(Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

\*Marriage in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful marriage.

Date of marriage may be substituted for dates of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.

(Note: Resolution adopted by the twenty-fourth Continental Congress:

Descendants of polygamous marriage are not acceptable as members of this Society.)

## ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

John McMurray emigrated from Scotland in 1774 and served in the Revolutionary War as a private in Captain John Doyle's company 6th Pennsylvania Regiment, commanded by Colonel Josiah Harmer. His name appears on a company muster roll for the month of October 1778, which shows him on duty and that he enlisted to serve three years. He also served in the year 1777, and was wounded at the battle of Brandywine. The Revolutionary War records of John McMurray may be found in the records of the Adjutant General's Office, War Department, Washington D.C. also in the Madison County History and family records in the State Library at Columbus, Ohio and in Westmoreland Co., Pa. His name appears on the payroll September9, 1778, in Pennsylvania Archives, 5th series Vol. 3 page 331.
