Judson Lawton, Born Mayriver, S.C. Nov, 18, 1835, Brother to John, Asa, Sarah, Ansd Anna Lawton, he married Adelaide Eliza Reynolds Of Beaufort, S. on May, 14, 1872, in Edgefield S.C. He Died DBeaufort, S.C. June, 18, 1922.

Buried in Beaufort Baptist Church Yard. He was a member Beaufort baptist Church

He left Six daughters (I am one Florence I. Lawton)

He was the youngest child of Rev Winborn Asa Lawton, Born June 23, 1793 at Bl at Black Swamp, near Robertville S.C.

He owned (7) slaves and paid taxes on them,

He was a student of Furman University at the time the war broke out.

He served through the entire Four Years of the war.

His mother was Lucinda Walker Lamndrum Lawton of Edgefield S.C., she was

born 1803 married Nov, 12, 1827 to Rev, Winborn A. Lawton, Baptist minister, she was his third wife, she died 1876 and her husband, Rev Lawton died Feb 23, 1879 both buried in Lawtonville Cemetery, near Estill, S.C.

Rev. Winborn A. Lawton was a veteran of the war of 1812, being in the company of Beaufort Volunteer Artillery, of Beaufort, S.C. as Sargent. He owned (45) slave

Rev. Winborn Asa Lawton was the son of Joseph Lawton, Born Edisto Island, S.C. Feb 24, 1753 and married Sarah Robert she was born Feb 6, 1755 at St, James Santee, S.C. (see Robert Line) she died Oct, 6, 1839, and He died May, 5, 1815. He was a slave holder and was an officer in the Revolutionary War as Lieut., in th

Continental Line according to Georgia University at Athens Ga., both Sarah are buried at Black Swamp near Robertville, S.C. in family n^o ground, his eldest son, being Col. Alexander James Lawton was a veter Mexican War of 1845 and is also buried there.

Joseph Lawton, Born Wales 1723 emigrated to Edisto Island, S.C. 1745

married Joseph Fickling, 1748, he died 1769, (Hodgson Hall Sav'h, Ga.)

Lawtons emigrated to Charleston, S.C. just after the Monmouth Rebellion in England and settled in Charlestown, Oyster Bay, or Point, S.C. Before 1700.
