Mar. 1739 Capt. McPherson was among those "in pursuit of the ^{white} servants & slaves who murdered one John Watson"; ~~he was still with~~ he & his company were still on duty in Mar. 1740

29 Dec. 1739 Gen. Oglethorpe wrote to Lt. Gov. William Bull ^{of S.C.} outlining his needs for a ~~size~~ proposed siege of St Augustine. He asked for "as many hardy men as can be had, who may pass over the River Savannah, and passing the Oatmulgy and Oatcong, and from thence to the Ferry on the River Altamaha, where they may pass over into Spanish Florida. Capt. McPherson can show them the path, for I think the people of Carolina would do very well to raise a troop of Rangers under the Command of Capt. McPherson who is a very good officer."

investigating old acts] act for strengthening and better securing the frontiers of the Province by erecting a garrison at Palla Chackalla Old Town on the Savannah River. passed 23 Feb. 1723
