For instance, in another surname of my family, mistaken data was accepted as a fact for years until someone probed deeper and found the correct information.

Alan B. Chaput, 16467 Georgetown Ct., Strongsville, OH 44136 contributed the following court record.

[Lehman names are printed here with capital letters...editor.]

PETER LEHMAN died intestate in the year 1837. This record is in the Orphan's Court Records. Book K-229, at the Dauphin County Courthouse, Harrisburg, PA.

PETER LEHMAN decd Upon the petition of JACOB LEHMANN nephew and Inquest Awarded & notice heir at law of PETER LEHMAN formerly of Derry Township said County. Stating that that [sic] to heirs to be given the said PETER LEHMAN died Intestate in the year A.D. 1837. leaving a Widow named ELIZABETH who is since deceased and leaving no issue. But leaving as his heirs two Brothers and a sister living and the children of deceased Brothers and Sisters as follows to wit.

A Brother named JOHN who is since deceased leaving as his heirs ELIZABETH intermarried with Peter Harnly. ABRAHAM, JACOB. and ULRICH LEHMAN all of whom reside in Lancaster County.

Second DANIEL LEHMAN who lives in Dauphin County.

Third, ELIZABETH Grove who is a widow who lives in Canada.

Fourth, the heirs of JACOB LEHMAN who was a Brother and died before PETER to wit JACOB, JOHN, PETER, DANIEL & BENJAMIN in Dauphin County and ELIZABETH intermarried with ABRAHAM LEHMAN & BARBARA intermarried with John Good who lives in Lancaster County and ROSANNA intermarried with Solomon Albert & live in Lebanon County.

Fifth The heirs of ABRAHAM LEHMAN deceased a brother. Some of whose children reside in Ohio and some in Canada their names and places of residence being unknow

Sixth The heirs of MARY a sister of decedent who was married to Michael Gingrigh [sic] who are both deceased leaving children whose names are unknow but who are supposed to live in York County

Seventh The heirs of BARBARA a sister of decedent who was married to Jacob Moyer to wit Jacob, John and Peter Moyer. Mary widow of John Meashy [Meashy?] Catharine married to Ephraim Sharer and Molly to George Rider all of whom live in Lancaster County

Eighth. The heirs of NANCY who was a sister of decedent married to Christian Snyder both of whom are dead leaving several children whose names are unknown and who it is believed reside in York County except one married to Cogley & lives in Dauphin County.

That the said Intestate died seized in his demesne as of fee of and in a certain plantation or tract of land situate in Derry Township, Dauphin County bounded by lands of John Hershey Christian Hershey John Felty & others Containing about One hundred and Sixty Six acres more or less with the appurtenances.

The petitioner therefore prays the Court to award an Inquest to make partition of the said premises to and among the heirs and legal representatives of the said deceased in such manner and in such proportions as by the laws of this Commonwealth is directed if such partition can be made without prejudice to and spoiling the whole otherwise to value and appraise

SWITZERLAND --- CITIZENS OF LANGNAU PARISH. 1780 - 1850
Continued from volume IV [p. 3 of the Rodel]

Delbert L. Gratz, retired Librarian of the Mennonite Historical Library, Bluffton College, Bluffton, Ohio 35817, is generously providing this material for publication in Layman-Lehman Records And Lines. He is transliterating and translating from a document of which he has a photocopy which gives all of the Lehman families (familywise) who were citizens of the parish of Langnau who were living in the time of 1780-1850.

Mr. Gratz writes: "These names of places given are all in Canton Bern, when, the word 'of' is used, as a certain place, it means that is where they hold communal citizenship which is the primary citizenship of all Swiss. There are between 40 and 50 LEHMAN families that are given in much the same manner"

BIOGRAPHIES

VIRGINIA --- ROCKINGHAM COUNTY

The following article is an extract of a Biographical article.

MICHAEL ABRAHAM LAYMAN, born at Mount Clinton, Virginia, Sept. 20, 1880, is a son of Martin A. and Katherine (Shank) Layman. His father followed the trade of miller and operated a mill 2 miles south of Harrisonburg. Michael A. Layman began his education and completed it at Pleasant Hill, Virginia.

Michael Abraham worked in a horse and livery stable business in Dayton during 1910-1911 when he also engaged in buying horses. The firm rented horses for the postal service and operated its stables under the name of M.A. Layman and Dickson. In 1911 Mr. Layman manufactured wagons & buggies, his product had the trade name "Dayton". In 1913 fire destroyed Mr. Layman's factory; he then moved to Norfolk, VA, working in a steel construction company until 1921. He then entered business for himself and is engaged with his 3 sons in the construction business in Harrisonburg, as M. A. Layman and Sons, Inc. General Contractors. For nearly 30 years Michael A. Layman has been one of the leading figures identified with the upbuilding of his community.

MICHAEL ABRAHAM LAYMAN was in public office as Treasurer of Dayton from 1904 to 1913. During World War I, he worked at the Norfolk Navy Yard; during World War II he was a member of the Harrisonburg draft board for 4 years. He is a member of the United Commercial Travelers and is past councilor of its Shenandoah Council no. 205. His religious affiliation is with the Church of the Brethren in Harrisonburg of which he is a member of the finance board and the building committee.

At Dayton, Virginia, Oct. 31, 1900, MICHAEL ABRAHAM LAYMAN married Sarah Frances Baker, daughter of William and Mary Elizabeth (Coffman) Baker. Mr. and Mrs. Layman are the parents of 5 children:

(1) Ruth Arlene (Layman), born Feb. 26, 1892, m. C. C. Apple of Greensboro, No. Carolina and they have 2 children: Doris, b. in Harrisonburg, wife of Ray Fisher & mother of William and resides in Washington, D.C; and Carr, b. in Washington, D.C. who is the father of Michael.

(2) Lloyd Edgar Layman, born May 28, 1905, m. Bernice Chapman and they have 2 children: Nancy, b. in Columbia, So. Carolina; and Lloyd, b. in Harrisonburg.

(3) Mary Katherine (Layman), born Sept. 14, 1909, m. to W. A. Hartman of Harrisonburg, and is mother of 1 child: June, b. in that city.

(4) Hubert Baker Layman, born June 23, 1912, m. Mildred Koffman and they have 2 children: Hubert Baker, Jr., and Martha Ann both b. in Harrisonburg. Hubert is engaged in business with his father.

(5) Mervyle Arthur Layman, born November 26, 1914, m. Marguerite Garletts and they have 2 children: Rita, b. in Sioux Falls, So. Dakota; and Michael b. in Harrisonburg.

The following biography was published, 1937, in the newspaper
The Mountain Democrat

Wording and paragraphing of this article is exactly as it was written. Editor, Laurine, prints it here in essay form.

"Garrett County History of Pioneer Families
XCVII. The LAYMAN Family
By Charles E. Hoye

The LAYMANs of Allegany and Garrett Counties are probably of German descent. George Bernhart LAUMAN arrived in Philadelphia Oct. 27, 1738; Benedict LEHMAN arrived in 1737 and other families of similar names came from Germany to America before the Revolution, settling in Pennsylvania. George and Henry LAYMAN are listed in the census of 1790 in Montgomery Co., Pa.

GEORGE LAYMAN, the first known ancestor of our LAYMAN's is said to have been born in Staunton, Va. He settled near Westernport, where he was listed in the census of 1810 as head of a family of eight. His children were Daniel, John, Catherine (m. John McCormick), George W., Henrietta, Nancy, James.

JOHN LAYMAN of Allegany County, son of George, left a will which was probated July 21, 1845 in which he left to his wife, Nancy W. LAYMAN, their lot in Grantsville and "money in the bag," noted further on as \$150 of "specie in the bag" left to his wife and mother. He mentioned also a negro boy, Fill, to be free at 35 or "sooner" and suggests that the boy go to Africa. To his brother, George W. LAYMAN, he left the farm on which their parents resided.

GEORGE W. LAYMAN, son of George, was born in Maryland, as was his wife, Sarah (Sallie) McCormick, whom he married in 1832. Their children were Norman, Daniel B., Cordelia (Meare), Mary (m. Frank McKenzie) Henrietta (m. John McKenzie), Francis, William, Amanda, John M., Virginia (m. Isaac Sawyer), George, Minerva (m. Wm. Connors), Nancy (m. Jacob Carry). John M. LAYMAN (b. 1846) m. Anna R., daughter of George Facenbaker. He owned the Walnut Level Farm, one mile S. E. of Frostburg.

DANIEL LAYMAN, son of George, married Louisa Dayton (m. e. Cumberland, Nov. 18, 1825). They resided in or near Westernport.

Continued...

Their children were: John W. who lived and died at Grantsville; Mary Jane and Catherine Louisa, who m. the brother, John and Andrew Blocher; George Louis.

GEORGE LOUIS LAYMAN m. (1) Henrietta McKenzie; (2) E. Sofora, daughter of John D. Rench, who came from Hagerstown and kept the Sterner Hotel in Grantsville. George L. LAYMAN operated the old Tomlinson Stone House farm and inn east of Grantsville. Later he cleared a new farm below the Zion Church. He was County Sheriff two years, 1869-1871. In 1885 George moved to Cumberland where he died two years later and was buried in the Blocher farm graveyard.

By his first wife George L. LAYMAN had one son, Thomas H., and by his second, six sons and five daughters: Elwood, John D., Henrietta, Norval, George, Owen, Anna, Lloyd, Laura, Lee, Harry. His widow and all her children, except Henrietta who married Ralph Engle of Mt. Nebo, moved to Newell, Iowa."

PENNSYLVANIA --- WASHINGTON COUNTY

FREDERICK LAYMAN, emigrated from Germany and came directly to Williamsport in 1807, where he resided all of his long life. He was a tailor by trade and lived at first in the old house that stood where now [1893] is a brick house occupied by Mrs. H. D. Cooper in the later years of her life. The location is on Main street, 3 doors above the Peoples Bank.

Some time prior to 1834, FREDERICK LAYMAN, built the brick house which is on the N.E. corner of Main street & Church alley, in which he died, "we think", in 1846. He also owned at his death a tract of land on Pigeon creek, adjoining Stockton.

The first suit of clothes LAYMAN made in this country was for Major James Warne, and also the last suit he made was for him. Frederick finished the suit in the evening and was dead before morning. He was the the father of WM. LAYMAN who died not many years ago in the Third ward of this city. William was the father of WILSON & FRED LAYMAN, formerly citizens of this place.

~~~~~

In answer to a question asked by Mr. John S. Van Voorhes [author] in 1880. "Who built the first sawmill?", Esq. Butler answered, "William Johnson, the father-in-law of WILLIAM LAYMAN. It stood not far from the Neel Blythe & Co.'s mills". Williamsport was incorporated as a borough in 1833. In 1792 Joseph Parkinson laid part of his farm for the town, the area was formerly called Parkinson's Ferry, on the Monongahela river. In 1837 the name Williamsport was changed to Monongahela City.

A statement on p. 570 of the History of Washington Co. Penn, listed below, supports the biography. Williamsport:

NEW YORK --- GREEN COUNTY --- TOWN OF HUNTER

Abstracted from History Of Green County, New York, publ. by J. B. Beers Co. in 1884; chapter pages 339-340 titled The Boarding Houses of Hunter.

"West of the turnpike by the toll-gate," a substantial looking house is seen to the left, which was built by H. A. LAYMAN, a veteran of the civil war and a native of the neighborhood. It has accommodations for about 50 guests.

Just below this house is an inn-like looking structure, ... afterward run as a tavern ... [by several persons] and afterward for many years, until his death, by JAMES LAYMAN. Mr. LAYMAN was also post-master for a long while.

At this point, thousands, perhaps millions of hoop poles were produced, or bought, for the coopering districts, by the same gentleman and his sons. As this business ceased to be profitable, they engaged largely at the Christmas season in securing evergreens for the New York market, a business at once profitable, and which is yet carried on throughout the town.

His son, E. H. LAYMAN, is proprietor of the "Maplewood", just beyond. This was one of the first framed houses in the town. It was repaired in 1863, and the present building completed in 1875. It has a capacity for 35 guests. Mr. LAYMAN, a native of Hunter is a veteran of the war, and possesses papers written by his colonel that prove him to have been among the bravest and most faithful of the soldiers. He was present when General Lee surrendered his sword to General Grant."

There is some discussion as to proof that George & Eva Dorothea of Botetourt County, VA are the same children listed for the Christian Leaman/Lehman in generation I. Anne Brugh writes:

"There is some reason to believe the Christian Leaman who had a will probated in Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania, in 1749 is the American ancestor of my line because his will mentions a 'George' and a 'Dority.' We know Eva Dorothea was the daughter of a Christian Lemman because that was on her tombstone in Virginia. My mother always thought Eva Dorothea and George were related because Eva Dorothea & George, Jr. came to Botetourt County, Virginia, about the same time and settled very near each other. In other words, I am descended from George--if he married Salome\_\_\_\_-- and Dority--if she is the Eva Dorothea of Virginia--who are mentioned in Christian Leaman's will of Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania in 1748. The fact that both George and Dority are mentioned as children of Christian and our assumption that George and Eva Dorothea were related because of their close connection in Virginia, makes us believe this Christian (will of 1748) is ours."
