Dear Cousin Bob;

That little scrap quoting from Burwell McBride's Bible record is quite enlightening, isn't it? So it took him eleven days to move down from Darlington to Hickory Hill - may be by oxcart with all of his things.

Miles? I think there would have to be several more greats beforethe Miles relative that started that name down through the generations of this family. Burwell, himself, had the middle initial "M" which, if it stood for Miles and was given him in honor of his grandmother, would indicate the possibility of our being interested if our Alexander and his father, Archibald, were brothers and sons of Miles-McBride parents. I think family legends are extremely important, not taken literally but taken as a cue for research. So whether it was somebody's great aunt or several times great relative makes little difference. After a very few generations such distortions creep in that only the main idea, in this case that there was a Miles connection, means anything.

It isn't too hard to think that Burwell, named Miles for his grandmother and having great affection for a vaint Clara, sister of his grandmother, should have named his daughter Clara Miles and perhaps given that "M" for Miles to his first child, Thomas M. That Miles connection, if this postulation should hold, would be found up in N.C., and I think in Robeson County. Archibald apparently did not take up his land grant in the Darlington area until after 1790 when apparently he had had probably three children so his and earlier McBride marriages would probably be found in N.C. Also if this post-flation holds Burwell, in marrying Rebecca would have been marrying his second cousin. Didn't you have something along that line in your notes?

You speak of Burwell McBride's will being in Beaufort. Is it possible that a 1857 will escaped the fire that destroyed the Court House? Perhaps it isn't at the Court House. I'd like to see it so if you let me know where it is I'll send for a 'stat'.

Perry? I thought you were a descendant of Rosamond hence my giving you that Perry layout. Well, it apparently gave you a couple of Ladson items anyway. Speaking of Ladson brings to mind that Mrs. Myrta J. Hutson, whom you saw last fall, has died . She had mountains of research notes on Ladsons and many other families - notes that should be made available to researchers. As a contributor to the SCHM why don't you get them to try to get those notes for the library of the society.
