Dear Peoples,

I have picked up your letters and decided I'd comment on them lest I had forgotten to do so. I am happy that Cora has achieved her wish of admission to the National Society of the D.C.L. My high school friend is president of the chapter of Franklin-Jackson Counties and really enjoys it and keeps wanting me to join as I have so many lines traced back to my original immigrants. But I am not much of a social mixer. You to comment.

I agree we may never find any info. on Coleman that gives his lineage. But he did serve in 2 wars - that of 1812 (Lancaster Co. under Col. Landen Miller) & Fla. Ind. Wars 1837 under Perry with Thomas F. and Ashford B. with him. I do not believe that Ashford B. was son of Coleman for he does not fit into the age bracket of the children 1830 or 40. I think he was one of the 2 males living with Elizabeth who was 60-70 and a woman 30-40 living with her who was possibly a dau. or daug-in-law & also enslaved, with a son 5-10 and one 15-20. Of course we can't say this definitely because his grandmother may have needed him and if Coleman's son

his father sent him to live with and help his grandmother). The reason I said Thomas Milam, Jr., had 6 sons & 6 daughters is that starting with the census 1790 - 1800 - 1810 I counted the children as they were added (every 10 year census). Holly! I wish I did have their names! All I am sure of are John and Thomas, Jr. the latter b. ca. 1800, we're told d. in 1830's & had wife & 5 ch. 2 of whom were twins Riley & Thiley. This is Mrs. Nance's family, daug. of Haley Glen Milam d. 1-1-1950 who worked with Rose Pope, of Houston, Tx, and Marcus Milam of Fla. (son Milam) for many years. They are the ones who resurrected the Bible records of Bartlett through Bartlett's old maid dad. Nancy and Ferrel who both lived to be near 90. They are buried at Barstow, Ga, I'm told. And there is where Mrs. Milam, Jr. stopped. Mrs. Nance left her records out to his folk & forgot them until I wrote her in 60's & she began trying to search & collect them. But I got no proof of anything when her son & wife collected & sent them to me. So, I feel sure that Thiley Glen would not have stopped without proving his Thomas, Jr. son of Mrs. Jr. and does not mention Eliz. Talbot or her marr. date which is in Halifax Co. records.

So, I concluded that some person or persons kept Halifax records. I sent Mrs. Lance \$25⁰⁰ to photostat them for me, but she graciously sent the check back uncash'd.

I suggest you write Judge J. S. Coleman of Miss. again. There was a Coleman living in Laurens Co., S.C. neighboring the Milams who could have migrated to S.C. with them from Pa. I forget his name - seems like Larkin or some such. I know there were Colemans in Halifax & Bedford Cos. Va. and there was a Coleman family with old Ben Milam and his nephew Jefferson, son of Moses Scott Milam of Glamo fame.

Definitely on the Tax list of 1782 Thos. is listed having 3 in family, dwelling, other bldg. I found once where counting Coleman's age back when he gave it would put him to ca. 1781-82, but I absolutely do not know for he never gave his age the same twice. He must have been a spry old blade. In 1860 he gave his value of real estate at \$4,000⁰⁰ and per prop \$400⁰⁰. 1840 census Coffee Co. gives John - son 20-30 - could be Bedford, and Coleman & his sons Thos. F. & H. R. are all in that Co. John's son completely disappears from identification. I have from Byron Luther all Milam families in Tenn. 1850 - all spellings - some are initials and cannot be

identified. Dan's initials - I hate them. John, son
of this servant to Heles, Co. Va. 1850 55, wif. Susan 48,
Lavinia 44, b. Sarah "Sally" 18, Malinda 15, Mary 13,
Saminda 12, Margaret 8, 10, b. Va., (1795) wife to S.C.
He knew Pa. is wrong for they were in S.C. 1789 as you
proved by old John's will & the census of 1790 proves it.
In 1820 there were no Milam in Franklin Co. Va. Trying to
identify Ashford's chn. with Clemmons & Johns. Ashfords
were - Martha J., Mary Elizabeth, Jesse P., Ellen,
and Doudens, which proves nothing except that 1850 John's
son would be age 30-40 (age 1850-30). I have a copy
of James Morris's Bible records. He moved from
Hardin Co. Ky. 1890 to Snowball, N.C., then to Yancey Co., dying
at Atkins, Ark. 1901. He m. 1st Dorcas Rebecca Hines (one
full blood Cherokee Indian) & had 3 chn, then after her death
in Hardin Co. Ky. he m. Julia A. White & had 3 more chn.
His son Cornelius Coleman Milam had 22 chn. 10 by ^{one} 2nd
of wives & 9 by 2nd.

Now about that 1790 census: The Benj. Milam family, S.C.
1-0-4 would be Benj. & Judith (his mother), Hannah Basill,
Mary Leeland, and Benj.'s sister Nancy. They were probably
enumerated in York Co. before moving on to Laurens, where
later they were enumerated again where probably
Judith moved on with him. I do not believe Benj.
possibly married until after he left S.C. which is said

her did not like), left and went down into Pittsylvania Co., Va. — just west of Halifax where he married into the Peter Milam family. I have aables (of their records), but goodness knows don't ask me who they are for I don't know. Mrs. Maud Lawson in her records said Judith lived with Bartlett in her later years, but gave no proof of stone inscriptions in Laurens Co. It was 94 or 96 before Bartlett moved from Halifax, Va. to Laurens, S.C., so I doubt Judith traveled all the way north across N.C. back to Halifax. Hannah Bassill witnessed John Milam's will. Isn't this unethical if she was related? Of course she could be related to Judith.

Yes, I have Thos Milam 1810 Laurens, S.C. It is spelled Thomas Milam. It is 1-2-1-11; 2-0-0-0-1. — at this time sonon & daug. are gone from the household, seemingly. But I never located this family anywhere 1820. It has been said Thos. Milam died at Stockbridge, Ga.

Did you ever ask your cousin about the micro-film reel that has in the Index "Coleman"? Is it Coleman Milam? Keep pursuing this.

Sorry about Laura Puley's death. She was so good to try to help. I was she who found Coleman Milam's deed in the Indent Index of Laurens Co. for one and when I tried to pay her, she refused. Saying she never charged for research on her own family. So I sent her records of my family.

I have a record on a Terrell that has a will you may want to check - if I can find it now (as I do believe) that Samuel Milam (who married Martha Gardner) either had a sister who married a Terrell, or had a daughter that did - probably the former. And Isaac Coles was possibly son of Judith Bartlett, and John Milam's step-son which is something that needs proving, but it seems Bartlett's children did not mention it in their written records of the family.

I have looked for those Terrell wills that went back to early 1700's in Va. They were right time slot and place to be connected to Milam family. But some day I'll come across them & send them. I have this from Hardin Co. Monday, Oct. 4, 1852 - Thos. F. Milam came into open Court - He and moved the Court to issue letters of Admir. to his upon the estate of A. G. Milam deceased, who is dead having made no will etc. (ment & no objection being made) he having entered into bond with security as the law described - Record, Bk F. page 203. This was Albert G. Milam who was living with Martha Harris in 1850. I believe he had married Nancy James, dau. of James James & wife Nanaghat died by 1850 and the Neda - baby girl being raised by the James family Nancy G. Milam 1 year old. Albert was b. 1828-29. Later she was called Lucy Milam on census.

At the same meeting I got the marr. of James Franklin Milam

to Nancy I (Isabella) Long Nov. 21, 1866 & Mr. Milam
 to Elizabeth — Jan 12, 1867 this should be Rufus K.
 Martha F. E. Poindexter Bevers (widow)

I doubt that Thomas Milam was born 1757 for his
 father John was not born until 1725 which would
 give just 32 years between the two, and it seems for
 certain that Samuel T. Bartlett, and John T. were
 older than Thomas. No, my arithmetic is wrong: 57-25=32.
 instead of 22 which could be right. The Rev. started in '75
 and continued til '83. So I wonder why he had no
 record. I wonder if he had a disability. I
 wrote the National Archives for a search of their records
 for Thomas Milam and they said none was found. But I
 still wonder.

You might like these tomb inscriptions I jotted down
 at Lewis Creek Cemetery - Lula Bell Shaw - born Nov. 13,
 1856 died Feb. 21, 1910 -

Bell Shaw 1856 - 1958 - This is Martha's dad.

S. H. " 1854 - 1918 - Bell's husband (Sam, I believe) —

At that time she was blind & spent much time smoking her
 oak pipe. She has 2 grandsons still living - Lester and Curtis
 Shaw of Cecil Park. But they knew nothing of the Milam
 family except that "Grandma" was daughter of Coleman
 Milam, "mentally defective girl who died last year."
 Etta Shaw told me that she remembered Grandma
 talking about brothers Thomas and William,
 and Deas, and sister Sarah. I asked if she
 remembered a sister Elizabeth, Lizzie, or Bess,
 being mentioned & she said no. "I'm sure sister
 Sarah was the last child born ca 1833 in Franklin
 Co., her mother dead by 1840 who I believe to have
 married Stuart Gammill and who was quite
 well to do the much older than she and had
 children of the same names as Margaret Salina
 Milam b. 1832 Franklin Co. Tenn, oldest child of Thomas F.
 & Margaret Amanda Bell Milam. Also some Milams
 were living with Stuart Gammill. Margaret Salina
 called "Pan" married Chesley Mack Gammill who
 was b. Bedford Co. Tenn. 28 Nov. 1832 son of Samuel & Eliza
 (Bettie) Gammill. His fr. was James was born on Va.-N.C. line
 1792. His father was a Rev. soldier. James and Hester Bedford
 d. 1850 Hardin Co. Tenn. - Was 2nd Lt. War of 1812 - well educated man -
 had 18 chil. Samuel was a teacher & Chesley Mack Gammill &
 Margaret Salina Milam married Decr 23, 1853 - Hardin Co. Tenn.

Chas: 11 children - 6 living - Lorenzo Columbus, Steeling
Price (M.D.), Martha Ellen, Frank, William C. and
James Parke; died - Alice, Alonso, Lillian B., Salina C.,
and an unnamed infant. Chesley M. was a tax
collector in Hardin Co. Mo. Jan. 1, 1857 he & family moved to Little Rock.
In March 1862, he moved with his family to 230 acres in Lee
Rosa, Franklin Co. Ark. Jan. 1, 1864 when the 18th Iowa Union
army came south through Mo. & Ark. it took Gammill &
the 4 Milam ones - Thos. Jr. was in Conf. army captured at
Helena, Ark. imprisoned in Ill., exchanged & started on
Conf side again & fought there to the end and bragged
he "was never a damned yankee". Rufus called "Buck";
Jack and Frank pitch in with the Yankees as bush-
walkers during the war. Lucas Coleman, my gr. fa. was
Conf. and captured at Corinth, Miss., imprisoned, &
and exchanged on oath not to take up arms against
the U.S., came home & was impressed into service Jan. 6,
1864 with all men near him big enough to carry
a gun. My gr. pa. Burdum & 2 of his brothers taken.

They say that Martha Harris and family moved to
Franklin Co. Ark. 1876. I really think this is wrong as
Minnie Milam Hall and her husband Bill told me when
talking with them that her parents (and Uncle Buck's)
family and Aunt Martha Harris' family moved 1880
to Franklin Co. and moved up the Arkansas River and

took their teams and wagons with them up the river) and that Frank Milam had a little team of black mules he just thought the world of and had pictures of and they took all belonging possible with them, but went off and left their smokehouses full of meat, because no one had money to buy it and they could not take it with them. Frank and his wife had an album full of ten-type pictures of the families and their grand-dads. Eulias (Hall) Andrews has the album now and borrowed the picture of Mack + Salina Gammill and Margaret Amanda Milam (3 in group) and had one made from it. In the year ¹⁸⁷¹ ~~1880~~ is when James Morrow + his family moved to Snowball, Ark. - or Dongola -

I read the research presented on Thomas Ferrel. Since Bartlett Ferrell Milam carried this name, it had to be in the Milam family prior to his birth probably in 1740's. Jordan, possibly son of Thomas I and Mary Adams was b. 1750. The name Ferrel is carried by many early Milams - especially Bartlett's son + grandch.

You have Coleman Milam in a Leake, son of James Leake). I believe he married a White for Thomas Milam named his 2nd. ch. Mahinda White and she was called White all her life which I believe was the name of his mother. I don't have stuff but believe she was of the family as was Julia A. White the 2nd wife of James Morrow Milam.

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Since there is a space of 5 years between Thomas Tressell
Milam and William A. Allen (I think Milam), Coleman may
have lost his 1st wife and married 2nd wife before
Jane. That Leake family married into Bartlett Milam's family.

Do you have proof that Coleman Milam's land was given him
by James Leake? I guess you too have a plot of this 20 acre
wedge-shaped land bordered on N. by ~~Bartlett~~ Oswald Beavers
land, west by Charley Little, south and east by James Leake.

New Jordan Milam left Abbeville Dist & he & Mary Peacock
moved to Laurens Co. S.C., then west to Hickman Co. Tenn. He married into
the Beavers family & they came on to Ark with Jordans
family same ^{but} John's widow, Lucia Hamby Milam & others.

Coleman Milam signed his sale Coal Mine Milam
Oct 1, 1816 - Recorded Nov 12, 1819. - Price \$ 72⁰⁰ to Oswald Beavers.
Witnessed by M. Smith & Thos Fullerton Mar 9, 1819

Luther White helped me with this record on Martha Harris his gr. m.

Two girls marr. Shellys - Bill & Robert, and one marr. Phillips

and Belle and a Shaw. But I guess you have all Martha's ch.

You have Ashford B. born 1812 - What prob? The 1850 census gives his age as 38. He d. before 1840, - I think I have a record of his estate prob. by Thos. F. also. I have already discussed him.

Did Rev. A. Milam marry Rosa, Ashford's widow? I have censes of Hardin Co. 1860 and it gives Rosa as a widow and I did not find Rev. A. listed. You have him d. ca 1865 - Then? Did you find an estate settlement?

I am sure you have from the Milam in N. Ark. the Bible record of the 14 children of James Morrow Milam & James M. Jr. who gave his ch. away in Tenn. when his wife died & then came back to Ark. ^{High and Bent} married another family. The ch. of David Ferrell Milam, son of James Morrow, and do you have the Bibles of Cornelius Coleman Milam b. July 13, 1857, by 1st wife Dennisia Ann McDaniel and John by Martha Susan Gilliam? Isaac Milam b. 13 Dec. 1893 had this Bible in Calif. the last time I wrote anyone there. One of Reel's sons drowned on a picnic in Hardin N. Ark.

I am sending your Dec. letter & the John Milam Jr. family, pension application etc. and I surely do thank you for sending one same. I did not properly study it for it was on chemotherapy and felt so terrible. John's son Wiley was the one that was reputed to be such a fighter. Also Thos. Jr. son of Thos. Sr. who b. ca 1800 had 5 ch. Leprosy in early 1830 - left will in Ga. had twin sons Riley & Wiley - I had pension application of Jos. Jr. & his will - Madison Co. Ala.

 This could be Wiley one of the twins. I have (read) Wiley Bell's record to a cousin in Kans. Must get them & check this birthdate to see if son of Thos. Milam Jr.

I have just written to Mrs. Jeanne (Boggs again). I have all her research stuffed into 3 letters - not very much I think for the \$8.00 + d.

I must review my material. I write from memory & I find I am mixing up. Lauderdale was not in S.C. but 1837 I now. From reviewing your letter.

Jesse Saxton was fa. of Charles & James another son was John, I believe - in Bedford Co. TN ¹⁸³⁹ by his da. Rachel mar. Harrison Bell sister to Margaret Amanda Bell who married Thos. F. Milam. I did not find a Bell on this muster, except Jack H. T. Bell & can't place him or relationship to James Bell.

Forgot this Mahala J. (or L) Milam 17 died April of consumption sick 2 years - I believe this was wife of Albert G. Milam & baby Nancy - Albert d. 1852 - Milams were consumptive as were my Hayes. Papa's mother & 4 sisters died of TB. This is Emily. Did you stop several miles back?
