Right now I am trying to finish the first volume of marriages for Chatham, 1748-1852; volume 2 is also in the works. Don't know how I got to be the typist for all this. Wish I had had my word processor when we were doing the Jaudons before, it is wonderful not having to type everything over, when you have additions or depletions.
