From The Webber File In Genealogical Collection of S.C. Hist. Collection  
Re Glover data. Ref Mrs. Stankey, Gen.

Thomas Ladson married Elizabeth Sanders (b. 1753). He left 2 wife.  
St. Bartholomews Parish. 2nd wife Elizabeth, dau. ANN, Elizabeth,  
Sarah and son, Joseph Sanders Ladson, dtd 15 Apr; 1785 pr. 9 Sept, 1785  
Elizabeth Ladson left wife dtd. 1792.

Note On checking the Index to wills (1671-1868) Rft. Co. Lib. I found the names  
Elizabeth Ladson and William Clark. I wrote Mrs Virginia S. McLeod, Probate Court  
Charleston, she told me that Eliz. Ladson was from St. Bartholomews & Clark from Chas.  
so did not get either. At that period I thought Mrs. T's grandfather's name was William.  
I now have a complete Glover history. Mrs. Stankey said that the Webber notes  
had very little Tzebird data - which I have.

"Narratives of Colleton County by Boulton Glover, p.p. 73-74. Verdier, Simon  
b. ca 1780, McBryre, France d 21 June 1853 Gu. Bethel Presbyterian Ch. yd near  
Jacksonboro. Came to this country ca. 1800 he married Catherine Spencer (b 1794  
d 2/20/1853) By Verdier Pot. The article goes on to say that her half-brother  
James Bowman, became associated with Mr. Verdier in the cultivation of his  
Preston plantation. On Mrs. Verdier's tomb is "Mrs. Catherine B. wife of Hon. Simon  
Verdier." On page 165 ibid it is stated that in 1822 both Simon Verdier and  
Mrs. Catherine Spencer entered a suit against the heirs of James B. Thompson.  
This shows that she was a widow when she married Verdier and her maiden  
name was in all probability Bowman. I thought I had perhaps solved  
the problem of Christian Crawford in Thos. Bowman, Jr's will but the dates  
disprove that theory. Charles E. Danner a Tzebird-Crawford connection is  
descended from the Johnson-Verdier families on the distaff side. I recently  
got quite a lot of data on those two families. The first Verdier record I  
have is Andrew Verdier of Oratee Creek who died 18 Feb. 1766. There used  
to be Verdiers living <sup>in</sup> that section probably since 200. Do you have any data  
re the early Verdiers? or plantation data. Simon Verdier could have been a  
connection.

Butler, Pierce b 11 July 1744 Philadelphia 15 Feb. 1822. Third son of Sir Richard  
Butler, baronet. Pierce Butler entered the British Army & was a Major of  
H.M. 29th Regiment in 1771 when he married a daughter of Thos. Middleton  
of Prince William's Parish, S.C. Thereafter he made his home in S.C.  
Resigning his commission in 1773. Etc. Have more but no references to  
his parents or other Irish relatives.

My Grandmother Talbird was Johanna O'Grady, of Kilkenny Ireland  
One of her uncles was Pierce Butler, I have his "hunting" watch.  
She had three uncles in the British Army, one was an O'Grady  
do not know about the other two. A Mr. Pierce Butler of  
Edgefield used to tell my Father that he thought they were  
descended from the same family - The Duke of Ormonde.

If you come across any Butler records would like you to  
check them. I wrote Ireland, and the genealogist could find  
no connection as I do not know the O'Grady family history.

My grandmother's records (if any) were destroyed by fire (1907)  
I think her mother was a Butler.
