Whereas on the first day of December A.D. 1868, the following described tract, lot
or parcel of land situated in the County of Beaufort, in the State of South Carolina
and particularly described as follows: viz: Land 1000. square, lying and being on
Hilton Head Island in the County aforesaid, containing two hundred acres more
or less and bounded as follows: North East by "Shing Hill" North West by Bowhead
South by Harbor land; East by Blues Hill and West by Honey Horn. (This lot
was sold by the United States District Tax Commissioners as a part of "Marshall &
Coffin") sold for the unpaid tax charged thereon, under an Act entitled "An Act
for the Collection of Due Taxes on Unpossessory Districts within the United States for
other purposes" approved June 4, 1862, and whereas the heirs of Philip Mathews have
produced satisfactory evidence that they are legally entitled to redeem the above described
property, and that they have paid into the Treasury of the United States the amount
of tax, penalty, costs, and interest required by an Act entitled "An Act to provide
for the redemption and sale of lands held by the United States under the several
acts laying due taxes, and for other purposes" approved June 8, 1872, amounting to
the sum of sixty three dollars and fifty five cents, the receipt whereof, in full is
hereby acknowledged and confirmed. Now therefore, this is to certify that the property
hitherto described is hereby henceforth discharged from all tax, or claim, by reason
of said tax, penalties, interest, and cost.

Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty four, the United States
of America by Anthony Bustone William E. Wooding and James D. Martin United
States District Tax Commissioners for the District of South Carolina, under &
by virtue of an act entitled "An Act for the collection of Duties on
Insurrectionary Districts within the United States, and for other purposes" Approved
June 1, 1862, and of the acts amendatory of the same, Approved February 6,
1863, and March 3, 1865 and of the act entitled "An Act to continue in force
and to amend "An Act to establish a Bureau for the relief of Freedmen
and Refugees, and for other purposes" enacted July 16, 1866, and under
and by virtue of the direction and instructions of the President of the
United States issued to said Commissioners under date of September 16,
1865, for and in consideration of the sum of Fifteen dollars first paid by
the purchaser hereinafter named, he receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged
doth hereby sell to Mary Ann Colleton she being the head of a family
a colored citizen, the tract or parcel of land hereinafter set forth
and situated on Parrot Island, in the District of Beaufort, in the State
of South Carolina, and described as follows. To wit: Lot number Forty-eight
in section number One, bounded Number Two south of the Beaufort Rail
line, and range number Two west of the St. Helena River line, containing
Seven acres more or less, according to the United States survey, reserving
public right of way. To Have and to Hold the same, to her heirs
and assigns, subject to all the provisions of the aforesaid act, among
which it is provided that the said Mary Ann Colleton, or her heirs shall
not alienate the aforesaid tract, or parcel of land within six years from
and after the 16th day of July 1866, herein under our hands at
Beaufort, in the District of Beaufort, and State aforesaid, on the day
of this day, above named.
