In 1947, Mr. Layton returned to South Dakota and farmed in Monroe and Bridgewater before moving to Sioux Falls. He worked in electronics sales and repair, and later became district manager for Vigortone Feeds.

After moving to Canton in 1964, Mr. Layton sold Watkins Products and was later employed by the U.S. Post Office in Canton before his retirement in 1975.

He was predeceased by a

Mr. Layton is survived by his wife, the former Olive Almond; a son, Joel of Lake Elsinor Calif.; three daughters, Joan Aslesen and Jackie Larson, both of Canton, and Jean McWayne of Sioux Falls; and six grandchildren.

Funeral services were held in Canton.
