

PREFACE

As you read the branches, you can see what information is needed by the contributors for their genealogy. In a way, the branches could be considered as part of the QUERY Section. I hope other researchers will continue to help each other collect the additional data.

Please read the article on page 17 written by Harvey Lhamon. It really brings home to me that in my research I must look for every spelling variant that I can think of and then some. Do you ever wonder how our German or Swiss ancestor's name was really spelled?

How do you say your ancestor's name? Do you, for instance, pronounce the "e" or the "a" only in Leaman? What about Lehman? How do you pronounce it? Why is Lehman of the brokerage firm Shearson, Lehman (etc.) pronounced as if the name was Leeman? I say Layman for Lehman because Layman is an anglicized version of Lehman. Is the spoken Layman also an Anglo-American word for other written versions of our name? Questions, Questions....

As I complete writing this Preface, which is the very last page that is entered in my computer, the thought occurs to me that you might like to know what software I use to prepare this booklet. For word processing, I am currently using WordStar Profession 4 and indexing with the same version. I do not care for some of the features of WordStar 5.0. Will of PETER LEMAN, Lancaster Co. Penn., Will Book X, vol. 2, p. 394 Will dated: 18 July 1744 -- Will probated 27 April 1749

"Anno 1744 the 18th day of July have I PETER LEMAN made my last will and testament, how it shall be made after my decease: First it is my will that my wife shall stay on my plantation and she shall raise up the children as good as she can. But the land and the tenements and the land which I have bought in the Manor, all that lands shall have the three sons named Henry LICHTY, Jacob LEMAN and John LEMAN,

and the the land shall be praised when the said sons are upon their ages, and if I should die in case my wife Magdalene should marry again then the man she married shall have no shear of the said land and the children shall be heirs one like the other, my step children like my own children and they shall shear and shear alike.

But in case, if one of the said sons what do no good or foller what he is commanted then the said son shall have no shear of the said land and my wife Magdalene shall have the thirth part of all my estate and she shall lieve in the house as long as lieve and non of the children shall drife her away and if the mother should dye that the children shall be heirs to the mother.

Witnesses: Jost Mosser [signed] Peter Leman
John Mosser"

Peter's estate inventory: 18 April 1748, was 333 pounds, 6 shillings, 6 pence.

Editor's note: The author, Mr. Spessard, wrote that Peter LEHMAN, above, had 2 children by his 1st marriage, a son Jacob who d. young and dau. Barbara who m. Daniel Beidler of Hellam Twp. York Co. PA. Peter's 2nd wife, Magdalena Light had 2 children by her former marriage, a son Henry Light and dau. Margaret ("Cradle") Light who m. Adam Zell of Caernarvon Twp. Peter LEHMAN & his 2nd wife Magdalena were the parents of 1 son, Johannes b. 25 Dec 1743, who was age 5 when his father died.

The author further states that in deed (Deed Book WW p.68) of 16 June 1760 Henry Light purchased land from Daniel Beidler & wife Barbara (Lehman) and from Adam Zell & wife Margaret (Light). The author said that this indicates Peter LEHMAN's widow, Magdalena, had already died. Final settlement of Peter's estate could not be settled until his youngest son, John LEHMAN, became of age. The author states "Peter LEHMAN's son Jacob had already died 'intestate in his minority, unmarried, and without issue'."

Final settlement of Peter LEHMAN's estate was made 14 Nov. 1766 when his youngest son John was 23 years of age. The author continues his story about this youngest son John LEHMAN.

The newspaper, Cocke County Banner of Newport, TN, had DAVID "LAMON's" will abstract in an article about JACOB LAYMAN - Revolutionary Soldier and did not include all of the 9 children. Daniel, Abraham & Isaac, were left out of the newspaper story. Mrs. Smith has a copy of the will. The newspaper article was published verbatim in vol. II of this booklet series, Layman-Lehman Records and Lines.

Laurine, your editor, while visiting/researching in Knoxville, TN in 1988 recorded in her handwriting the same will & double-checked it in 1990. (no photocopy machine available). See the "Source" listed at the end.

I give & bequeath unto my beloved wife NANCY LAYMON all my lands with all the household furniture during her natural life with all the horses and cattle and all my sheep and hogs

Item After the decease of my beloved wife NANCY I bequeath to my beloved daughter NANCY all my lands wherever the same be situated. My moveables estates after my wife decease forever and likewise she is to be taught to read and c. [cipher].

I likewise constitute make and ordain my beloved wife NANCY and my beloved friend JACOB DENTON joint executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby disallow revoke and disannul all and every former testament, wills, legacies, bequeaths and Executors by me in any will before me willed, and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written signed sealed published and delivered by the above DAVID LAYMON to be his last Will & Testament in the Presence of us who hereunto subscribed our names as witness in the Presence of the Testators.

Dr. Delbert L. Gratz, Librarian Emeritus, of the Mennonite Historical Library, Bluffton College, Bluffton, Ohio 45817, is generously providing this material for publication in Layman-Lehman Records And Lines. He is transliterating and translating from a document of which he has a photocopy which gives all of the Lehman families (familywise) who were Täufer (Mennonites) citizens of the parish of Langnau i.e. Canton Bern who were living in Jura during time of 1780-1850.

Dr. Gratz writes: "These names of places given are all in <u>Canton Bern</u>. When, the word 'of' is used after a certain place, it means that is where they held communal citizenship which is the primary citizenship of all Swiss. There are between 40 and 50 LEHMAN families that are given in much the same manner, most of whom emigrated to Ohio and Indiana, 1820-60."

#### A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE LHAMON / LEHMAN NAME

Russell S. Armentrout in his book, Armentrout Family History 1739--1978, has a very good explanation of how our name is spelled in so many different ways. Following is a copy of his work.

"This name appears as Layman, Lehman, Laman, Lemon and other variations. It apparently is all from the same family and a German name. Depending upon who was writing it, the name had many variations. Clerks and cen. enumerators probably spelled it phonetically and it came out with some version of Lemon, while the German appears to have been Layman or Lehman. This happened to many German names in an English governed Colony where the records were kept in English."

When I started researching our family name—LHAMON, I really was as confused as one can get. The name Lhamon first appears in the Rockingham county, Virginia 1820 census. Some of our descendants name were spelled as LAIMAN also. Previous to that all the spellings were LAMAN/ LEMON/ LEMMON/ and LEAMAN. When Abraham and Elizabeth moved to Knox county, Ohio in about 1823 the records show that their names were spelled as LAYMAN and LAHMON or LAHMAN.

My great, great grandfather Peter, who was the son of Abraham and Elizabeth, moved to Adams county, Indiana in 1838 from Knox county, Ohio. He had married Mary Ann Stover in 1831. The marriage records show that they were spelling their name as Layman. However, in Indiana the land records and wills show that the name was spelled as Lamon/ Lehman/ Lahmon and Lhamon. One interesting point is that on Peters grave stone the name is LEHAMON. And his wife Mary Ann who died two years later, her grave stone inscriptions reads—MARY ANN LHAMON wife of PETER, 1854. I thought that was unusual because they are buried side by side.

Their children have the following grave stone inscriptions.

ABRAHAM LEHMAN, ENOS LEMON, DAYTON LAHMON, WILLIAM LHAMON and THOMAS LHAMON. A father and five sons with the last name spelled five different ways is what is really so confusing. But the spelling has continued to be a problem up to the present day. In our family tree we still have different spellings up to one generation ago.

I have read where the LEHMAN/LEAMAN name is named after take Leaman in Switzerland. That is Lake Geneva on the French side. More research will have to be done on the family name and crest.



*I GEORGE LAYMAN b. 1780 in Virginia?, Maryland?, Pennsylvania; m. MARY --?-- who was b. 1781 in ?Delaware.

Three local histories indicate George was born or came from Staunton, VA; this could be right or wrong. The 1850 census shows George age 70 yrs. b. in Pennsylvania. 1850 & 1870 census shows Mary b. in Delaware.

The 1st Layman to appear west of Frederick Co. MD according to the 1810 census was the George Layman family living in the Town of Westernport, Allegany Co. MD, head of a family of 8 including 2 male persons between ages of 16-26 who were probably not the children of George & his wife, Mary who were 30 & 29 yrs. old. In the 1870 census Mary, age 90, is living with daughter Nancy A. (Layman) Brown.

In 1820 & 1830 the George Layman family continued to live in Westernport. In 1840 & 1850 they lived in the Avilton, Allegany Co. MD, area, half way between Frostburg & Grantsville. Some of the succeeding families have continued to live in the area since that time.

OH; they each owned about 160 A. by 1833; they lived in what is now Pleasant Twp. William Lahman was the first to move to Knox Co; he is on the 1820 tax list.

All the names were spelled as LAYMAN in Knox Co. The first time I found the surname spelled LHAMON was in the 1820 Rockingham Co. VA census.
