Dear Sir-

Agreeable to my promise I send you a few lines, to intimate, that in the present difficulty of securing the attendance of the Directors of our Bank, and as far as it is in my power legally; I authorize yourself, I. N. Cheesborough, Esq. & A. G. Rose, Esq. or such Directors, as may be present, in the event of any emergency, or difficulty occuring, to adopt such a course, and take such steps, as will be necessary, in conducting the affairs of the Bank and the security of its assets.

I take the opportunity of saying that at any time, where you may desire my services of the least moment to the Bank, as one of its Directors, a line or a message from you, will render it not only a duty but a pleasure to be with you, as soon after I am apprised of your wish, as it may be practicable for me to reach the place of meeting.

I think you will find on close examination of the law, and general usage, that a Director of a Bank, that is a Representative chosen by the stockholders to manage its affairs, cannot by his Proxy, delegate the Trustee.
