



of his "faithful zeal, uniform attention and unimpaired integrity." He found Col. Haden as a volunteer to return from Marion's stronghold to Port William. He had some 70 followers. "When Haden & approached Jackson's camp and hearing my mother was there at the plantation of my deceased Grandfather Brandford, four miles off I, with some gentlemen the party, galloped off to the plantation opposite (then Dupont's now Jacob Walter's) when finding a canoe which I ordered Negro men to enter, I threw thereon my arms, and on my horse swam the river.... grandfather's widow was then in a most dreadful state with small pox, which I had not had... mother had that morning gone to her home at Wiltown". [He was born 16 Oct. 1762.]

<sup>in command of the Beaufort Volunteer Artillery, 1776.</sup>  
Col. Wm. Haden defeated the British at Ft. Balfour, Pocolago 18 Apr. 1781; he a native of Beaufort Dist. and a valued member of Marion's band of soldiers. Maj. Haden & Nemichon were sent to ~~occupy the fort to surrender~~ Major Haden was closely related by blood to Major (John Col.) de Veaux (who later took the Bahamas from Spain); they chatted amiably and Col. Haden agreed to surrender the fort which he did without a shot.

Stoney Creek Pinney, Ch. founded 1740 in "Indian land". Rev. Archibald Simpson in 1783 returned to see to view his plantation & former pasture, wrote of his slaves: "They indeed live easy and comfortable to what many of their color do, and much more comfortably than many of the peasants of Britain... much more than thousands of the farmers of Scotland."

Granville County became Beaufort District under the Council Act of 1769, including 4 parishes: St. Peter's, St. Luke's, Prince William's, St. Helena's.

Granville inhabitants noted party of 15 Indians "camped" between Sockatchee and Pocolago rivers and petitioned the Assembly for relief.

Paul Hamilton (son of Archibald & Rebecca Brandford (nephew)) was at Siege of Savannah n. 10 Oct 1782 Mary Williams, plantation owner in Edge. Co. 1804-9; Secretary of U.S. Navy 1809-1812. died Beaufort 1816. P.S. medicine was to



p. 203/4 Wed. 11 May 1791 Washington sat down to a handsome dinner prepared by the "Parishoners of Prince William" and was presented with the following address:

"To The President of The United States  
Permit us Great Sir to Welcome you most cordially into this Parish in your progress thro' the State.

We are sensibly affected with the Honours you do us, by this kind condescending visit - And cannot but embrace the Opportunity of declaring that our Hearts are penetrated with the warmest Sense of our Obligations to you who under God have been the deliverer of the Country and its eminent Benefactor in War & in Peace - may you continue to Enjoy the exquisite satisfaction that Arises from the Veneration and gratitude of a great People that has been signally benefitted by you as an Anticipation of your heavenly Reward.

20 July 1731 Capt. James McPherson's scouts were ordered to conduct the <sup>Indian chieftain,</sup> Dog King, and three or four of his followers from Palachucola garrison on the Savannah River to Charleston to be received by Gov. Robert Johnson.

Robert Johnson, Proprietor and Royal Governor of S.C., by Richard P. Sherman 1731/32

U of SC Press, Columbia 1966 pp. 91-92 Gov. Johnson ordered:

"A lieutenant and twenty men be added to the Rangers under Captain James McPherson's command; the Rangers be divided into parties of twenty to patrol the frontier alternately and visit the out settlements of Pom Pon (Edisto River) to encourage the people to stay where they were; also to find two particular Indians, a Yamsee and a Creek, long in the Province, and encourage them to stay, as they might prove useful; at all times, latest news of proceedings be sent to the governor."

1732 Captain (James) McPherson and Captain (Charles) Russell were ordered by Gov. Johnson to take detachments of their men and try to capture or kill the Indians, with captives under sufficient guard to be sent down to the Governor, after a Mr. Catell reported that some Creek Indians who had resided in the Province for a number of years had been at his cowpens, had driven away his overseer and slaves, robbed his house, destroyed his corn and broken down his fences.

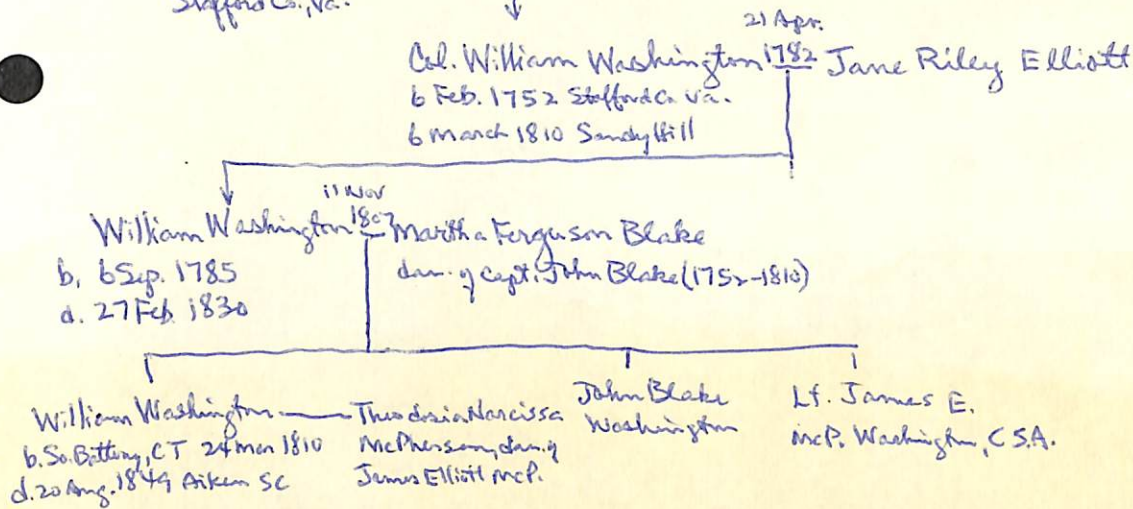

Mrs. William Mason Smith bought it 1869; son Daniel ~~Huger~~ Elliott Huger Smith was father of Alice Ravenel Huger Smith.

John owned "Laurin Plant." near Pacotzig. Do you know who owns it now, or in the 1930's? Jack Hopkins of N.Y. sold quite a few of the old plantations to Northern men during that period and Heyward was the Attorney.



In my letter I asked about locating names of ships. In the record of John McPherson it mentions that "he died at sea when the ship "Rose in Bloom" was wrecked Aug 24, 1806, on passage from Chas. to New York, body not recovered." Of course that is a later date than the records I would like to get.

I have not been able to find any McPherson-Ford connection.

I am collecting data on plantations in Beaufort District and adjoining Counties would appreciate any help you can give me. I would like to make a record for the Beaufort Historical Society. Ruby Danner (Mrs Howard Danner) is compiling a history of the old houses. Mrs Charlotte Martin has written numerous articles about the plantations, copies of which are in the Bft. library, she wrote mainly about the later owners I believe. I would like to see Mr. Hutson's book but certainly cannot afford \$100<sup>00</sup> or more, especially as he did not include all in that section. I have a copy of Mr. E. T. H. Shaffer's book "Carolina Gardens" which I enjoy very much.

Do you expect to do any research in Chas. in the near future? If so I would appreciate it if you can do a bit of work for me which I do not think will take up much time.

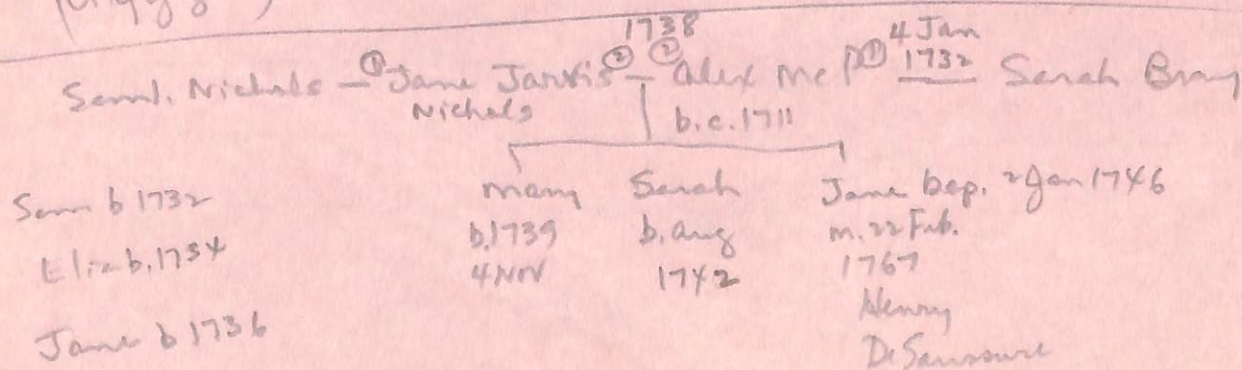

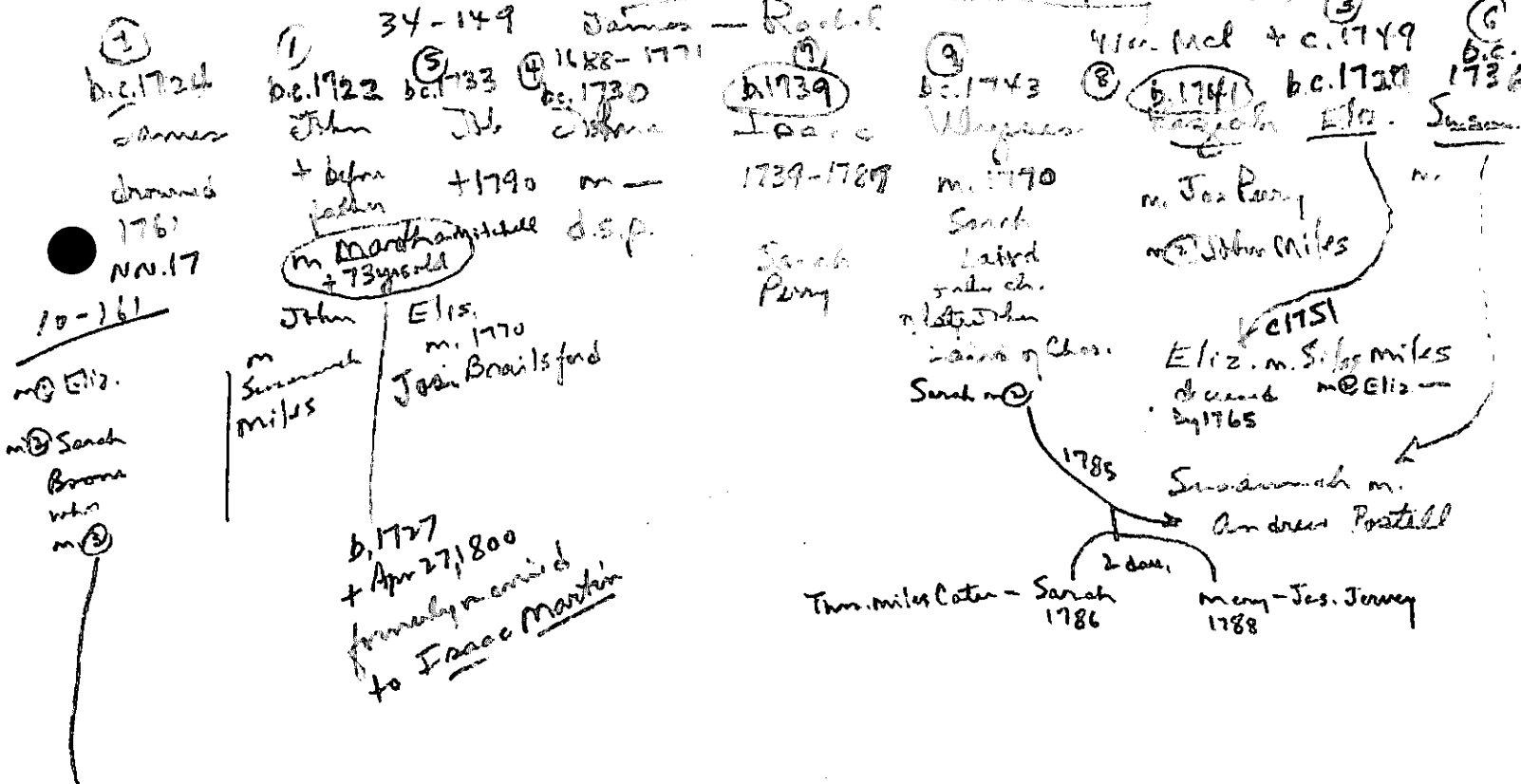

James McPherson "Indian Fighter"

"I do not know the name of James McPherson's father the year in which he came to this country. Like all the McPhersons he was a hunter and fighter and made his mark in the country of his adoption. He came from that hard valiant clan (of the name) inhabiting the district of Bedouoch in Invernesshire, Scotland of which McPherson of Cluny (called Cluny McPherson) was the chief.

"James McPherson Indian Fighter died about 1765 (sic Mar) He was called by that name because 'tis said, the Indians trembled when they heard the name of Jimmy McPherson? (tradition) James McPherson married Elizabeth Miles (or possibly Rachel) and the following children James, married Sarah Boone, and died leaving son, John

- Job
- Joshua
- Isaac
- Ulysses
- Hezekiah

NO! REHP he had a dau. Sarah

Elizabeth  
Suzanna (James McPherson's will is in the Probate Court) [John, son, George, John McPherson] REHP  
John was killed (I do not know the circumstances exactly, he fell, or the horse stumbled. The place is still shown where he fell. Job had only daughters) so his whole property went to his nephew, John McPherson (Law of Primogeniture then in force).

Isaac's first wife was a Miss Elizabeth Miles daughter of Thomas Miles, Jr. (Washington is descended from her)



Isaac's second wife was Sarah Perry.

She died leaving a girl named Sarah McPherson who lived with Mrs. John McPherson until she married Mr. Alston. Her daughter married Mr. J. Middleton.

Copied from a paper by Miss Rose P. Ravenel a descendant of Gen. John McPherson Sept. 1919.

"Among the names of those distinguished for services in the crown, in repulsing the attacks of the Southern Indians upon the early settlers of the province of Carolina is that of Maj. James McPherson. As a recognition of those services he received a large grant of land from the crown (sic MARS) situated along the coast of the present S.C. including the parish of Prince William with which parish the McPhersons have always been identified.

This Maj. James McPherson amassed a considerable fortune, and left a large family, each member fairly well provided for. He died in 1771 at the age of 83. Therefore born 1688.

As a rule the McPhersons had led the retired lives of country gentlemen raising fine horses in which they took pride, in the days when racing was at high value in S.C. more for the purposes of keeping up the <sup>high</sup> grade of the stock than for monetary advantages accruing therefrom. They ranked ~~among~~ among the Kings of the Turf and many stories of their prowess of horsemen are extant, one of the best autho-

coted is of Isaac McPherson, one of the sons  
of Maj. James, the Indian fighter.

This Isaac, like the rest of his name, had  
great pride in racing his stock. One of his  
horses Flinnap was especially distinguished  
at the time when Jacksonboro was the seat  
of government of S.C. the Assembly being in  
session Isaac McPherson was there and one night  
in discussion with friends as to the control he  
could exercise over Flinnap he laid a wager that  
he would be able to ride up the staircase and  
jump him from the second story window. The  
wager was accepted. He went down, got the horse,  
and to the surprise of his friends did ride himself  
the stairs. All obstructions having been removed  
from the window, he proceeded to fulfill the  
last conditions of the wager! Up to this time  
his friends had only half believed him to be in  
earnest. They now remonstrated against his making  
the jump which they feared would cost him his  
life, going so far as to say they knew he could do it  
and would consider the wager satisfied. But McPherson  
was not to be thwarted he made the jump and landed  
horse and rider safely on the ground, a distance  
of eighteen feet.

"Captain McPherson with fifteen of the Rangers, pursuant to a Resolution of the General Assembly of South Carolina, covered & protected the new settlers until they enforced themselves and as they had occasion." p. 155 (Feb. 1736)

"The Rangers were employed for 3 or 4 months the last spring (ie. 1736) in hunting for cattle & driving them to Georgia, which cattle Capt. McPherson, Commander of the Rangers, had bought & had agreed to deliver in Georgia to supply that colony." p. 180 (18 Jan. 1737)

Jan. 1738 Capt. James McPherson, Commander of the Rangers £288 per annum
