

Clan Chattan (chief's title: Great Servant of St. Catan)

1. Gilliechattan Mor O'qualave, first named chief of Clan Chattan
Bailie of the Abbey of Kilchattan in Bute
2. Diarmid (or Dormund) succeeded c. 1093
3. Gillicattan II
Murach (or Murdoch)
4. Mac Gilliechattan Clearach, Celtic Prior of Kingussie (Abbot) until 1153
when his elder brother, Diarmid, Chief of Clan Chattan d. Sp.;
he secured a dispensation from the pope and married a
daughter of the Thane of Cawdor (Caldar); with others he had:
5. Gillichattan Patrick, 5th chief whose son:
Dougal Dall left an only daughter, Eva who married in 1291
Angus Mackintosh, 6th chief of Clan Mackintosh, who became
7th chief of Clan Chattan. McIntosh's continued chiefs of Clan Chattan.
