY MOTHER AND DAD BEFORE HE MET AND MARRIED YOUR MOTHER. AS A YOUNG MAN HE WORKED IN WEST PITSTON FOR THE SAME MAN MY DAD WORKED WITH, A WALTER SPRY, WHO WAS THE LEADING PAINT CONTRACTOR IN WEST PITSTON. YOUR DAD AND ALL THE BROTHERS, EXCEPT HARRY, WERE IN THE 109TH FIELD ARTILLERY OF THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD. YOUR DAD BEING THE "BUGLER". OF COURSE, AS YOU KNOW, UNCLE ROLLIE WAS AN EXCELLENT MUSICIAN. I THOUGHT NOBODY COULD PLAY THE TROMBONE LIKE HE COULD, AND I'M SURE MANY OTHERS SHARED MY OPINION. IN FACT, UNCLE ROLLIE, MY DAD ELMER, AND GUY FRICK WITH HIS BROTHER, RAYMOND,

HAD AN ORCHESTRA. MY DAD PLAYED THE PIANO, RAY FRICK THE CORNET, AND RAY THE VIOLIN. I THINK THAT THE MAN YOUR AUNT BETTY, (YOUR MOTHER'S SISTER), MARRIED WAS ALSO IN THE GROUP. UNCLE ROLLIE COULD HAVE BEEN PART OF A BIG NAME BAND BUT, BECAUSE YOUR MOTHER DIDN'T LIKE THE IDEA OF HIS TRAVELING AND BEING AWAY FROM HOME, HE GAVE UP THE IDEA.

I REMEMBER WHEN THE 109TH WENT TO SUMMER ENCAMPMENT AT MOUNT GRENA AND MOTHER AND I SPENT SOME TIME THERE. I WAS ONLY THREE YEARS OLD BUT BECAUSE OF THE NOVELTY OF THE THING, I REMEMBER GETTING UP IN THE MORNING WHEN YOUR DAD SOUNDED REEVEILLE, AND YOUR DAD WOULD TAKE ME ALL AROUND THE CAMP IN HIS FREE TIME, AND HIS GETTING ME HERSHEY BARS.

YOUR DAD WAS LIKE ANOTHER FATHER TO ME. I USED TO THINK THAT EVERY BODY KNEW MY UNCLE ROLLIE. HE WAS VERY FRIENDLY WITH PEOPLE FROM THE "REITHOFFER CARNIVAL" AND USED TO TAKE ME THERE, AND I'D RIDE FREE ON ALL THE RIDES.

HE GAVE ME MY FIRST INTRODUCTION TO THE MOVIES WHEN HE USED TO TAKE ME TO THE HIPPODROME THEATRE IN PITTSTON EVERY SATURDAY TO SEE THE SERIAL "TARZEN OF THE APES" WITH ELMO LINCOLN.

I LOVED ALL MY UNCLES, BUT YOUR DAD I LOVED THE MOST. AS I GREW OLDER HE WAS LIKE AN OLDER BROTHER TO ME, AND HELPED ME ALONG THE WAY, THE TIME WAS IN 1928 WHEN I WAS DETERMINED TO LEARN HOW TO FLY AND I LIVED IN CLEVELAND WITH YOUR DAD AND MOTHER, WHO WAS A WONDERFUL LADY - A QUEEN. HE HELPED ME TO GET A JOB AT THE BAILEY COMPANY.

WE COME OF GOOD STOCK, CHARLES, THERE WAS NOT ANY OF THE BROTHERS WHO WAS ANYTHING BUT A CREDIT TO ALL WHO KNEW THEM, FINE MEN. I NEVER KNEW ANY THAT HAD ANY BAD HABITS, THE BEST THAT COULD BE AS HUSBAND AND FATHER.

THERE IS SO MUCH MORE THAT I COULD SAY OF MY AFFECTION FOR ALL OF THEM. I FOR ONE, AM PROUD TO BE A HUTHMAKER, AND I KNOW YOU ARE TOO. THERE IS NO GREATER LEGACY TO BE PASSED ON TO US. WHEN THEY HAVE ALL LEFT US WE WILL HAVE REMAINING WONDERFUL MEMORIES.

BORN ON A FARM OWNED BY W.A. HANTZ. HE ATTENDED RANSOM VALLEY SCHOOL UNTIL FOURTEEN YEARS OF AGE. ON SPETEMBER 20, 1905, HE ENTERED WYOMING SEMINARY, WHERE HE ATTENDED THREE YEARS, THE FIRST TWO YEARS TAKING A COLLEGE PREPARATORY COURSE AND THE LAST YEAR A COMMERCIAL COURSE. AFTER HIS SCHOOL DAYS HE RETURNED TO THE OLD FARM WHERE HE HELPED HIS FATHER UNTIL HIS DEATH. AFTER HIS FATHER'S DEATH, ROY AND HIS MOTHER PURCHASED THE PROPERTY KNOWN AS THE "SANDWAY" PLACE, OPPOSITE THE RANSOM DEPOT, WHERE THEY MOVED THE FIRST DAY OF APRIL, 1910.
